





DEACON HECTOR ORTIZ

The First Station: Jesus is condemned to death.

The first station reminds us of the destructive influence of envy. Envy led the Chief Priests and Sadducees to request Pilate to condemn Jesus to death: "For he [Pilate] knew that it was out of envy that the Chief Priests had handed him over" (Mark 15:10).

Exhortation: Let's consider how envy may have harmed our spiritual life and relationships with others. How much of our thoughts, words, and actions are influenced by jealousy? What are some opportunities to mitigate the effects of envy at work, in the Church, or our family or community?

The Second Station: Jesus takes up the cross.

The second station emphasizes the sanctity of humility over pride and self-worship. Jesus chose to humble himself through His passion instead of manifesting his glory or rejecting His Father's will: "And being found in human form he humbled himself and became obedient unto death, even death on the a cross" (Philippians 2:8)

Exhortation: Let's consider how we can demonstrate humility towards God the Father and imitate Jesus. How can we pray to the Holy Spirit to guide our interactions with others?

Let's Pray: O God may the Spirit drive us into the desert of Lent. As Satan tempts us, may we overcome our temptations, and may the angels minister to us just as they did to Jesus. Amen.

Pax et Bonum

Reflexiones Vía Crucis: Estaciones #1 y #2

El Vía Crucis es una invitación de Jesús a reflexionar sobre su sufrimiento, nuestro quebrantamiento humano y nuestra redención. Que el Señor esté con nosotros en nuestro viaje cuaresmal.

La Primera Estación: Jesús es condenado a muerte.

La primera estación nos recuerda la influencia destructiva de la envidia. La envidia llevó a los sumos sacerdotes y a los saduceos a pedir a Pilato que condenara a muerte a Jesús: "Pues sabía [Pilato] que los jefes de los sacerdotes habían entregado a Jesús por envidia" (Marcos 15:10).

Exhortación: Consideremos cómo la envidia puede haber dañado nuestra vida espiritual y nuestras relaciones con los demás. ¿Cuánto de nuestros pensamientos, palabras y acciones están influenciados por los celos? ¿Cuáles son algunas oportunidades para aliviar los efectos de la envidia en el trabajo, en la Iglesia, en nuestra familia o comunidad?

La Segunda Estación: Jesús con la cruz a cuestas.

La segunda estación enfatiza la santidad de la humildad sobre el orgullo y la adoración a uno mismo. Jesús eligió humillarse a sí mismo a través de su pasión en lugar de manifestar su gloria o rechazar la voluntad de su Padre: "Y en su condición de hombre, se humilló a sí mismo haciéndose obediente hasta la muerte, y una muerte en la cruz" (Filipenses 2:8).

Exhortación: Consideremos cómo podemos demostrar humildad hacia Dios Padre e imitar a Jesús. ¿Cómo podemos orar al Espíritu Santo para que guíe nuestras interacciones con los demás?

Oremos: Oh Dios, que el Espíritu nos impulse al desierto de la Cuaresma. Mientras Satanás nos tenta, que venzamos nuestras tentaciones, y que los ángeles nos sirvan tal como lo hicieron con Jesús. Amen.
