



A REFLECTION FROM THE MISSIONS DIRECTOR

Trusting in God in Modern Times

Who do you trust in? God or man?

Nowadays, it's easy to feel overwhelmed by the "curses" of our time – the constant stream of negative news, international calamities, and other catastrophes that seem to scare and separate us. Hardly a day goes by without new information bombarding us. Yet, our readings today challenge us. They remind us to keep hope. And, it is now more than ever that we must turn to God and His Word to nourish and sustain us.

From personal challenges to global crises, now is perhaps one of the most difficult times in history to trust in God. Constant stimulation, Twitter updates (ok, X updates), and the 24/7 news cycle badger us with negativity on a daily, hourly, even minute-ly basis. This fear can creep into our hearts, making it difficult to maintain a sense of peace and hope. It's all too easy to become distracted and drift off course. Yet, hope remains.

And our hope doesn't mean we ignore the hardships, but instead it involves a change in our mindset: choosing to respond with love and trust in God—the path of blessing.

Blessed is the one who trusts in the LORD,
whose hope is in the LORD.
He is like a tree planted beside the waters
that stretches out its roots to the stream:
it fears not the heat when it comes;
its leaves stay green;
in the year of drought it shows no distress,
but still bears fruit. - Book of Jeremiah

In modernity, this hope can feel foreign. Yet, it is precisely in these moments that our faith is tested, grown, and deepened. Our hope is not a naive optimism that ignores the realities of our world, but instead it is a remedy. It is an anchor that holds us steady amidst the storms of life—a confident expectation rooted in God's promises.

So, how can we live out this message of hope in 2025? Well, in today's climate, it seems prudent to offer some practical tips:

- Practice Gratitude: I find that each day slows down when I acknowledge the blessings in my life, no matter how small.
- Extend Forgiveness: Holding onto resentment from the past only breeds more bitterness. We have enough of that on the news! Choose to forgive others (and yourself!) as Christ has forgiven us.
- Serve Others: In the heart of the city of Austin, we're in a prime spot to serve. Reach out to those in need, offering a helping hand, a listening ear, or even just a smile.
- Become Prayerful: Spend time in prayer, seeking God's wisdom and strength through the Scriptures.
- Be a Light: In a world filled with darkness, we are called to be a light! Let your words and actions be a source of hope and encouragement to others. We are not in competition, but must build each other up daily as different members of the body.

Here in Austin we find our selves in the midst of something special—the path of blessing. And we know that this path leads us to eternal life. By actively choosing trust and hope, we not only find peace in our own lives but also become instruments of God's love and healing in a world that desperately needs it.

Let us pray:

Lord, may we embrace our calling with courage and faith, trusting in You and knowing that You are with us always.
