The Baptism of the Lord

“We are called to live our baptism every day, as new creatures, clothed in Christ.” — Pope Francis

What reference point do you use when making decisions? Many times, impulse takes control and decisions are made based solely on emotion and desire. We all know that these types of decisions can often get us into trouble. When a person has a confident sense of who they are and a real understanding of what is important and of value, the likelihood of kneejerk impulsive choices diminishes. Baptism gives us what we need to make well informed and purposeful decisions. By this simple gesture, God claims us as His own and provides us with the identity and purpose we need to properly live life.

It is tremendously reassuring, when we truly embrace this revelation and realize that we no longer have to wonder about the purpose of our lives or struggle to find our way. The answer of who we are in God has been given to us. We no longer have to fumble around, trip over ourselves or walk aimlessly about. Issues surrounding the sacredness of life, the meaning of death, the protection of those most vulnerable, care for the weak and the poor, offering hospitality to those in search of a home, the purpose and proper place of work, how to create a just social order, caring for creation, and understanding our roles as heralds and stewards are just a few of the wonderful gifts baptism brings. When we make decisions based on things such as these core Gospel truths we really act as Christ himself, revealing to others the new creations that we are. This is how we live our baptism.

It is difficult to walk against the tide. Yet, that is precisely what baptism calls us to do. Although we are sinners, in need of mercy and far from perfection we are called to order our life and make decisions based upon the wisdom and guidance of Almighty God. He alone is the one who can claim us as His sons and daughters. Standing up for our principles will not make us popular. But who ever said Christianity is a popularity contest? Baptism calls us to stand up for that which goes against the grain of secularism. Standing in line with other sinners, we have our anchor to steady us in the tempests of life and God is very pleased. Forge ahead. There is nothing to fear.

El Bautismo del Señor

Con la celebración del Bautismo del Señor se da por terminado el tiempo de Navidad. El Bautismo de Jesús es como una nueva epifanía, es decir, una nueva manifestación de Dios por medio de Jesús ahora en el Jordán. “El Espíritu Santo bajó sobre él y se manifestó exteriormente en forma de paloma, y del cielo vino una voz: Tú eres mi Hijo, hoy te he dado la vida” (Lucas 3,22). 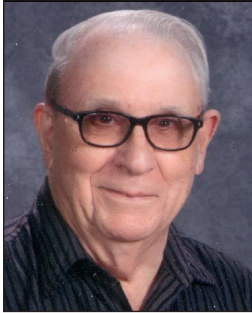

A long-time friend, teacher, and principal of Cathedral School, Brother Joseph Harris, CSC, has passed. In 1979 he moved to Austin to teach at Cathedral School of Saint Mary; two years later he became the principal. Below is a note from one of his students.

Dear, Brother Joseph, Honestly, you're the coolest old person I know, and I say that with all of the love and respect possible. You're always willing to crack a joke and you don't take things too seriously. I really love that about you. Seeing you always brightens my day. I know that you've always been there supporting me and my family, and I sincerely thank you for that. You've helped me grow as a student, and as an individual, and I can't thank you enough for it. I know I'm going to carry what you've taught me for the rest of my life.

The young man who wrote this note went on to become the valedictorian of his high school class. There is no greater testimonial to the place of Brother Joseph Harris in the lives of his students and his impact on them.

Brother Joseph passed away peacefully on December 31, 2021, at the Brother Vincent Pieau Residence in Austin, Texas. We will celebrate a memorial Mass for Bro. Joseph on Wednesday, Jan. 12, at 8:30am in the Cathedral. A reception will follow in the Bishop's Hall.

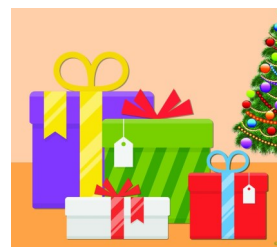
PARISH LIFE

The survey will be available until Jan. 31, 2022. The questions center around the theme “For a Synodal Church: Communion, Participation and Mission.” During this time parishes will also hold listening sessions. Once concluded, all responses will be compiled into a report and submitted to the United States Conference of Catholic Bishops (USCCB). The USCCB will then submit a national report for the General Assembly of the Synod of Bishops in Rome. Please know, the information raised during the consultation phase in our diocese will be reviewed and used for our own pastoral planning.

