Pope Francis promulgated his new social encyclical, "Fratelli Tutti, On Fraternity and Social Friendship," on Oct. 3 in Assisi. Calling all people of goodwill to care for one another as brothers and sisters, the Holy Father urges people not to despair of making the world a better place, but to start creating the world they want through personal action and political lobbying.

"A worldwide tragedy like the COVID-19 pandemic momentarily revived the sense that we are a global community, all in the same boat, where one person's problems are the problems of all," the pope said. "Once more we realized that no one is saved alone; we can only be saved together." At the same time, he said, responses to the pandemic, and especially to its economic devastation, shined a light on the inequalities existing within nations and among nations. 
