

GOSPEL REFLECTION

Barry had a life sentence in prison for doing unthinkable crimes. He would often remark to the chaplain that he was an atheist and could not bring himself to believe in any “god.” When the chaplain asked why, Barry quickly retorted that the book of Genesis speaks of God creating everything and feeling very good about it. God’s creation of people and things is beautiful. Barry continued, “If there is a God who creates something and likes what He makes and that God is good, then how could He have created someone as evil as me?” The chaplain fell silent as tears welled up in his eyes. “God loves you too, Barry. The stuff that you did is another matter. God puts His image and likeness in each one of us, in our souls. How can God not love himself?” God cannot despise or hate anything or anyone. He made you. Life hurt you. He is always about unconditional love and mercy. Barry found a glimmer of hope that day and was touched by love. Zacchaeus met love incarnate in Jesus. He knew there was something special about him, and he had to see Jesus for himself. Realizing and knowing God’s unconditional, penetrating love is a game-changer. Sinners don’t repulse Jesus, he wants to eat with them! We can often find ourselves conflicted about how God sees us. We want to believe that He loves us, but other tapes playing in our heads convince us that this cannot be true. We carry our sins around like heavy sacks weighing on our shoulders. We are crippled. God’s divine blessing lives in each of our souls. It is our essential goodness, a free gift given to us by God. The beginnings of salvation’s blessings are discovered when we begin to understand who God is, who we are, and how we are to act relative to our brothers and sisters. We become more focused and courageous, eager to gather up all of the fragments of our lives and become whole. Zacchaeus, after meeting Jesus, finally knew who he was. He saw his sins and his potential for goodness as a blest child of God. When we allow God to meet us and touch us in such a profound way, we find what our selfishness has lost. We are on the road to salvation. ©LPi

Cuando llegó Jesús al lugar, miró hacia arriba y le dijo: “Zaqueo baja enseguida, pues hoy tengo que quedarme en tu casa”. Zaqueo bajó rápidamente y lo recibió con alegría (Lucas 19, 5-6). Qué dicha la de Zaqueo el ser bajo de estatura, ya que esto lo obligó a subirse al sicomoro para poder ver a Jesús que pasaba por ahí. Cuando Jesús le dijo que bajara, Zaqueo se puso feliz, bajó del árbol y hospedó a Jesús en su casa. Y abrió su corazón a la humildad y dio la mitad de sus bienes a los pobres y restituyó a los que había defraudado. La pequeñez de este hombre se engrandeció. Jesús, dame humildad, porque la necesito con urgencia, para ver donde he defraudado a los demás. Y así poder pedir perdón y me invites a estar contigo. Sé que no es fácil tarea. Es por eso que el Papa Francisco nos ayuda a ver lo que significa el compromiso de Zaqueo al hospedar a Jesús: “Todos hemos sentido esta nostalgia del bien después de haber cometido un error. Y así lo hace nuestro Padre Dios, así lo hace Jesús. No existe una persona que no tenga algo bueno. Y esto es lo que mira Dios para sacarla del mal”. El encontrar a Jesús en el camino indica cambio de dirección, indica encontrar la misericordia de Dios en todo lo que rodea la vida. ¿Podrás tener esa esperanza de cambio?



SAINT OF THE WEEK

St. Wolfgang | October 31



Saint Wolfgang of Ratisbon (now Regensburg) was born around 934 in Swabia, Germany. The son of a wealthy family, he was tutored in the home before he studied at the Monastery of Reichenau and Wurtzburg. In 956 he elected to go to Trier with his friend, Henry, who was appointed archbishop there. Wolfgang served as a teacher in the cathedral school at Trier. After his friend’s death, he became a Benedictine monk joining a monastery in Augsburg. There he led the school which flourished under his hand and was ordained in 968. In 972 he was sent to be a missionary to the pagan Magyar tribes (Hungarian clans). The Christmas of 972 he was appointed Bishop of Regensburg, near Munich, by Emperor Otto II, the post he would hold until his death. The new Bishop continued to wear his Benedictine habit and held to the austerities of monastic life. He preached and worked at reform and took such care of the poor he was called “the Great Almoner.” The saint also tutored the future Holy Roman Emperor, St. Henry II. Saint Wolfgang died in 994 while traveling Austria, in the town of Puppington near Linz. He was canonized in 1052.



EVERYDAY STEWARDSHIP

It seems to me that Zacchaeus may have gotten more than he bargained for when he scaled that sycamore tree. We can only speculate as to what the original intentions of the wealthy tax collector were. We know he wanted to see Jesus, of course — but what does that mean? Was he simply curious about this famous and controversial man? Was he moved by what he heard of Jesus' teachings? Was he trying to catch a glimpse, or to get close? Whatever his initial motivations, we can safely assume he did not expect Jesus to look up and say: "Get down. I am coming to your house today." I often find myself taking the same posture as Zacchaeus in the tree. Perhaps I have a problem I'm wrestling with or a personal fault I need to overcome. At times I know I need to give of myself in ways that scare me. Whatever it is, I am watching Jesus from a distance. I am removed. Because I worry that when he gets close, he will get in my space. He will see whatever it is I don't want to deal with or tackle. I need to remember that Jesus does not come to condemn, but to assist. It is God's desire to make us "worthy of His calling." To do that, He knows we need help. He knows we need Him in our space. I'll say this for Zacchaeus — he was ready. He jumped right down, acknowledged what he had to be ashamed of, and vowed to do better. He brought Jesus home. May we all have that same courage.

Me parece que Zaqueo pudo haber recibido más de lo que regateó cuando escaló ese árbol sicómoro. Solo podemos especular sobre cuáles eran las intenciones originales del rico recaudador de impuestos. A menudo me encuentro adoptando la misma postura que Zaqueo en el árbol. Tal vez tengo un problema con el que estoy luchando o una falla personal que necesito superar. A veces sé que necesito dar de mí mismo en formas que me asustan. Sea lo que sea, estoy mirando a Jesús desde la distancia. estoy eliminado Porque me preocupa que cuando se acerque, se meta en mi espacio. Él verá lo que sea con lo que no quiero lidiar o abordar. Necesito recordar que Jesús no viene a condenar, sino a asistir. Es el deseo de Dios hacernos "dignos de su llamado". Para hacer eso, Él sabe que necesitamos ayuda. Él sabe que lo necesitamos en nuestro espacio. Diré esto por Zaqueo: él estaba listo. Saltó hacia abajo, reconoció de qué tenía que avergonzarse y prometió hacerlo mejor. Él trajo a Jesús a casa.
