The Body and Blood of Christ: The New Manna and Living Water

When the Israelites wandered in the desert, God gave them manna and water to keep them from starving and dehydrating. In the time of Jesus, however, God gave us a new kind of Manna and Living Water to satisfy our spiritual cravings and save our souls: the Body and Blood of Christ.

Moses reminded his people that the manna they received was *"a food unknown to you and your fathers, to show you that not by bread alone does one live, but by every word that comes forth from the mouth of the Lord."* The Body and Blood of Christ are too unlike the manna and water of the Israelites; they are the Word of the Lord in the flesh, which the Church proclaims at every Mass, and offers at every Eucharist celebration.

Partaking in the new Manna and Living Water, we satisfy our hunger and thirst for redemption and avoid perdition. Jesus Himself stated: *"Amen, amen, I say to you, unless you eat the flesh of the Son of Man and drink his blood, you do not have life within you. Whoever eats my flesh and drinks my blood has eternal life, and I will raise him on the last day."*

The Body and Blood of Christ are the new Manna and Living water, which satisfies our hunger and thirst for salvation; through them and by them, Christ sustains and fulfills our spiritual hunger and thirst in this world and the in one to come forever and ever.

I invite all of us to receive the new Manna and Living Water of salvation, the Body and Blood of Christ, as we meditate on these priestly words:

*"May the Body of Christ
Keep me safe for eternal life.
May the Blood of Christ
Keep me safe for eternal life."*

GOSPEL MEDITATIONS

Years ago, a woman at daily Mass approached me in the communion procession. She had her arms crossed, indicating she wanted a blessing instead of the Sacred Host. She had tears in her eyes. I gave her a little blessing. She returned the next day. And the next. The same thing repeated. After a few weeks, I asked her why she didn't receive Holy Communion. She said she wasn't Catholic yet and was preparing to become so. I asked her why she wanted to be Catholic. She said, "Because I long to be in a real communion with Christ and with everyone I love." That, I submit, is a darn good reason. A few months later, she became Catholic and received the Body and Blood of Christ with unspeakably great joy and still does to this day.

Saint Paul says of the Eucharistic bread, "Is it not a participation in the body of Christ?" For Paul, the answer is obvious. Yes, it is exactly that. Which is why he can say, "we, though many, are one body." Jesus is truly, really, and substantially present in the Holy Eucharist. This is no magic trick, but a mystery of our salvation. He feeds us with the Sacrament of his body so that our communion with him — and with the other members of his body — is built up and becomes mature. That's why the Eucharist quenches our deep thirst for love and communion. The Body and Blood of Christ is the best reason to be Catholic. It's our participation of love in the one we love.

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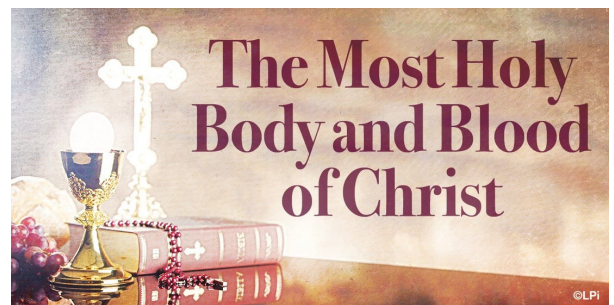

MEDITACIÓ DEL EVANGELIO

Celebramos hoy la fiesta del Cuerpo y Sangre de Cristo, que viene a ser como una versión del Jueves Santo. Jesús se sienta a la mesa en la Última Cena y da de comer y beber a sus discípulos: "Yo soy el pan vivo que ha bajado del cielo. El que come de este pan vivirá para siempre. El pan que daré es mi carne, y lo daré para la vida del mundo (Juan 6,51). Ahora, nosotros se lo agradecemos, adorándolo en la custodia durante la hora santa y visitándolo en el sagrario. Le pedimos que acompañe y bendiga nuestro caminar en familia, escuela, trabajo y en la sociedad. La Eucaristía es fuente de vida, porque el Señor se hace presente en el pan y el vino, para darnos la fuerza necesaria y poder enfrentar las dificultades que tenemos en el camino.

