The Holy Family of Jesus, Mary, and Joseph

I was privileged to visit La Sagrada Familia Basilica in Barcelona, Spain, a few years ago. The magnificent Basilica narrates men's salvation history through the lenses of the Holy Family of Jesus, Mary, and Joseph. The Basilica is a family album of stones depicting God's love for us. It is a sacramental monument of a family's love for God, service to God, and our redemption from God.

The word "family" derives from the Latin word "familia," meaning household servants. Among all families, the Holy Family best embodies the family God's desire for us to contemplate and imitate. Jesus, Mary, and Joseph are examples of servitude for each other and God.

Jesus is the ultimate example of servitude, for He is the Suffering Servant. He is the Incarnate Son of God who humbled Himself by exchanging the garments of divinity for the rags of humanity. He traded His royal crown with the crown of servitude made from thorns of humility, mercy, and forgiveness. Jesus is the servant who came to the world not to be served but to perform acts of service. He cured the lepers, healed the brokenhearted, and fed the hunger. His service had one purpose: our redemption, which He purchased with His life. (cf. Matthew 20:28).

Mary is "*the handmaid of the Lord*," the Mother of Christ, the Servant of God the Son, and the Face of Family. The Incarnation was the seed of her service, which, like a mustard tree, has grown the tallest, a refuge of love to all. Her purification is her offering of service of sorrows, which at the foot of the cross transformed her into a servant of the Mystical Body of Christ, the Church.

Joseph – the Patron Saint of the Universal Church, and families – was a faithful servant who cared for his family from the shadows of humility and meekness. As Mary's servant, Joseph placed her honor and safety by his willingness to divorce her quietly after he learned of her divine pregnancy. As the father of Jesus, Joseph protected Him from harm and taught Him about faith and living skills as a carpenter. As a servant of God, Joseph obeyed God's faithfully.

The Holy Family of Jesus, Mary, and Joseph were devoted to serving each other as servants for God's glory and our salvation. Mary and Joseph raised and formed the Eucharist, Christ Jesus – the bread of life that sustains all, particularly families. Let us honor them today and always.

Let us pray:

Jesus, Mary, and Joseph, help all families find your strength, patience, and charity to be good household servants and examples of God's love in the world today and always.

Pax et Bonum

Sagrada Familia de Jesús, María y José

Hace unos años, tuve el privilegio de visitar la Basílica de la Sagrada Familia en Barcelona, España. La magnífica Basílica narra la historia de la salvación de los hombres a través de los lentes de la Sagrada Familia de Jesús, María y José. La Basílica es un álbum familiar de piedras que representa el amor de Dios por nosotros. Es un monumento sacramental del amor de una familia por Dios, el servicio a Dios y nuestra redención.

La palabra "familia" significa ser sirvientes domésticos. Entre todas las familias, la Sagrada Familia es la que mejor encarna el deseo de Dios de que la contemplemos e imitemos. Jesús, María y José son ejemplos de servidumbre el uno para el otro y para Dios.

Jesús es el máximo ejemplo de servidumbre, porque Él es el Siervo Sufriente. Es el Hijo de Dios encarnado que se humilló a sí mismo cambiando las vestiduras de la divinidad por los harapos de la humanidad. Cambió la corona de rey por la corona de servidumbre hecha de espinas de humildad, misericordia y perdón. Jesús es el siervo que vino al mundo no para ser servido, sino para realizar actos de servicio. Él curó a los leprosos, sanó a los quebrantados de corazón y sació el hambre. Su servicio tenía un propósito: nuestra redención, que Él compró con Su vida. (cf. Mateo 20:28).

María es "*la esclava del Señor*", la Madre de Cristo, la Sierva de Dios Hijo y Rostro de la Familia. La Encarnación fue la semilla de su servicio, que, como un árbol de mostaza, ha crecido como el más alto, un refugio de amor para todos. Su purificación fue su ofrenda de servicio de los dolores, que al pie de la cruz la transformó en sierva del Cuerpo Místico de Cristo, la Iglesia.

José – Patrón de la Iglesia Universal y de las familias – fue un siervo fiel que cuidó de su familia desde las sombras de la humildad. Como siervo de María, José protegió el honor de María con su voluntad de divorciarse de ella en silencio después de enterarse de su embarazo divino. Como padre de Jesús, José lo protegió del peligro y le enseñó acerca de la fe y las habilidades para vivir como carpintero. Como siervo de Dios, José obedeció la palabra de Dios fielmente.

La Sagrada Familia de Jesús, María y José se dedicó a servirse unos a otros para la gloria de Dios y nuestra salvación. María y José criaron y educaron a la Eucaristía, Cristo Jesús – el pan de vida que sostiene a todos, especialmente a las familias. Honrémoslos hoy y siempre.
