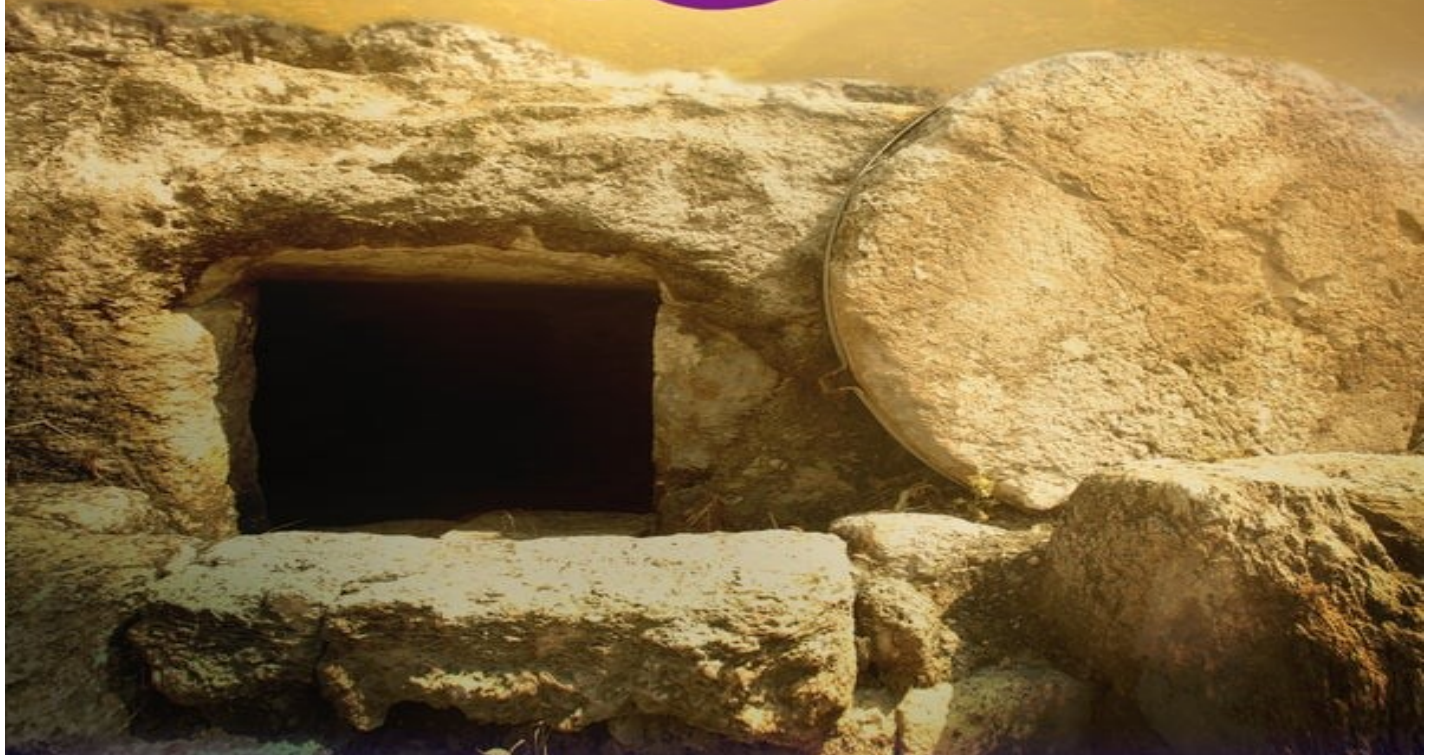

GOSPEL REFLECTION

“When Jesus had risen, early on the first day of the week, he appeared first to Mary Magdalene, out of whom he had driven seven demons.” (Mark 16:9)

Popular Catholic piety sometimes posits that the newly risen Jesus appears first to the Blessed Virgin Mary. It is a happy thought, but it's simply not what the scriptures report. We are told quite directly that he appeared first to Mary Magdalene, “out of whom he had driven seven demons.”

Why would the gospel writer remind us of this unsavory detail of Mary's past? Historians tell us women were not qualified to give legal testimony. On top of that, to be possessed by not just one, but seven demons, is unsavory and terrifying. What damage had they done to her? What did she do to allow herself to be home to such evil? It doesn't seem to matter. Jesus chose Mary Magdalene to be the first one who saw him risen from the dead. He decided she was qualified.

Do you think that you are disqualified from seeing and announcing the risen Jesus because of your past demons? Maybe they are the demons of despair, confusion, self-hatred, pride, addiction, failure, boredom, laziness, or other sins. Well, don't. In the light of the Risen Jesus, all these past demons make our witness that much more believable — only if we allow ourselves to be touched by the liberating hand of Christ, just as Mary Magdalene did.

Creer en la resurrección, no es solo reflexionar en lo que pasó en aquel momento lejano, sino estar seguros que en cada momento difícil de nuestra vida presentimos y descubrimos la resurrección. El mensaje de Pascua para todos los que sufren es el siguiente: estén seguros de que Dios no abandona a sus hijos e hijas y que saldrán vencedores como su Hijo. Alegrémonos y no tengamos miedo, busquemos siempre la presencia de Jesús en las tribulaciones y estemos seguros que su presencia real resucitada está presente en la Eucaristía. La Pascua de Jesús, se hace presente entre nosotros en cada persona que hace labores de amor y de justicia en la familia, la comunidad y en la sociedad. Cristo resucitado, que tu Espíritu nos anime y sostenga para vivir como verdaderos bautizados.

Changes in the Sacrament of Penance

The U.S. Conference of Bishops' voted to amend the Order of Penance in June 2021. Effective this Ash Wednesday, February 22, 2023, the new Order of Penance is now permitted. It will be required for use on Divine Mercy Sunday, April 16, 2023.

What Has Changed?

- Your priest will say a revised Prayer of Absolution
- There will be revised Scripture readings for individual Confession and communal penance services
- You will have an added option for the Prayer of the Penitent (Act of Contrition)

Why The Change?

For over ten years, the United States has been updating liturgical texts to be more in line with the Latin text (you might recall when the Roman Missal was re-translated, the same is happening with all the liturgical books).

Whether your priest uses the old or new version of the Prayer of Absolution, know that your confession is still valid, and sins are forgiven!
