Trust and Fear

In times of uncertainty, it is easy to feel overwhelmed and anxious. But I have found that trust in God can be a powerful source of comfort and peace. When I trust the Lord, I know I am never alone, and everything will work out. That is not always easy because there is no perfect trust in this world. Therefore, placing our control in God's hands can be a struggle. Yet, I rather struggle with my trust than fall completely into the abyss of fear. Fear only holds me back, makes me doubt myself, and pushes me away from God. Consequently, it is important to remember that trust is always a better choice.

God can bring immense joy and gratitude into our lives when we trust Him. A dear friend embodies this belief and is the most trustworthy person I know when having faith in God. He attributes all the wonderful things in his life to God's will. Be it a promotion at work, his children getting accepted into a college of their choice, or making a tough decision, my friend places all his expectations in God's hands. Seeing how his unwavering trust in God has brought him so much happiness and contentment is truly inspiring.

Jeremiah was a man who trusted the Lord with his whole life. Even when his enemies tried to destroy him, he remained steadfast as a prophet, always proclaiming the Lord's message. *"Sing to the LORD, praise the LORD, for he has entrusted the life of the poor from the power of the wicked,"* Jeremiah would say. We all have moments in our lives when we feel persecuted by the injustices of others, but it is in those moments that we must trust in the Lord to help us overcome them. Fear can be a powerful force, but with faith in God, we can rise above it and emerge stronger. May we be blessed to follow in Jeremiah's footsteps and trust the Lord, knowing he will guide us through even the darkest times.

Fear is the antithesis of trust. Jesus, who knew fear's power well, showed us how to overcome it. In the Garden of Gethsemane, as He faced His impending death on the cross, Jesus prayed to His Father, *"My Father, if it is possible, let this cup pass from me; yet, not as I will, but as you will."* His unwavering trust in His Father helped Him to see past the lies of the prince of death and have faith that everything would work out according to the Father's plan.

Unsurprisingly, we find in the Gospel of Matthew that Jesus instructed his disciples to *"Fear no one...rather, be afraid of the one who can destroy both the soul and the body in Gehenna"*. Fear is a natural response to danger and can be beneficial in protecting ourselves and others. However, fear that distances us from the Lord can harm our spiritual lives. Fear can whisper lies such as *"You are alone; God does not love you. The Lord abandoned you when you needed Him the most. You are a sinner and a failure"*. When we give in to these lies, fear wins, and our souls and bodies become vulnerable to destruction.

Let us take a moment this week to pray to the Lord, asking Him to send us the Holy Spirit. Through the guidance of the Holy Spirit, we can strengthen our trust in Him and protect ourselves from the fear that can harm our souls and body. We can take inspiration from Jeremiah and Jesus' words, who declared their complete trust in God the Father by saying, *"To you, I have entrusted my cause"* and *"Fear nothing."* May we also have the courage to trust the Lord and surrender our fears to Him.

Jesus, I trust in you.

SAINT PETER AND SAINT PAUL

On June 29 the Church celebrates the feast day of Sts. Peter & Paul. As early as the year 258, there is evidence of an already lengthy tradition of celebrating the solemnities of both Saint Peter and Saint Paul on the same day. Together, the two saints are the founders of the See of Rome, through their preaching, ministry and martyrdom there.

Peter, who was named Simon, was a fisherman of Galilee and was introduced to the Lord Jesus by his brother Andrew, also a fisherman. Jesus gave him the name Cephas (Petrus in Latin), which means 'Rock,' because he was to become the rock upon which Christ would build His Church.

Peter was a bold follower of the Lord. He was the first to recognize that Jesus was "the Messiah, the Son of the living God," and eagerly pledged his fidelity until death. In his boldness, he also made many mistakes, however, such as losing faith when walking on water with Christ and betraying the Lord on the night of His passion.

Yet despite his human weaknesses, Peter was chosen to shepherd God's flock. The Acts of the Apostles illustrates his role as head of the Church after the Resurrection and Ascension of Christ. Peter led the Apostles as the first Pope and ensured that the disciples kept the true faith.

St. Peter spent his last years in Rome, leading the Church through persecution and eventually being martyred in the year 64. He was crucified upside-down at his own request, because he claimed he was not worthy to die as his Lord.

He was buried on Vatican hill, and St. Peter's Basilica is built over his tomb.

St. Paul was the Apostle of the Gentiles. His letters are included in the writings of the New Testament, and through them we learn much about his life and the faith of the early Church.

Before receiving the name Paul, he was Saul, a Jewish pharisee who zealously persecuted Christians in Jerusalem. Scripture records that Saul was present at the martyrdom of St. Stephen.

Saul's conversion took place as he was on his way to Damascus to persecute the Christian community there. As he was traveling along the road, he was suddenly surrounded by a great light from heaven. He was blinded and fell off his horse. He then heard a voice saying to him, "Saul, Saul, why do you persecute me?" He answered: "Who are you, Lord?" Christ said: "I am Jesus, whom you are persecuting."

Saul continued to Damascus, where he was baptized and his sight was restored. He took the name Paul and spent the remainder of his life preaching the Gospel tirelessly to the Gentiles of the Mediterranean world.

Paul was imprisoned and taken to Rome, where he was beheaded in the year 67.

He is buried in Rome in the Basilica of St. Paul Outside the Walls.

In a sermon in the year 395, St. Augustine of Hippo said of Sts. Peter and Paul: "Both apostles share the same feast day, for these two were one; and even though they suffered on different days, they were as one. Peter went first, and Paul followed. And so we celebrate this day made holy for us by the apostles' blood. Let us embrace what they believed, their life, their labors, their sufferings, their preaching, and their confession of faith."

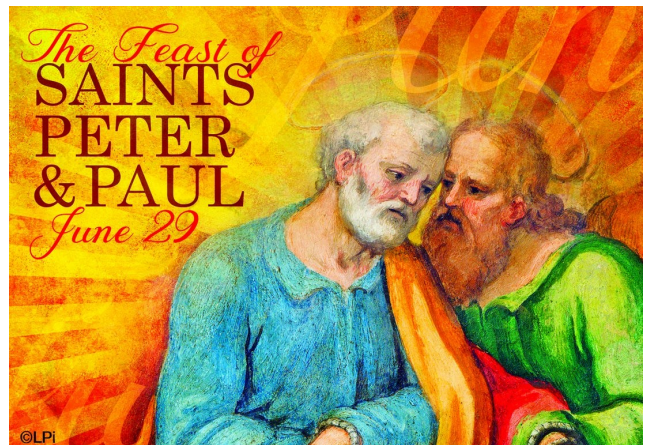
