### **Sacraments**

The Sacrament of Baptism is administered most Sundays after the 12:00 pm Mass. Arrangements must be made in advance by calling the Parish Office. First time parents are required to attend a Pre-Jordan class before the baptism. They are held the second Tuesday of every month at 7:00 pm. No pre-registration is necessary.

**The Sacrament of Reconciliation** is offered every Saturday, 4:00 to 4:45 pm; Sundays immediately following the 9:00 am Mass; and anytime by appointment.

**The Sacrament of Marriage** may be scheduled by contacting the Parish Office. The couple must contact the church at least 6 months before a planned wedding date. No other arrangements should be made until the couple meets with a parish priest and the date and time are confirmed. One party must be a member of the parish. Attendance at a Marriage Preparation program is required in accordance with Archdiocesan policy.

**Anointing of the Sick** is available to the dying and those who are elderly, sick, or preparing for surgery. Please contact the Parish Office.

**Communion Calls** are made monthly by clergy and weekly by Extraordinary Ministers of Holy Communion. To place a homebound individual on the Communion Call list, call the Parish Office.

# **New Registrations**

Welcome new parishioners! You may call the Parish Office at 215-362-7400 to make an appointment to register. In order to receive the sacraments of Baptism, Confirmation and Marriage, or Letters of Eligibility for sponsorship at Baptism or Confirmation, you must be a registered parishioner. Also, children who turn 26 years of age, or complete higher education and continue to reside within our area, should become individually registered parishioners.

A message from Jessica Walters, Director of Adult Faith Formation

Dear Brothers and Sisters in Christ,

There are so many aspects of life that feel bittersweet. This is my last column here at MMR, and I am so sad to say goodbye. That's the bitter part. The sweet part is that I get to spend more time at home with our precious baby, which is such a beautiful thing.

I wish us all a sense of peace in this new year, and in this time of transition. In Psalm 29 we read that "the Lord will bless his people with peace." In Acts 10 we hear the proclamation of "peace through Jesus Christ, who is Lord of all." What does it mean to have peace through Jesus Christ? I'll share a reflection that resonated with me and helped me better understand:

"When it comes to true happiness in life, the gift of true interior peace is one of the clearest signs that we are on the right track and are making the right decisions. When we choose the will of God each and every day, those choices may be difficult and require much initial sacrifice.

True peace produces strength. It leads to interior integrity and wholeness. It produces clarity of thought and certitude in convictions. God's peace leads to more peace. It leads to choices based on well-thought-out actions of love. Peace leads us to the will of God, and the will of God leads to peace. The cyclical effect is exponential and is one of the clearest guides to happiness in life.

Reflect, today, upon whether you truly have peace in your heart. Do you recognize the still, strong and sustaining presence of God within your soul? Do your daily choices produce greater integrity of heart and clarity of mind? Do you find that you have joy and calm, even in the midst of life's greatest challenges? Seek out this peace, for if you do, you will be seeking out the good God Who produces this glorious gift within your heart."

# Bereavement Ministry Session in January



We have had to make adjustments to our MLK Day of Service event that was scheduled for **Monday**, **January 17**<sup>th</sup>. In the best interest of our youth, we are changing our MLK Service event to a remote event. Those who wish to participate in the event, are welcome to complete one, two, three or even four acts of service that we have prearranged.

- Cradles to Crayons are looking for handmade cards for underprivileged children in the area "Welcoming the child back to the school year." This is such a big undertaking that they need to start this program now. MMR has committed to 1000 cards. Please consider making a few handmade cards for this event.