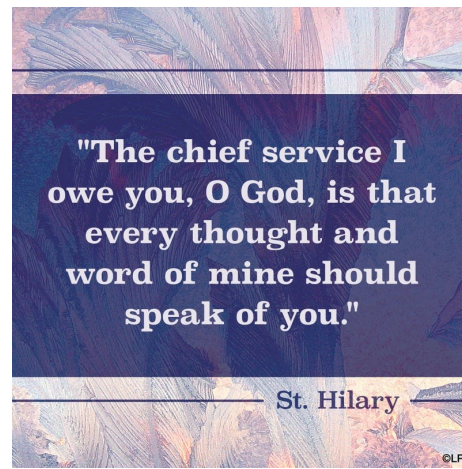
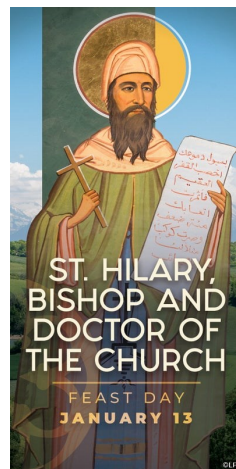

EVERYDAY STEWARDSHIP

I Hope I Am Like Him

“Who is this Christ? Is he like you?”

Perhaps you’ve heard this story, often attributed to the life of St. Teresa of Calcutta. A sick man asked her this question, as he marveled at her tireless service to himself and others in the name of someone named Jesus Christ.

“He is nothing like me,” the saint is said to have answered.
“But I hope I am like him.”

Though the authenticity of this exchange cannot be verified, its message rings perfectly true: all the value of our stewardship lies in its relativity to the one in whose name we perform it. Consider the figure of John the Baptist — a magnificent, towering character even purely from a literary or historical perspective. A martyr who fed on wild locusts and boldly spoke truth to power — a man so great some mistook him for the Messiah.

But why is he great? Because he prepared the way. All his accomplishments and escapades mean nothing if they are taken out of the context of salvation history. He only makes sense relative to Christ — and this is exactly as he wanted it. “One worthier than I is coming,” he insists. And because of that humility and that total embrace of God’s will, he is given one of the greatest honors in the New Testament — he baptizes the Son of God.

Let’s examine our lives in the light of their relativity to Christ. How do we prepare the way? When Christ comes to us, what do we do? How do we leave ourselves open to be actors in God’s plan? --Tracy Earl Welliver, MTS ©LPI

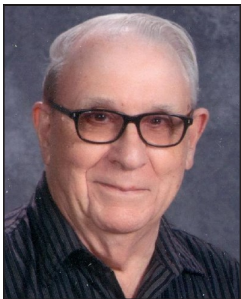

Un viejo amigo, maestro y director de Cathedral School, el Hermano Joseph Harris, CSC, ha fallecido.

En 1979 se trasladó a Austin para enseñar en la Cathedral School of Saint Mary; dos años más tarde se convirtió en director. A continuación se muestra una nota de uno de sus alumnos.

Querido hermano Joseph,

Honestamente, eres la persona mayor más genial que conozco, y lo digo con todo el amor y el respeto posibles. Siempre estás dispuesto a hacer una broma y no te tomas las cosas demasiado en serio. Realmente amo eso de ti. Verte siempre me alegra el día. Sé que siempre has estado ahí apoyándome a mí y a mi familia, y te agradezco sinceramente por eso. Me has ayudado a crecer como estudiante y como individual, y no puedo agradecerles lo suficiente por ello. Sé que llevaré lo que me enseñaste por el resto de mi vida.

El joven que escribió esta nota se convirtió en el mejor estudiante de su clase de secundaria. No hay mayor testimonio del lugar del hermano Joseph Harris en la vida de sus alumnos y su impacto en ellos.

LA CORRESPONSABILIDAD DIARIA

Espero ser como Él "¿Quién es este Cristo? ¿Es como tú?"

Quizás hayas escuchado esta historia, a menudo atribuida a la vida de Santa Teresa de Calcuta. Un hombre enfermo le hizo esta pregunta, mientras se maravillaba de su incansable servicio para él y los demás en el nombre de alguien llamado Jesucristo.

"Él no se parece en nada a mí," se dice que respondió la santa. "Pero espero ser como Él."

Aunque no se puede verificar la autenticidad de este intercambio, su mensaje suena perfectamente cierto: todo el valor de nuestra corresponsabilidad radica en su relatividad con aquel en cuyo nombre lo realizamos.

Considere la figura de Juan el Bautista, un personaje magnífico e imponente, incluso desde una perspectiva puramente literaria o histórica. Un mártir que se alimentaba de langostas salvajes y con valentía le decía la verdad al poder; un hombre tan grande que algunos lo confundieron con el Mesías.

Pero ¿por qué es grandioso? Porque preparó el camino. Todos sus logros y aventuras no significan nada si se sacan del contexto de la historia de la salvación. Solo tiene sentido en relación con Cristo, y esto es exactamente como él lo quería. "Viene uno más digno que yo," insiste. Y debido a esa humildad y ese abrazo total de la voluntad de Dios, se le otorga uno de los mayores honores del Nuevo Testamento: bautiza al Hijo de Dios.

Examinemos nuestras vidas a la luz de su relatividad con Cristo. ¿Cómo preparamos el camino? Cuando Cristo viene a nosotros, ¿qué hacemos? ¿Cómo nos abrimos a ser actores en el plan de Dios? --Tracy Earl Welliver, MTS ©LPi
