### Our Faith Journey

Our faith is a complex and winding journey, even for those considered saints and prophets. Just take St. Augustin, for example. His faith journey was filled with struggles and inclinations towards the pleasures of life. Consequences of those battles included bearing a child with his concubine and even joining the Manichean religion, which had a black-and-white view of the world. St. Augustine was also drawn to Neoplatonism, a philosophical movement that believed our world was a mere reflection of an ideal reality beyond it. As we can see, St. Augustin's faith journey was far from a straight line. Nonetheless, he could not ignore God's call and the restlessness in his heart that could only find peace in the Lord.

It is understandable why the Prophet Jeremiah would feel frustrated with God for leading him down a difficult path. Despite following God's commands, he faced ridicule, enemies, and even threats to his safety. It is natural for anyone to feel fear in such situations, especially when going against the prevailing religious beliefs. However, Jeremiah also knew his heart wouldn't be at peace if he didn't follow God's call. So, he persevered and stayed faithful, even though it wasn't always easy. His journey wasn't straightforward, but he trusted in God and continued.

When Jesus told Peter that the Son of God must die, it was only natural that he would be troubled. After all, Peter loved Jesus deeply. However, like many of us, Peter's faith faltered in this moment. He needed to understand Jesus' proclamations and teachings fully. In response, Jesus reprimanded Peter to stop trying to accomplish the Father's will for Him. To do otherwise would be to act like Satan and think like a human, assuming we know what God wants for us. Despite this low moment in Peter's life, he became the stone upon which Jesus built His church. Peter's restless heart looked past the crookedness of our humanity and focused instead on the hope of Jesus' love for us.

It is comforting to know that faith is only sometimes a straight path, as demonstrated by theologians, prophets, and saints. Even if we sometimes feel lost or uncertain, our faith can bring us closer to God's presence. Just as St. Augustine, the Prophet Jeremiah, and St. Peter all found their way back to God, we, too, can trust that He will guide us back to where we belong.

Let's Pray:

O Lord, please always guide our restless hearts towards you. May we always be willing to follow the path you have laid out for us, even if it is not straight. We trust in Your Son, Jesus Christ, and seek the Holy Spirit's guidance as we journey through our faith and hope in the sacraments of Reconciliation and the Eucharist. Amen.

## V. MOTHER MARY THERESA DUDZIK



Josephine Dudzik was born on August 30, 1860, in a village in Poland called Plocicz. When she was 21, she immigrated with her family to Chicago to seek a better life.

Josephine was interested in her faith and spiritual life, so she joined the Third Order Secular of St. Francis at her family’s parish with a friend. During this time, Chicago was experiencing a long depression along with the rest of the region. Faced with poverty all around her, she began doing what she could to care for impoverished people, even bringing them into her home. As she cared for the poor, her vision of what could be possible when it came to her service to those in need grew. She consulted with the pastor of her parish about organizing women at the parish to help her in her endeavors and about the possibility of even purchasing a larger home specifically to care for the poor in their community. He agreed to support her dream with one condition — that she and the other women involved start a religious congregation. She agreed and, along with other women from the Third Order Secular of St. Francis, established the Franciscan Sisters of the Blessed Kunegunda. They named the congregation for the soon-to-be-canonized Blessed Kunegunda from Poland whose cause for canonization was popular with the local Polish population in Chicago. Her new order officially began in December 1894, and was the first order of religious women founded within Chicago city limits. In 1900, Theresa and four of her friends took their profession of vows. She took the name Mary Theresa and led the congregation as their superior for ten years. During this time Sister Theresa started and operated the St. Joseph’s Home for the Aged and Crippled, St. Vincent’s Orphanage, and worked to build a day-care and institutions of education. They served the poorest of the poor and she quickly became known locally as Chicago’s Apostle of Mercy. After 10 years as the congregation’s superior, she was removed due to a nasty rumor that she was mismanaging the mission’s funding. She obediently took on more menial tasks in the congregation without complaint and continued to serve in whatever role she was given —unwavering in her service to the people of Chicago alongside her sisters. Her best friend, Sister Wysinski, was made superior instead and they continued their work together that way, expanding the congregation together to 160 women by the late 1910’s! In 1918, Sr. Theresa contracted cancer and on September 20 of the same year she passed away. Posthumously, she was given the title of Mother in recognition of her role as the foundress of what is now called the Franciscan Sisters of Chicago. In 1994, Saint Pope John Paul II gave Mother Mary Theresa Dudzik the title of Venerable.

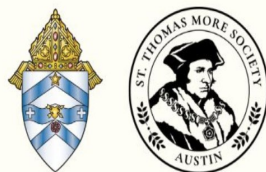
