Repentance: our gateway to salvation

We are all sinners. Therefore, we all fall spiritually and morally at some point. To remedy our human flaw, Jesus became man. His sacrifice on the Cross opened the gates of salvation. However, we must repent of our sins. Remaining sinless is challenging because evil is always lurking, awaiting an opportunity to pull us away from our Lord. Evil is crafty and preys on our desires, tempting us to fall into disgrace. Evil knows that sinful behavior has consequences in this life and the next. Jesus warned: "Be afraid of the one who, after killing, has the power to cast into Gehenna; yes, I tell you, be afraid of that one."

Sometimes, we may recognize that our sinfulness has resulted in tragic events. Other times, our pride may attribute the blame for the consequences of our sins to others, including God, for allowing a situation to cause harm to us or others. Such behavior is not a new reality, as we hear in the Book of Ezekiel as God speaks to the Israelites: "You say: 'The Lord's way is not fair!' To which God replies: "Is it my way that is unfair? Are not your ways unfair? As Christians, we ought to remember that God is not the source of our pain but rather the fount of our healing.

We are all sinners. The good news is that God forgives us our transgressions if we repent: "Since they turned away from all the sins they committed, they shall live; they shall not die." In the Gospel of Matthew, Jesus explains this truth in a relatable way. He teaches that a son who disobeys his father by saying "Yes, sir" but does not follow through with his father's order becomes disobedient. But the son who initially refuses to do the father's order but later repents and does the father's will becomes whole.

We are all sinners, but God has given us forgiveness of sins. As the Catechism teaches us: "There is no one, however, wicked and guilty, who may not confidently hope forgiveness, provided his repentance is honest." Let us take advantage of Jesus' sacrifice of redemption in this life and seek forgiveness for our past transgressions.

Let us pray: O Lord, may the Holy Spirit help us to remain vigilant and stay strong in our faith, remembering that through the Sacraments of Reconciliation and Eucharist, You equip us to overcome temptation. Amen.

Pax et Bonum

El arrepentimiento: nuestra puerta de entrada a la salvación

Todos somos pecadores. Por lo tanto, todos caemos espiritual y moralmente en algún momento. Para remediar nuestro defecto humano, Jesús se hizo hombre. Su sacrificio en la Cruz abrió las puertas de la salvación. Sin embargo, debemos arrepentirnos de nuestros pecados. Pero permanecer sin pecado es un desafío porque el mal siempre está al acecho, esperando una oportunidad para alejarnos de nuestro Señor. El demonio es astuto y se aprovecha de nuestros deseos, tentándonos a caer en desgracia. El diablo sabe que el comportamiento pecaminoso tiene consecuencias en esta vida y en la próxima. Jesús advirtió: "Temed al que, después de matar, tiene poder para arrojar al infierno; sí, os digo: a este, ¡temed!".

A veces, podemos reconocer que nuestra pecaminosidad ha resultado en eventos trágicos. Otras veces, nuestro orgullo puede atribuir la culpa de las consecuencias de nuestros pecados a otros, incluyendo a Dios, por permitir que una situación nos cause daño a nosotros o a otros. Tal comportamiento no es una realidad nueva, como escuchamos en el Libro de Ezequiel cuando Dios habla a los israelitas: "¡Ustedes dicen: '¡No es justo el proceder del Señor!' A lo que Dios responde: "¿Conque es injusto mi proceder? ¿No es más bien el proceder de ustedes el injusto?" Como cristianos, debemos recordar que el Señor no es la fuente de nuestro dolor, sino más bien la fuente de nuestra curación.

Todos somos pecadores. La buena noticia es que Dios nos perdona nuestras transgresiones si nos arrepentimos: "Si recapacita y se aparta de los delitos cometidos, ciertamente vivirá y no morirá". En el Evangelio de Mateo, Jesús explica esta verdad de una manera relacionable. Él enseña que un hijo que desobedece a su padre diciendo "Sí, señor" pero no cumple la orden de su padre se vuelve desobediente. Pero, el hijo que inicialmente se niega a hacer la orden del padre, pero luego se arrepiente y hace la voluntad del padre, es obediente.

Todos somos pecadores, pero Dios nos ha dado la esperanza del perdón. Como nos enseña el Catecismo: "No hay nadie, tan perverso y tan culpable que, si verdaderamente está arrepentido de sus pecados, no pueda contar con la esperanza cierta del perdón". Aprovechemos el sacrificio de redención de Jesús en esta vida y busquemos el perdón por nuestras transgresiones pasadas.

Oremos: Oh Señor, que el Espíritu Santo nos ayude a permanecer vigilantes y fuertes en nuestra fe, recordando que, a través de los sacramentos de la Reconciliación y la Eucaristía, Tú nos equipas para vencer la tentación. Amén.




