Sacraments

The Sacrament of Baptism is administered **most**
Sundays after the 12:00 pm Mass. **Arrangements**
must be made in advance by calling the Parish
Office. First time parents are required to attend a
Pre-Jordan class before the baptism. They are held
the second Tuesday of every month at 7:00 pm. No
pre-registration is necessary.

The Sacrament of Reconciliation is offered every
Saturday, 4:00 to 4:45 pm; Sundays immediately
following the 9:00 am Mass; and anytime by appointment.

The Sacrament of Marriage may be scheduled
by contacting the Parish Office. The couple must
contact the church at least 6 months before a
planned wedding date. No other arrangements
should be made until the couple meets with a parish
priest and the date and time are confirmed. One
party must be a member of the parish. Attendance
at a Marriage Preparation program is required in
accordance with Archdiocesan policy.

Anointing of the Sick is available to the dying
and those who are elderly, sick, or preparing for
surgery. Please contact the Parish Office.

Communion Calls are made monthly by clergy
and weekly by Extraordinary Ministers of Holy
Communion. To place a homebound individual on
the Communion Call list, call the Parish Office.

New Registrations

Welcome new parishioners! You may call the Parish
Office at 215-362-7400 to make an appointment to
register. In order to receive the sacraments of
Baptism, Confirmation and Marriage, or Letters of
Eligibility for sponsorship at Baptism or Confirmation,
you must be a registered parishioner. Also, children
who turn 26 years of age, or complete higher
education and continue to reside within our area,
should become individually registered parishioners.

Eucharistic "Forty Hours" Devotion Scheduled

Mary, Mother of the Redeemer parish will observe its annual Eucharistic "Forty Hours" Devotion from **Sunday, October 4th, through Tuesday, October 6th.**

Father Matthew Brody, parochial vicar at Our Lady of Mount Carmel in Doylestown (and a priest son of Mary, Mother of the Redeemer Parish), will be the preacher.



The Devotion will open at the end of the 12:00 pm Mass that Sunday, and will conclude with Holy Mass that Tuesday evening. All services are scheduled for 7:00 pm, and **will be live-streamed on our website.** Adoration will take place throughout each day. Please make every effort to participate in some way during those days.

Seminarist Appointed to Ministry of Acolyte

On Saturday, September 12th, **Roneld Saint Louis** received the ministry of acolyte at Saint Charles Borromeo Seminary. Roneld, who has been assigned to Mary, Mother of the Redeemer parish since June, is in Theology III and aspires to be ordained a deacon in spring of 2021 as he continues his journey to the priesthood.

In 1973 Pope Paul VI abolished "minor orders," but kept the role of acolyte; calling it instead a "ministry." The acolyte is appointed in order to attend to the service of the altar and to assist the deacon and the priest in liturgical celebrations, especially in the celebration of Mass. There are a few other duties entrusted to the acolyte, such as distributing Holy Communion to the sick. This ministry is always given to men studying to become priests or deacons. We offer to Roneld our best wishes and prayers as he continues his seminary education and formation.

- **Mail-in and absentee ballot applications** for the November 3, 2020 general election can be found at <https://www.votespa.com/Voting-in-PA/Pages/Mail-and-Absentee-Ballot.aspx>. Applications must be received by your county election office by 5 pm, Tuesday, October 27, 2020.

Dear Brothers and Sisters in Christ,

As we come towards the end of September, the more I am hearing about politics and the upcoming elections. I want to take some time to highlight a really great resource for us as Catholics in understanding our participation in civic life.

In 2015, the United States Bishops put forth a statement called **Forming Consciences for Faithful Citizenship**, which seeks to help us, as Catholics, to form our consciences, to apply a consistent moral framework to modern issues, and to be able to make choices in elections in light of Catholic Social Teaching.

A passage in the Introduction gives light to the spirit of the document:

At all levels of society, we are aware of a great need for leadership that models love for righteousness (Wisdom 1:1) as well as the virtues of justice, prudence, courage, and temperance. Our commitment as people of faith to imitate Christ's love and compassion should challenge us to serve as models of civic dialogue, especially in a context where discourse is eroding at all levels of society. Where we live, work, and worship, we strive to understand before seeking to be understood, to treat with respect those with whom we disagree, to dismantle stereotypes, and to build productive conversation in place of vitriol... We urge leaders and all Catholics to respond in prayer and action to the call to faithful citizenship. In doing so, we live out the call to holiness and work with Christ as He builds His kingdom of love.

May we strive to form our consciences, become informed, and grow in our practice of living out the virtues.

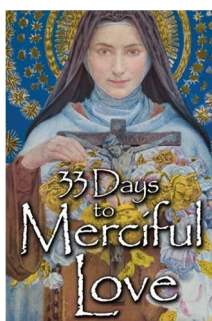
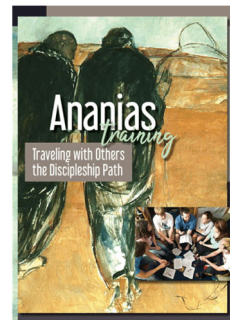
Ananias Training

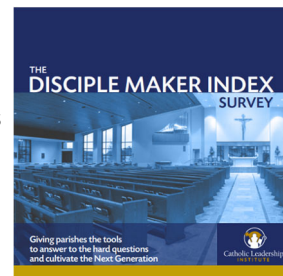

St. John's Hospice Update

St. John's Hospice is ready to receive pre-made casserole donations once again. If you are interested in making a casserole for this program, please follow the directions below so that your casserole can be used safely:

- 1) Grab a pan and a lid from the cabinet in the ministry room (small room to the left as you enter the chapel from the narthex).
- 2) Cook and FREEZE a casserole of your choice. (Please take care in filling your casserole pan as under-filling will prevent the lid from adhering and over-filling will cause a huge mess in the freezer)
- 3) Label your casserole with the date prepared in marker on the lid before freezing. (This is a Health Department rule; unlabeled casseroles cannot be used.)
- 4) Place your FROZEN casserole in the flat freezer in the hallway of the preschool in the church. (After the bathrooms, make a right to get to the freezer.)
- 5) IF the freezer is full, please alert someone at the Parish Office and place your casserole in the upright freezer for the time being. If that freezer is also full, please alert church staff right away.
- 6) Make sure that your casserole lid is tightly attached to prevent spoilage. If the lid comes off, the casserole will not be able to be used.
