

# MAKE US CLEAN

As I read today's Sacred Scriptures, my heart went through various emotions. Leviticus 13:1-2 and 44-46 describe the Mosaic laws regarding skin diseases, including leprosy (see Leviticus chapters 13-14). Initially, I was saddened that God would give such laws to the Israelites. However, as I meditated on the words, the Holy Spirit filled me with peace. Although it may seem uncompassionate, God gave the Israelites what they could manage back then. There was no treatment for leprosy until the 1940s!

The Mosaic Law required priests to declare those with leprosy unclean. As a result, they became outcasts; they had to live among other lepers, away from loved ones and were spiritually isolated. Additionally, the law required them to announce their uncleanliness by shouting "unclean, unclean" in public.

Today's scriptures contextualized the Mosaic Law concerning one of our times' leprosies: COVID-19. Through this pandemic, most of us experienced the tragic and sorrowful nature of a leprosy-like disease and the world's measures to prevent and protect others. However, having lived through COVID-19, we also witnessed God's love and mercy working through people to alleviate human suffering. I imagine this has always been true in humanity's history, even in the worst times, for God blessed us with the fruits of the Holy Spirit, such as love, patience and, kindness.

God consoles and heals us. That was even the case during the Mosaic Law. If a person recovered from leprosy, the priests declared them clean and allowed them to rejoin society. God cured people of leprosy. For example, God cured Mariam's leprosy (see Numbers 12:9-16). In 2 Kings 5:1-15, we hear about God healing Naaman from leprosy.

Jesus is our ultimate example of compassion and embodies God's love for us. Being fully human, He understands our pain, listens to our cries, comforts us in sorrow, and mends our wounds. While we may not always receive the exact outcome we desire, if we place our trust in Him, He possesses the gifts to heal us physically, emotionally, or spiritually through His power, the help of others, or the wonders of nature.

Mostly, Jesus wants to heal us from our brokenness as humans and desires to free us from the spiritual leprosy that separates us from Him. We can approach Jesus with humility and patience and pray to Him to make us clean. We can follow the example of the leper in the Gospel who said, "If you wish, you can make me clean."

You might wonder how Jesus can touch us now that He is no longer physically present in our world. The answer lies in the Sacraments, particularly Penance and the Eucharist (refer to CCC. 1504). We can worship Him, pray to Him, confess our sins, and receive the healing bread of the Eucharist. By doing so, He will touch us and heal us from the leprosy of sin.

Let us pray: Jesus, I trust in You. If you wish, make me clean. Amen.

# **PUEDES CURARNOS**

Al leer las Sagradas Escrituras de hoy, mi corazón experimentó varias emociones. Levítico 13:1-2 y 44-46 describen las leyes mosaicas con respecto a las enfermedades de la piel, incluyendo la lepra (ver Levítico capítulos 13-14). Al principio, me entristeció que Dios diera tales leyes a los israelitas. Sin embargo, mientras meditaba en las palabras, el Espíritu Santo me llenó de paz. Aunque parezca poco compasivo, Dios les dio a los israelitas lo que podían manejar en ese entonces. ¡No hubo tratamiento para la lepra hasta la década de 1940!

La Ley mosaica exigía que los sacerdotes declararan impuros a los enfermos de lepra. Como resultado, se convirtieron en señeros; tuvieron que vivir entre otros leprosos, lejos de sus seres queridos y aislados espiritualmente. ¡Además, la ley les exigía que anunciaran su inmundicia gritando "¡Estoy contaminado! ¡Soy impuro!" en público.

Las Escrituras de hoy contextualizaron la ley mosaica con respecto a una de las lepras de nuestro tiempo: COVID-19. Durante la pandemia, la mayoría de nosotros experimentamos la naturaleza trágica y dolorosa de una enfermedad similar a la lepra y las medidas del mundo para prevenir y proteger a los demás. Sin embargo, después de haber vivido el COVID-19, también fuimos testigos del amor y la misericordia de Dios obrando a través de las personas para aliviar el sufrimiento humano. Me imagino que esto siempre ha sido cierto en la historia de la humanidad, incluso en los peores momentos, porque Dios nos bendijo con los frutos del Espíritu Santo, como el amor, la paciencia y la bondad.

Dios nos consuela y nos sana. Ese fue el caso incluso durante la ley mosaica. Si una persona se recuperaba de la lepra, los sacerdotes la declaraban limpia y le permitían reincorporarse a la sociedad. Dios curó a la gente de la lepra. Por ejemplo, Dios curó la lepra de Mariam (ver Números 12:9-16). En 2 Reyes 5:1-15, escuchamos acerca de Dios sanando a Naamán de la lepra.

Jesús es nuestro máximo ejemplo de compasión y encarna el amor de Dios por nosotros. Siendo humano, Él entiende nuestro dolor, escucha nuestro llanto, consuela nuestro dolor y cura nuestras heridas. Si bien es posible que no siempre recibamos el resultado exacto que deseamos, si ponemos nuestra confianza en Él, Jesús posee los dones para sanarnos física, emocional o espiritualmente a través de Su poder, la ayuda de los demás o las maravillas de la naturaleza.

Sobre todo, Jesús quiere sanarnos de nuestro quebrantamiento como seres humanos y desea liberarnos de la lepra espiritual que nos separa de Él. Podemos acercarnos a Jesús con humildad y paciencia y orarle para que nos limpie con su toque. Podemos seguir el ejemplo del leproso en el Evangelio que dijo: "Si tú quieres, puedes curarme".

Tal vez te preguntes cómo Jesús puede tocarnos ahora que ya no está fisicamente presente en nuestro mundo. La respuesta está en los sacramentos, en particular en la penitencia y la eucaristía (véase el CIC 1504). Podemos adorarlo, orarle, confesar nuestros pecados y recibir el pan sanador de la Eucaristía. Al hacerlo, Él nos tocará y nos sanará de la lepra del pecado.

Oremos: Jesús, en Ti confio. Si tú quieres, puedes curarme. Amén.


