Accountability

One of my accountability role models is St. Joseph. It is truly inspiring how he stood by Mary despite not being Jesus' natural father. He was a man of his word and honored his commitment to her, which is something we can all learn from. Even more impressive is how he became Jesus' protector and educator. It's no wonder that St. Joseph is the Patron of the Universal Church, as his accountability is truly unprecedented, even in his time. He's a shining example of what it means to be responsible and dependable, especially for men.

As believers, we are called to be accountable to God's plan for our lives, just as Joseph was faithful to his calling as a husband and father. The responsibility is even greater for those who speak on behalf of God, as seen in the words of our Heavenly Father to Ezekiel regarding prophets' duties to His people. These prophets must be accountable by warning people of potential spiritual doom, for failure to do so would result in consequences. However, it is important to note that if people do not heed the warnings given by God, then the prophets will not be held responsible for their actions.

As followers of Jesus, the Son of God, we must be accountable and warn others of their sinful transgressions against us. We must not seek revenge like in the days of "an eye for an eye" but rather work with our offenders to correct their behavior. (This does not apply to criminal, deviant, or abusive activities, which we must report to the authorities immediately.) If our efforts fail, we should seek the help of a group and then, if necessary, the Church. Should our attempts to correct the behavior of our offenders continue to be ignored, then we are justified, like in the time of Ezekiel, to distance ourselves from their spiritual doom.

We are all called to be accountable, particularly those in the clergy and religious communities. We must look out for each other and warn of possible spiritual danger. However, it is important to approach this task with care and compassion. As Jesus taught us, we should lead with mercy and love. We must show mercy to our fellow sinners and help guide them toward righteousness; mercy is our first responsibility in holding each other accountable.

Let us Pray:

O Lord, please bless us with your Holy Spirit so we may learn to be accountable as You desire. Please grant us the strength to be responsible and liable like Joseph, and may we always be guided by Your merciful teachings, just as Jesus taught us. Amen.

Responsabilidad

Como seguidores de Jesús, el Hijo de Dios, debemos ser responsables y advertir a otros de sus transgresiones pecaminosas contra nosotros. No debemos buscar venganza como en los días de "ojo por ojo", sino más bien trabajar con nuestros delincuentes para corregir su comportamiento. (Esto no se aplica a actividades delictivas, desviadas o abusivas, que debemos informar a las autoridades de inmediato). Si nuestros esfuerzos fracasan, debemos buscar la ayuda de un grupo y luego, si es necesario, de la Iglesia. Si nuestros intentos de corregir el comportamiento de nuestros ofensores continúan siendo ignorados, entonces estamos justificados, como en el tiempo de Ezequiel, para distanciarnos de su condenación espiritual.

Todos estamos llamados a rendir cuentas, particularmente aquellos en el clero y las comunidades religiosas. Debemos cuidarnos unos a otros y advertirnos de posibles peligros espirituales. Sin embargo, es importante llevar acabo esta tarea con cuidado y compasión. Como Jesús nos enseñó, debemos liderar con misericordia y amor. Debemos mostrar misericordia a nuestros compañeros pecadores y ayudarlos a guiarlos hacia la justicia. La misericordia es nuestra primera responsabilidad en responsabilizarnos unos a otros.

Oremos:

O Señor, por favor bendícenos con tu Espíritu Santo para que podamos aprender a ser responsables como Tú deseas. Por favor, concédenos la fuerza para ser responsables y responsables como San José, y que siempre seamos guiados por Tus enseñanzas misericordiosas, tal como Jesús nos enseñó. Amén.


