

Jesus: Model of Honesty

Jesus showed His disciples the importance of honesty through His actions and by leaving behind the Cross as a symbol of His integrity. He never asked His disciples and followers to do anything that He would not do Himself. Jesus modeled for them how to pray by praying for hours to our Lord. He taught them to be compassionate toward others by ministering to the poor, the disadvantaged, and the sick. Jesus taught them to be humble by *becoming obedient to death, even death on a cross* (Philippians 2:8) so that they could endure their life trials. Through his examples of honesty and humility, Jesus inspired His small group of twelve apostles to build a worldwide Church that is still followed by billions today. Jesus' example is a testament to the power and influence of honesty and a model for us to imitate.

Jesus' teaching in honesty is well captured in Matthew 7:12 when He explained to His followers and disciples the Golden Rule: *"Do to others whatever you would have them do to you. This is the law and the prophets."* Jesus taught us that faith starts with honesty.

It is no wonder then that when Jesus denounced the Scribes and the Pharisees, He told the crowds and His disciples: *"Do and observe all things whatsoever they tell you, but do not follow their example"* (Matthew 23:3).

Jesus' teachings of honesty are as relevant today as they did in his time. How many times have we witnessed the hypocrisy Jesus condemns being displayed in our parish, homes, and community by some of us Christians? Clergy preaching the Word of God while vehemently opposing the Pope in ways that lead to separation among believers. Parents demand that their children limit their social media, but they are addicted to it. Politicians and community leaders talking about unity, peace, and collaboration only to turn around and enact policies and act in ways that bring about hate, wrath, and selfish behavior.

A point of self-reflection for all of us this week is to ask ourselves if we are truly living up to the example set by Jesus. Are our thoughts, words, and actions in alignment with the virtues of honesty that He embodied? It is easy to talk the talk but much harder to walk the walk. However, with God's help and our perseverance, we can become more honest. Therefore, let us strive to not only listen to His teachings but also to put them into practice in our daily lives. By doing so, we can not only imitate His teaching of honesty but also contribute to a more honest world.

Let us pray: O Lord, may the Eucharist help us to remove the stains of hypocrisy from our hearts. Jesus, I trust in you. Amen.

Jesús: Modelo de honestidad

Jesús mostró a sus discípulos la importancia de la honestidad a través de sus acciones y dejando atrás la cruz como símbolo de su integridad. Él nunca pidió a sus discípulos y seguidores que hicieran algo que Él mismo no haría. Jesús les enseñó a orar al orar por horas a nuestro Señor. Les enseñó a ser compasivos con los demás al ministrar a los pobres, a los desfavorecidos y a los enfermos. Jesús les enseñó a ser humildes cuando *"se humilló a sí mismo, haciéndose obediente hasta la muerte, y muerte en la cruz"* (Filipenses 2:8) para que pudieran enfrentar las dificultades que encontrarían en su apostolado. A través de sus ejemplos de honestidad y humildad, Jesús inspiró a su pequeño grupo de doce apóstoles a construir una Iglesia universal que todavía es seguida por miles de millones de personas hoy en día. Las obras de Jesús sirven como testimonio del poder y la influencia de la honestidad y un modelo para imitar.

La enseñanza de Jesús sobre la honestidad está bien captada en Mateo 7:12 cuando explicó a sus seguidores y discípulos la Regla de Oro: *"Así pues, traten a los demás como ustedes quieren que ellos los traten, porque en esto consisten la ley y los profetas."* Jesús nos enseñó que la fe comienza con la honestidad.

No es una sorpresa, entonces, que cuando Jesús denunció a los escribas y a los fariseos, dijera a las multitudes y a sus discípulos: *"Hagan pues, todo lo que les digan, pero no imiten sus obras"* (Mateo 23:3).

Las enseñanzas de honestidad de Jesús son tan importantes hoy como en sus tiempos. ¿Cuántas veces hemos sido testigos de la hipocresía que Jesús condena siendo exhibida en nuestras parroquias, hogares y comunidades por *algunos* de nosotros los cristianos? Clérigos que predicán la Palabra de Dios mientras se oponen vehementemente al Papa de maneras que conducen a la separación entre los creyentes. Los padres exigen a sus hijos que limiten sus redes sociales, pero son adictos a ellas. Los políticos y los líderes comunitarios que hablan de unidad, paz y colaboración solo para dar la vuelta y promulgar políticas y actuar de manera que provoquen odio, ira y comportamiento egoísta.

Un punto de autorreflexión para todos nosotros esta semana es preguntarnos si realmente estamos viviendo de acuerdo con las enseñanzas de Jesús. ¿Están nuestros pensamientos, palabras y acciones alineadas con las virtudes de honestidad y humildad que Él encarnó? Es fácil hablar por hablar, pero es mucho más difícil obrar ejemplarmente. Esforcémonos no solo por escuchar sus enseñanzas, sino también por ponerlas en práctica en nuestra vida diaria. Al hacerlo, no solo podemos imitar Su enseñanza de la honestidad, sino también contribuir a un mundo más honesto.

Oremos: Señor, que la Eucaristía remueva las manchas de la hipocresía de nuestros corazones. Jesús en ti confío. Amén.




