## GOSPEL REFLECTION

Brendan wouldn't stop. He continued nagging his mom to let him have a little more time with his phone. He knew the rules but wanted to finish a game and text a few more friends. He begged, had a temper tantrum, pleaded, screamed, pouted, and used every means he could think of to get Mom to change her mind. Mom had a busy day and was tired. At first, she held her ground. Then, her son's persistence got the best of her, and she caved. "Brendan, you can have 30 more minutes and no more!" she retorted. Brendan's determination paid off. He won.

Is this how it works with God too? If we want something enough and feel it is our due, does our persistence allow us to eventually get our way? Judging God by human standards, it would seem so. But is this the way God works? It gets a bit confusing when Jesus tells his disciples to "pray always without becoming weary" and then further tells them how God will "secure the rights of his chosen ones who call out to him day and night." If we catch God at the right time, when he's having a weak moment, then our tenacity ought to pay off. What we want, we will get. Really? Sadly, the way many approach prayer suggests that this is precisely how it goes.

Good parents set boundaries and offer proper discipline. They learn the art of being steadfast when presented with determined minds and wills. They know what is best and, at times, have to say "no." God is always there with His full attention and unconditional love showering itself upon us. God also knows what is best. And, as with any good parent, the one constant that is always available and never withheld is love. We can be as persistent and determined as we want if what we are seeking is God's love. We are never a bother and requests for God's love are never denied. This is the prayer of the heart.

Desiring God alone and not only what we want God to do for us places this love relationship foremost in our minds, hearts, and souls. God is never bothered by this prayer. As we breathe in and exhale out, the Divine Life freely flows.

"Hay que reconocerse a sí mismo como marcado a fuego por esa misión de iluminar, bendecir, vivificar, levantar, sanar, liberar. Transmitir la belleza de Jesús... Ve con amor hacia todos, porque tu vida es una misión preciosa: no es un peso que soportar, sino un don para ofrecer. Ánimo, sin miedo, ¡vayamos al encuentro de todos!" Buscando siempre la justicia, la concordia y el diálogo en las situaciones que la vida nos presente. El secreto para el éxito es orar siempre, confiar en Dios y seguir adelante con esperanza.

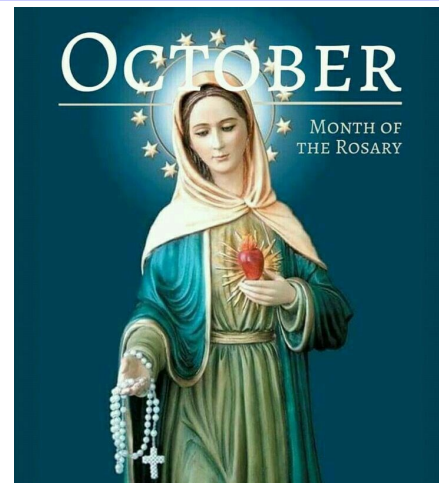

As you do so, you hold up the items and ask yourself: "Does it spark joy?" It's a question that is bold in its simplicity. In answering, you're supposed to go with your gut. If it's a quick "Yes, it sparks joy," the item should be kept. If the answer is no, it gets tossed.

## ETHICS & INTEGRITY IN MINISTRY

### EIM COMPLIANCE NEWS AND IMPORTANT DATES

The EIM Office is converting the EIM database and training programs to VIRTUS products over the next few months. To make the data conversion process as smooth and accurate as possible:

**NEW APPLICANTS:** If you are new to ministry in the Diocese of Austin and wish to serve between now and early January, 2023, you must submit an EIM Application for Ministry (austindiocese.org/application) BY OCTOBER 31, and attend an in-person EIM Workshop (austindiocese.org/initial-eim-training) BY NOVEMBER 15.

- o *No new EIM applications will be accepted from November 1-January 2, 2023.*
- o Beginning January 3<sup>rd</sup>, new applicants will register through VIRTUS Online.
- o *There will be no EIM Workshops held between November 16 and early January 2023*

**CURRENT/EXISTING APPLICANTS:** If you will serve in ministry between now and the end of the calendar year, you must be compliant through the end of the year by NOVEMBER 15.

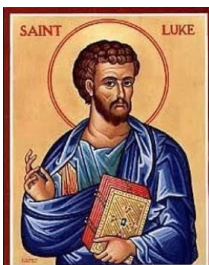
- o *There will be no online EIM training available between November 16 and January 2, 2023.*

If you need to update/renew your compliance, online EIM training is available at (austindiocese.org/onlineeimtraining) until end of day November 15 (you do not need to login to your EIM account to complete the online EIM training).

## SAINT OF THE WEEK

Saint Luke, sometimes called The Evangelist, is the author of the third Gospel and the Acts of the Apostles and a physician. There is some debate about how he came to Christianity, though many believe he was a gentile convert. Tradition holds him to be a native of Antioch, Syria, possibly a slave. Most of what we know of Luke comes from Scripture. He was an eloquent and proficient writer, penning with accuracy the events he recounted. He is viewed as one of the best historical sources of the time. Luke was a close companion of Paul's, joining him at Troas about year 51 and going with him to Macedonia and Philippi. Their paths diverged and met again as they journeyed to spread the Good News. Luke remained with Paul until the latter was martyred in Rome. Saint Luke's Gospel is viewed as one of social justice, giving special attention to the poor. He also emphasizes gentiles hearing the message of Christ. It is the only Gospel with Mary's Magnificat, and spends the most time illuminating the lives of the other women around Jesus. Accounts of Luke's death are conflicting. Some say he was martyred shortly after Paul, others that he lived a long life completing his Gospel in Greece and dying at 84. He is the patron saint of physicians.
