

Hospitality Towards Others

As a believer, many influences have shaped my faith over the years. My parents instilled in me the importance of daily prayer and attending Mass. The church community provided opportunities for ministry involvement, such as the Legion of Mary. However, one person who profoundly impacted my faith was a preacher and missionary named Carlos Torres. He belonged to the Hermanos Cheos (Brothers Cheos), a religious organization in Puerto Rico dedicated to preaching and ministering the church teachings. Mr. Torres traveled from town to town, preaching on the Gospel, salvation, and Jesus' love

Despite being a simple man who traveled lightly, Mr. Torres had a powerful presence. Families in the neighborhood would generously host him in their homes, including our family, and he would reward us with his blessings and preaching from our homes. The community recognized him as a holy man of God, and his presence was like a light shining on top of a mountain for all to see.

Today's scriptures remind me of the hospitality the families who hosted Mr. Torres showed. In the Book of Kings, we hear about a rich woman who invites the prophet Elisha to her home, recognizing him as a holy man of God. In return for her generosity, Elisha blesses her with the promise of a baby son. The story is reminiscent of Abraham's hospitality story found in Genesis 18. On that occasion, Abraham recognized the three men who visited him as holy men of God. In gratitude for his hospitality, they promised him a child despite his wife's old age. In the Gospel of Matthew, Jesus teaches us to show hospitality to those whom the Lord sends to do His work, promising as a reward that whoever receives His disciples receives Him and the One who sent Him.

Today, there are holy men and women of God among us who serve in our local parish and community, whose mission is to spread the Lord's message. As believers, we ought to recognize them and treat them with the same hospitality that Abraham, the rich woman, and the families in my neighborhood showed to their holy guests.

Ultimately, one of the most faith-filled shows of our hospitality toward Jesus is to receive Him in the Eucharist. When we receive Jesus' body and blood, we welcome him into our lives as the families in my neighborhood welcomed Carlos Torres, the rich woman welcomed Elisha, and Jesus taught us to do.

ST. ELIZABETH OF PORTUGAL



St. Elizabeth was born to Peter III of Aragon and his queen Constantia in 1271. Like most royal girls of the time, she was betrothed at an early age, and was married to King Diniz (or Dinis, English: Denis) at the age of 12.

caused much scandal, Elizabeth was a good and pius queen. She attended Mass daily and dedicated her life to helping the poor. She established orphanages and shelters for the homeless. She also founded a convent of Poor Clares at Coimbra, Portugal.

Often called Peacemaker, Elizabeth was from her birth a reconciler of conflict. Her birth brought her father and his estranged father James to peace. Later when her own son and husband came to war out of jealousy, she rode between armies and reconciled the two men. After King Diniz died in 1325, she went to live as a lay member at the convent of Poor Clares that she had founded. But her fight for peace was not over, she undertook a long ride to keep the army of her son Afonso IV, from fighting that of Alfonso XI of Castile. Although she was successful, she died shortly after from a fever.

Saint Elizabeth was canonized on May 25th, 1625, by Pope Urban VIII. In the United States her memorial has been transferred to July 5th since July 4th is Independence Day, a national holiday


