

Sacraments

The Sacrament of Baptism is administered most Sundays after the 12:00 pm Mass. Arrangements must be made in advance by calling the Parish Office. First time parents are required to attend a Pre-Jordan class before the baptism. They are held the second Tuesday of every month at 7:00 pm. No pre-registration is necessary.

The Sacrament of Reconciliation is offered every Saturday, 4:00 to 4:45 pm; Sundays immediately following the 9:00 am Mass; and anytime by appointment.

The Sacrament of Marriage may be scheduled by contacting the Parish Office. The couple must contact the church at least 6 months before a planned wedding date. No other arrangements should be made until the couple meets with a parish priest and the date and time are confirmed. One party must be a member of the parish. Attendance at a Marriage Preparation program is required in accordance with Archdiocesan policy.

Anointing of the Sick is available to the dying and those who are elderly, sick, or preparing for surgery. Please contact the Parish Office.

Communion Calls are made monthly by clergy and weekly by Extraordinary Ministers of Holy Communion. To place a homebound individual on the Communion Call list, call the Parish Office.

New Registrations

Welcome new parishioners! You may call the Parish Office at 215-362-7400 to make an appointment to register. In order to receive the sacraments of Baptism, Confirmation and Marriage, or Letters of Eligibility for sponsorship at Baptism or Confirmation, you must be a registered parishioner. Also, children who turn 26 years of age, or complete higher education and continue to reside within our area, should become individually registered parishioners.

Women who have lost their mothers may enjoy being recognized and honored by their children and families, but may also struggle with feelings of emptiness and sadness as they miss their own mother. Other people who might also struggle with this holiday are people who have experienced infertility, miscarriages or have suffered a death of their child. To all those suffering this day, the Bereavement ministry assures you of our prayers for comfort and reminds you of the hope we have in Christ, that all mothers will be reunited with their children in Heaven someday, with our Father whose merciful love brought us together in the beginning.

A Note to Survivors

This website states Archdiocesan policies and procedures. It also offers mandatory reporting training, prevention resources for parents, and an overview of services. Above all else, victims of sexual abuse are urged to contact the appropriate law enforcement agency.

Are You on Track for the Parish Discount for 2019-20 Tuition?

This is a reminder to parents that in order to be eligible for the parish discount on tuition for grades 1 to 8 at MMR school for the 2019-20 school year, you must have fulfilled the minimum financial contribution requirement of \$780 (\$15 per week) during the period July 1, 2018 through June 30, 2019. If you are on track to meet the requirement as of May 1, 2019, which is 10 months into the annual period, you would have contributed at least \$650 to date. If you are not on track, please catch up as soon as possible. Since the tuition billing is now being handled by a third party we need to inform them no later than June 30, 2019 which accounts have met the contribution requirement. If you have not met the requirement your tuition will be billed at the full rate of \$5900 per child. If you have a financial hardship, please e-mail the Parish Business Manager at loutonelli@mmredeemer.org.

Next Week's Second Collection

Next weekend the second collection will be for the MMR Education Endowment Fund. Monsignor Conway established a separate Education Endowment Fund in 2013 for the children of our parish with the vision of having the principal of this Fund grow to an amount whereby the annual dividends and interest could be allocated to the costs of physical improvements, curriculum development, and student scholarships (that is, tuition assistance). Such investments will benefit full-time students and PREP students. Whatever you are able to give to make this Education Endowment Fund work for our children will be greatly appreciated, and put to good use.
