



Sacraments

The Sacrament of Baptism is administered most Sundays after the 11:30 am Mass. Arrangements must be made in advance by calling the Parish Office. First time parents are required to attend a Pre-Jordan class before the baptism. They are held the second Tuesday of every month at 7:00 pm. No pre-registration is necessary.

The Sacrament of Reconciliation is offered every Saturday, 4:00 to 4:45 pm; Sundays immediately following the 9:30 am Mass; and anytime by appointment.

The Sacrament of Marriage may be scheduled by contacting the Parish Office. The couple must contact the church at least 6 months before a planned wedding date. No other arrangements should be made until the couple meets with a parish priest and the date and time are confirmed. One party must be a member of the parish. Attendance at a Marriage Preparation program is required in accordance with Archdiocesan policy.

Anointing of the Sick is available to the dying and those who are elderly, sick, or preparing for surgery. Please contact the Parish Office.

Communion Calls are made monthly by clergy and weekly by Extraordinary Ministers of Holy Communion. To place a homebound individual on the Communion Call list, call the Parish Office.

New Registrations

Welcome new parishioners! You may call the Parish Office at 215-362-7400 to make an appointment to register. In order to receive the sacraments of Baptism, Confirmation and Marriage, or to obtain Letters of Eligibility for sponsorship at Baptism or Confirmation, you must be a registered parishioner. Also, children who turn 26 years of age, or complete higher education and continue to reside within our area, should register individually as parishioners.

Holy Silence at the End of Mass

According to Sing to the Lord: Music in Divine Worship, a document from the United States Bishops which provides basic guidelines for understanding the role and ministry of music in the liturgy, observing a silent recessional, in place of singing a hymn, may be an appropriate option especially during Lent due to its penitential nature. This year, as a parish, we will be observing silence after the dismissal of Mass. Please maintain silence as the priest and other liturgical ministers process out of the church, and as you leave the church. As always, you may remain in church for personal prayer as well.

Please note that the priest will make himself available immediately following Mass, and will remain in the confessional only until the last person in line for confession is heard.





Mary, Mother of the Redeemer Church OUR 2023 PARISH LENTEN PROGRAM

(Please keep this sheet as a handy reference throughout the Season of Lent.)

"Ash Wednesday begins the Catholic season of Lent, a time of examining our consciences, confessing and repenting our sins, and working to change the direction of our lives back toward God through prayer, self-sacrifice, and charitable acts to others.

This is why Lent is so important. It's the season in Church life that calls us to discipline our appetites, put aside our excuses, and take an honest look at the state of our souls."

(Archbishop Emeritus Charles Chaput)

FAST AND ABSTINENCE AND OTHER ACTS OF PENANCE

The Bishops of the United States prescribe, as minimal obligation, that all persons who are fourteen years of age and older are bound to abstain from eating meat on Ash Wednesday, on all the Fridays of Lent and Good Friday. Further, all persons eighteen years of age and older, up to and including their fiftyninth birthday, are bound to fast by limiting themselves to a single full meal on Ash Wednesday and on Good Friday, while the other two meals on those days are to be light.

All the faithful are encouraged, when possible, to participate at Mass and to receive the Holy Eucharist daily, to celebrate frequently the Sacrament of Penance, to undertake spiritual reading, especially the study of the Sacred Scriptures, and to participate in parish Lenten devotions as well as Lenten education programs. Adoration of the Blessed Sacrament is especially recommended.

LITURGICAL SERVICES

ASH WEDNESDAY, FEBRUARY 22ND:

Mass will be celebrated at 6:30 am; 12:10 pm and 7:00 pm.
Ashes (symbol of our repentance) will be blessed and distributed within all Masses.

WEEKDAY MASSES:

Monday through Friday at 7:30 am; Saturday at 8:00 am.

EUCHARISTIC ADORATION AND BENEDICTION:

As it does throughout the year, Eucharistic Adoration will take place each Friday immediately following the 7:30 am Mass. Adoration will conclude at 5:00 pm.

STATIONS OF THE CROSS:

Place yourself (in spirit) beside our Savior as He journeys to Calvary. Stations of the Cross will be held each Friday in Lent at 7:00 pm (except March 10th due to scheduled practice sessions for Confirmation).

OUTDOOR STATIONS OF THE CROSS:

On **Tuesday, April 4th, at 7:00 pm all are welcome** to pray the Stations outdoors. We will be gathering at the marble statue of Jesus in the Garden of Gethsemane. The statue is located next to the old pump house. (This devotion will be coordinated by the Boy Scouts of local Troop #547 and members of our St. Francis Ecology Council.)

SACRAMENT OF RECONCILIATION

Confessions are heard on the **Wednesdays** of Lent (except Ash Wednesday) from 7:00 to 8:00 pm, on **Saturdays** from 4:00 to 4:45 pm, and on **Sundays** immediately following the 9:30 am Mass. As always, our parish priests are available for confession by appointment.

LENTEN DAY OF REFLECTION

The day is scheduled for **Thursday**, **March 9**th, 11:00 am to 2:00 pm in Redeemer Hall and the main church. The topic will be "**The Redemptive Power of Suffering**" presented by Deacon Mario Mirabelli, MMR's Director of Parish Services. The cost is \$20. A boxed lunch is included. All are welcome.

FRIDAY FISH FRY

On the Fridays of Lent, as you know, we are required to abstain from eating meat. On **Friday**, **March 31**st, from 5:30 to 8:00 pm, a DINE-IN or TAKE-OUT dinner will be held. This is a much-needed fundraiser to support the charitable works of the Knights of Columbus/Council #13126. Please keep an eye on the parish bulletin and other forms of parish communication for details regarding the menu, prices, and the purchasing of tickets.

OPERATION RICE BOWL

Operation Rice Bowl focuses on the major Lenten themes: prayer, almsgiving, fasting and a renewed solidarity with the poor of the world. The format is simple. On one evening of each week of Lent, families eat a light, low-cost meal. Before and after the supper, they give thanks for their blessings and pray for the hungry of the world. Money saved by eating a simple meal instead of a regular dinner is placed in a "rice bowl" on the dinner table. Cardboard "rice bowls" are available on tables in the narthex. A large basket will be in place at the Holy Family shrine throughout the Lenten season to receive your donations. A percentage of your contributions will feed the hungry here in the Archdiocese; the rest will be distributed to the poor around the world.




O St. Bakhita, assist all those who are trapped in a state of slavery; Intercede with God on their behalf so that they will be released from their chains of captivity.

CRS Spotlight

On February 6th, a 7.8 magnitude earthquake devastated large areas of central Turkey and northwest Syria. Later that day, the region experienced a second 7.7 magnitude quake. The death toll has surpassed 35,000 and continues to climb. The earthquake is the worst to strike Turkey this century. Across affected areas in both countries, apartment buildings and schools have been leveled. For Syrians, the damage took place in areas already devastated by years of war. In Turkey, the airports and the high roads of Anatolia are closed and most hospitals are unusable. Schools are closed across the country.

Catholic Relief Services will support emergency relief efforts led by local partners in both Syria and Turkey. Already in Turkey, Caritas Internationalis, in coordination with authorities, is bringing displaced people to safe, open spaces and distributing hot meals and clothing. 


