Preconceived Notions about God

It is amazing to think about what could happen if we let go of our preconceived notions about God. This idea has caused much trouble throughout history, going back to Adam and Eve. The devil used our false certainty to trick them into turning away from God, and we have been dealing with the consequences ever since. Time and time again, Jesus showed that we can never truly know who God is or what He will do. In Jesus' time, people saw tax collectors in a deplorable light. But Jesus saw something different in them and even chose a tax collector named Matthew to be one of his 12 apostles. Jesus operates outside of our human expectations. Take, for example, His conversation with the Samaritan woman at Jacob's well or His forgiveness of those who crucified Him. These actions go against what we might expect from God, but they teach us that His love and mercy are boundless.

As Christians, our certainty of who God is can sometimes lead to division. We may support leaders who become abusive or corrupted. We may create and support unjust and immoral laws or even foster wars. Therefore, it is important to remember that assuming we know everything about God can be dangerous. When we think we know God, we become an obstacle to Him. We start to think like human beings instead of seeing things from His perspective (Matthew 16:23). When we assume we know God, we open the door for the devil to poison our hearts, just like he did to Adam and Eve. When we understand that our knowledge of God is limited and flawed, we can approach Him with humility and trust in His plan. In doing so, we surrender ourselves to Jesus and place all our humanity at His feet on the Cross. By acknowledging our pride and accepting God's guidance, we open our hearts to His message: *"My thoughts are not your thoughts, neither are your ways my ways."* This message leads us to God's mercy as we recognize our imperfections and need for salvation. Scripture, Church, and Tradition all teach us that God's desire is to draw us closer to Him. Through the Holy Spirit, the Lord shows us that salvation is available to anyone who calls upon His name, a compassionate gift given to all His creations (see Psalm 145). When we let go of our preconceived notions of who God is, we allow ourselves to become more like Christ, our savior. Through us, He can spread His message of salvation and work wonders in the lives of others. By following His guidance, we can share the gifts of the Holy Spirit with those seeking God's love and mercy. Through partaking in the Eucharist and accepting His payment of salvation, God enriches our spirituality and frees us to focus on our faith and His love for us. We can rest assured that no matter when we start working in His vineyard, He will always reward us fairly and justly according to His divine plan. Let us pray: O Lord, grant us the courage and fortitude to reject the falsehoods that distance us from your Divine Love, Jesus Christ. May the Holy Spirit bless us with wisdom and knowledge to embrace the truth and walk in your light. We humbly ask You to fill us with guidance and grace so we may grow in humility and open our hearts to your teachings in Scripture, Church, and Tradition. Amen.

Pax et Bonum

Nociones preconcebidas acerca de Dios

Es asombroso pensar en lo que podría suceder si abandonamos nuestras nociones preconcebidas acerca de Dios. Nuestra incorrecta noción de quien es Dios ha causado muchos problemas a lo largo de la historia, desde Adán y Eva. El diablo usó nuestra falsa certeza para engañarlos para que se alejaran de Dios, y hemos estado viviendo con las consecuencias desde entonces.

Una y otra vez, Jesús nos ha mostrado que nunca podemos saber realmente quién es Dios o qué hará. En el tiempo de Jesús, la gente veía a los recaudadores de impuestos bajo una luz deplorable. Pero Jesús vio algo diferente en ellos e incluso eligió a un recaudador de impuestos llamado Mateo para ser uno de sus 12 apóstoles. Jesús opera fuera de nuestras expectativas humanas. Tomemos, por ejemplo, Su conversación con la mujer samaritana en el pozo de Jacob o Su perdón de aquellos que lo crucificaron. Estas acciones van en contra de lo que podríamos esperar de Dios, pero nos enseñan que Su amor y misericordia son ilimitados.

Como cristianos, nuestra certeza de quién es Dios a veces puede llevar a la división. Podemos apoyar a los líderes que se vuelven abusivos o corruptos. Podemos crear y apoyar leyes injustas e inmorales o incluso fomentar guerras. Por lo tanto, es importante recordar que asumir que sabemos todo acerca de Dios puede ser peligroso. Cuando pensamos que conocemos a Dios, nos convertimos en un obstáculo para Él. Comenzamos a pensar como seres humanos en lugar de ver las cosas desde Su perspectiva (Mateo 16:23). Cuando asumimos que conocemos a Dios, abrimos la puerta para que el diablo envenene nuestros corazones, tal como lo hizo con Adán y Eva. Cuando entendemos que nuestro conocimiento de Dios es limitado y defectuoso, podemos acercarnos a Él con humildad y confianza en Su plan. Al hacerlo, nos entregamos a Jesús y ponemos toda nuestra humanidad a sus pies en la Cruz. Al reconocer nuestro orgullo y aceptar la guía de Dios, abrimos nuestros corazones a Su mensaje: *"Mis pensamientos no son los pensamientos de ustedes, sus caminos no son mis caminos"*. Este mensaje nos lleva a la misericordia de Dios al reconocer nuestras imperfecciones y necesidad de salvación. Las Escrituras, la Iglesia y la Tradición nos enseñan que el deseo de Dios es acercarnos más a Él. A través del Espíritu Santo, el Señor nos muestra que la salvación está disponible para cualquiera que invoque Su nombre, un don compasivo dado a todas Sus creaciones (ver Salmo 145). Cuando dejamos ir nuestras nociones preconcebidas de quién es Dios, nos permitimos llegar a ser más como Cristo, nuestro salvador. A través de nosotros, Él puede difundir Su mensaje de salvación y hacer maravillas en la vida de los demás. Al seguir Su guía, podemos compartir los dones del Espíritu Santo con aquellos que buscan el amor y la misericordia de Dios. Al participar en la Eucaristía y aceptar Su pago de salvación, Dios enriquece nuestra espiritualidad y nos libera para enfocarnos en nuestra fe y Su amor por nosotros.

Podemos estar seguros de que no importa cuándo comencemos a trabajar en Su viña, Él siempre nos recompensará justa y equitativamente de acuerdo con Su plan divino. Oremos: Oh Señor, concédenos el coraje y la fortaleza para rechazar las falsedades que nos alejan de tu Amor Divino, Jesucristo. Que el Espíritu Santo nos bendiga con sabiduría y conocimiento para abrazar la verdad y caminar en tu luz. Humildemente te pedimos que nos llenes de guía y gracia para que podamos crecer en humildad y abrir nuestros corazones a tus enseñanzas en las Escrituras, la Iglesia y la Tradición. Amén.
