DEACON HECTOR ORTIZ**The Epiphany of the Lord: The Light of Salvation**

As a child growing up in Puerto Rico, I always looked forward to the Epiphany of the Lord, especially the adoration of Jesus by the magi. This celebration was very special to me because it was when Puerto Rican and Latin American children received Christmas presents. Although there were two other important celebrations - the baptism of Jesus in the Jordan and the miracle at the Wedding at Cana - this one filled my heart with the light of joy.

The Epiphany of the Lord holds a much deeper significance as an adult. It represents "the manifestation of Jesus as the Messiah of Israel, the Son of God, and the Savior of the World" (CCC 528). God the Father fulfills the prophets' promise to Israel on this day. He shines the Light of Salvation, Jesus Christ, to all humanity.

Before the Epiphany of the Lord, darkness covered the world, and clouds covered the people (cf. Is 60:1-2). But now, we rise with joy and hope, singing, "Rise up in splendor, Jerusalem! Your light has come, the glory of the Lord shines upon you."

Even people in faraway lands heard about this light, and their hearts, too, burned with the desire for the light of joy and hope. In their wisdom, they sent three wise men as ambassadors. They came bearing gold, frankincense, and myrrh as gifts of adoration to the child born in Bethlehem, the new king of the Jews. They pledged their allegiance to the child king: "Lord, every nation on earth will adore you." The king corresponded in kind. As the Holy Spirit revealed through apostles and prophets, we all formed part of the Kingdom of God. We are "coheirs, members of the same body, and copartners in the promise in Christ Jesus through the gospel."

Unfortunately, the forces of evil are constantly working to prevent us from fully experiencing the manifestation of Jesus on earth. Some people willingly choose to follow the path of darkness to conceal their wicked deeds. Others may be trapped in darkness due to their sinful nature, falling prey to the enemy's tactics or becoming too comfortable with the world of the flesh. And some may be unaware of the truth or lack proper religious education, leading them into darkness.

The good news is that the revelation of Jesus is easily accessible to everyone through the manifestation of the Eucharist. In the Bread of Life, the Epiphany of the Lord is visible for adoration and consumption. It is the gift for the forgiveness of sins, the redemption of souls, and the resurrection of the dead. It fulfills the promise of "the manifestation of Jesus as the Messiah of Israel, the Son of God, and the Savior of the World."

Let us pray: O Lord may your Light of Salvation, Your Son Jesus Christ, shine within our hearts just as it did in the hearts of the wise men. May His light guide us to glorify you with our lives.

Pax et Bonum

Epifanía del Señor: La luz de la Salvación

Cuando era niño y crecía en Puerto Rico, siempre esperaba con ansias la Epifanía del Señor, especialmente la adoración de Jesús por parte de los magos de Oriente. Esta celebración era muy especial para mí porque es cuando los niños puertorriqueños y latinoamericanos reciben regalos de Navidad. Aunque hay dos celebraciones importantes más que forman la Epifanía, el bautismo de Jesús en el Jordán y el milagro de las bodas de Caná, la visita de los magos llenó mi corazón con la luz de la alegría.

La Epifanía del Señor tiene un significado mucho más profundo como adulto. Representa "*la manifestación de Jesús como el Mesías de Israel, el Hijo de Dios y el Salvador del Mundo*" (CCC 528). Dios Padre cumple la promesa de los profetas a Israel en este día. Él hace brillar la Luz de la Salvación, Jesús Cristo, a toda la humanidad.

Antes de la Epifanía del Señor, las tinieblas cubrían el mundo y las nubes cubrían a los pueblos (cf. Is 60,1-2). Pero ahora, nos levantamos con alegría y esperanza, cantando: "*Levántate y resplandece, Jerusalén, porque ha llegado tu luz y la gloria del Señor aborea sobre ti.*"

Incluso las personas de tierras lejanas oyeron hablar de esta luz, y sus corazones también ardían con el deseo de la luz de la alegría y la esperanza. En su sabiduría, enviaron a tres reyes magos como embajadores. Vinieron con oro, incienso y mirra como regalos de adoración al niño nacido en Belén, el nuevo rey de los judíos. Juraron lealtad al niño rey: "*Se postrarán ante ti, Señor, todos los pueblos de la tierra*". El rey le correspondió de la misma manera. Como el Espíritu Santo reveló a través de apóstoles y profetas, todos formamos parte del Reino de Dios: "*Por el Evangelio, también los paganos son coherederos, miembros del mismo cuerpo y copartícipes de la misma promesa en Cristo Jesús por medio del evangelio*".

Desafortunadamente, las fuerzas del mal están constantemente trabajando para evitar que experimentemos plenamente la manifestación de Jesús en la tierra. Algunas personas eligen voluntariamente seguir el camino de las tinieblas para ocultar sus malas acciones. Otros pueden estar atrapados en la oscuridad debido a su naturaleza pecaminosa, cayendo presa de las tácticas del enemigo o sintiéndose demasiado cómodos con el mundo de la carne. Y algunos pueden desconocer la verdad o carecer de una educación religiosa adecuada, lo que los lleva a la oscuridad.

La buena noticia es que la revelación de Jesús es fácilmente accesible para todos a través de la manifestación de la Eucaristía. En el Pan de Vida, la Epifanía del Señor es visible para la adoración y el consumo. Es el don para el perdón de los pecados, la redención de las almas y la resurrección de los muertos. Cumple la promesa de "la manifestación de Jesús como el Mesías de Israel, el Hijo de Dios y el Salvador del Mundo".

Oremos: Oh, Señor, que tu Luz de Salvación, Tu Hijo Jesucristo, brille en nuestros corazones como lo hizo en los corazones de los magos de Oriente. Que Su luz nos guíe para glorificarte con nuestras vidas.