¿Para qué nos sirve este Sacramento de la Eucaristía? La respuesta es sencilla, para alimentarnos con Cristo, para acrecentar la vida de Dios en nosotros, recibida desde el bautismo, para fortalecernos en las dificultades y para tener unidad en la Trinidad. Al comulgar, se supone que somos renovados e impulsados a hacer el bien. Jesús vive en la Eucaristía: "Mi carne es verdadera comida y mi sangre es verdadera bebida. El que come mi carne y bebe mi sangre permanece en mí y yo en él" (Juan 6,55-56). Qué misterio tan grande y hermoso permanecer en Jesús, convertirnos, transformarnos en él, para beneficio de muchos en la sociedad, tan falta de amor y de paz. Lo cierto es que si no comemos de ese pan y no bebemos de esa sangre no tendremos vida. Así de simple.

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VENERABLE MARIO HIRIART

Venerable Mario Hiriart Pulido was born in Santiago, Chile, in 1931. Born with fibroids on his neck and torso, he had to undergo multiple surgeries throughout his life. He was educated at Catholic schools and, after graduating with the highest honors, entered the Faculty of Engineering at the Catholic University of Chile.



In his early adult life, he learned about the Schoenstatt Apostolic Movement and became its champion in Latin America. The Schoenstatt movement was founded by Father Joseph Kentenich as an effort to involve lay people in apostolic work and unite various factions of the Catholic church under the mantle of Mary. It is named after the place it was originally founded in Germany, a name meaning "Beautiful Place." The movement invited men to dedicate their lives to the guidance of Mary, mother of God, and to live out their years in service to the church and their communities.

After receiving his engineering degree and teaching for a time, Mario spent 3 years in formation with the Schoenstatt movement in Brazil. During that time, he led a silent and prayerful life, thoroughly working through the Schoenstatt spirituality and committing himself to the Secular Institute of the Schoenstatt Brothers of Mary in Brazil. Following his personal consecration to Mary in the shrine of the Bellavista in Chile, he worked as a lecturer and teacher in the Department of Engineering at the University of Santiago. As a civil engineer and devout Catholic, he wanted to help shape the world, stating in a letter that, "I want to be a personified encounter between heaven and earth!"

Mario went on to co-find the Schoenstatt Youth in Chile. In a letter to Fr. Kentenich he stated his dedication to his personal life-mission — The complete surrender and dedication of his life in the virginal discipleship of Christ, like Mary, is the way to radically fulfill his mission as a layman to shape the world and for the community of the Schoenstatt Brothers of Mary in Latin America.

In his early 30's, Mario was diagnosed with terminal brain cancer. Upon hearing this sad news, Mario stated, "Interesting, interesting ... Since my youth, I have had the desire to die at the same age as Christ was when he died." He passed away while in Milwaukee, Wisconsin, for chemotherapy treatment on July 15, 1964, at age 33, the same age Jesus was when he was crucified.

Of Mario, Fr. Kentenich said that there is something great about a person who lives his total devotion so consciously, so gladly, so completely like Mario. Following Mario's death, Fr. Kentenich would frequently bring visitors to the cemetery asking them, "Do you want to see the grave of a saint?" Pope Francis conferred on him the title of Venerable in 2020.

Prayer

Jesus, our Good Shepherd, we praise you because you desired to remain close to us in the sacrament of the Eucharist. We praise you for giving Mario Hiriart the vocation to be a living chalice, your bearer to all people according to Mary's example. He followed you as your disciple in the midst of the world, heroically faithful to his Covenant of Love with the Mother Thrice Admirable of Schoenstatt. Confident that you hear his prayers we entrust ourselves to his intercession. (mention the intention being praying for) Lord, with gratitude we ask you to grant that Mario be recognized by the Church. May he be beatified to the benefit of all God's People, for your name's glory, and that of the Father and the Holy Spirit. Amen.
