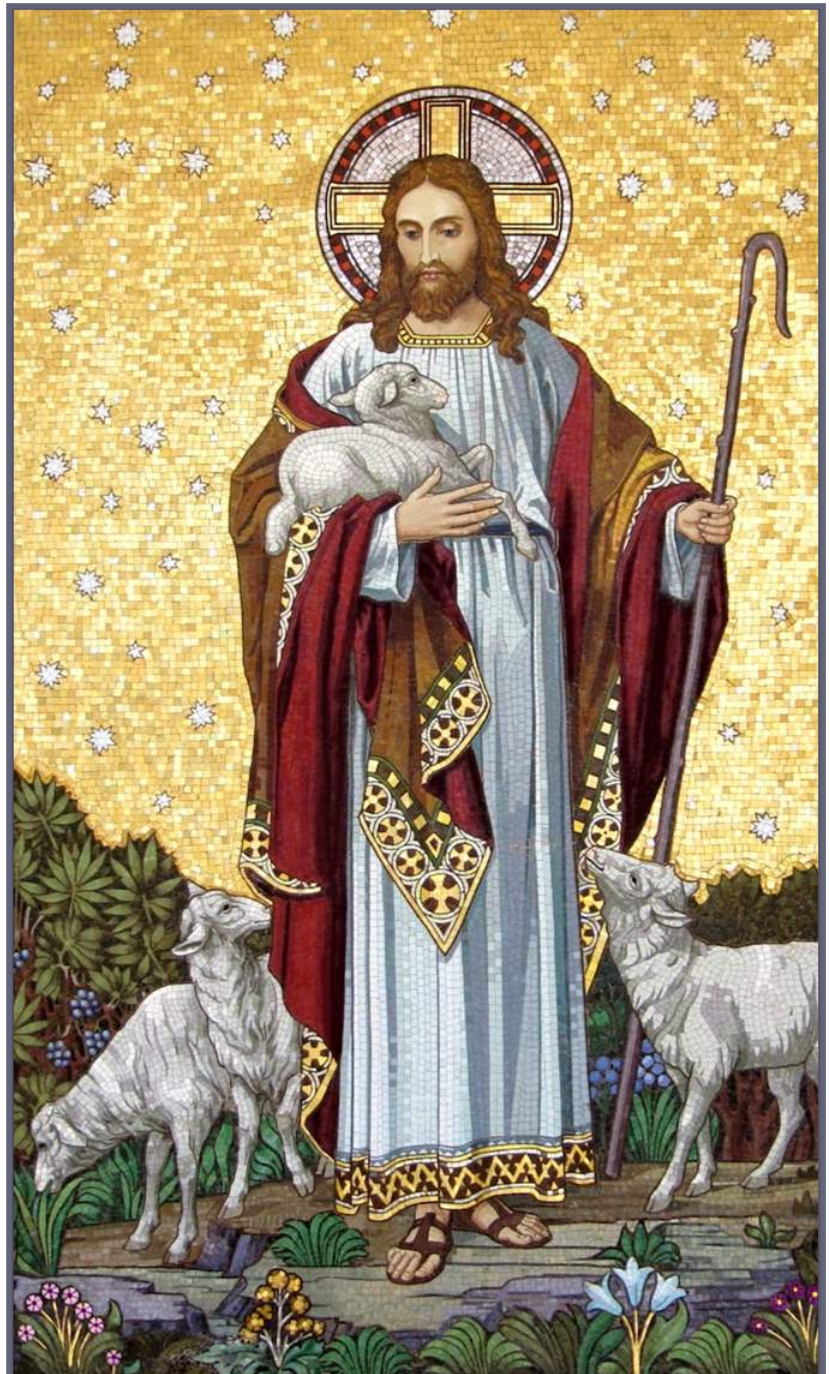

Sacraments

The Sacrament of Baptism is administered **most** Sundays after the 11:30 am Mass. **Arrangements must be made in advance by calling the Parish Office.** First time parents are required to attend a Pre-Jordan class before the baptism. They are held the second Tuesday of every month at 7:00 pm. Pre-registration is required, visit the Parish website to register online: <https://mmredeemer.org/baptism>.

The Sacrament of Reconciliation is offered every Saturday, 4:00 to 4:45 pm; Mondays, 6:00 to 7:00 pm; and anytime by appointment.

The Sacrament of Marriage may be scheduled by contacting the Parish Office. The couple must contact the church at least 6 months before a planned wedding date. No other arrangements should be made until the couple meets with a Parish Priest and the date and time are confirmed. One party must be a member of the parish. Attendance at a Marriage Preparation program is required in accordance with Archdiocesan policy.

Anointing of the Sick is available to the dying and those who are elderly, sick, or preparing for surgery. Please contact the Parish Office.

Communion Calls are made monthly by Clergy and weekly by Extraordinary Ministers of Holy Communion. To place a homebound individual on the Communion Call list, call the Parish Office.

New Registrations

Welcome new parishioners! You may call the Parish Office at 215-362-7400 to make an appointment to register. In order to receive the sacraments of Baptism, Confirmation and Marriage, or to obtain Letters of Eligibility for sponsorship at Baptism or Confirmation, you must be a registered parishioner. Also, children who turn 26 years of age, or complete higher education and continue to reside within our area, should register individually as parishioners.

From Our Pastor



Dear Parishioners,

I want to thank all of you who participated in the feasibility study conducted by The Steier Group, and for those of you who reached out to me personally about the proposed church renovation.

After many hours of discussion with parishioners, reflection, and a lot of prayer, I have come to a decision.

Although I think that a beautiful vision was proposed for what the inside of our church could look like, and many parishioners are supportive, it is clear that a significant percentage of the parish is not in favor of the proposed changes.

For this reason, I have decided that we will not pursue any significant renovation to the church sanctuary, and instead we will address only the maintenance and safety issues for which there is widespread agreement.

We will look into a capital campaign to address the maintenance issues (i.e., replacing all of the kneelers on the existing pews, replacing the existing carpet with a more long lasting material, new lighting and an upgraded sound system) and the safety issues (i.e., adding more railings in the sanctuary and exploring the possibility of removing a level between the altar and tabernacle without otherwise changing the structure).

If at some point in the future the parish were to consider a more complete renovation to the sanctuary, we will be required by the Archdiocese to move the location of the choir so that the space conforms to the Church's liturgical norms.

Two writers influenced my discernment: Pope Benedict XVI and Saint Ignatius of Antioch. In *Jesus of Nazareth, The Holy Week Volume*, Pope Benedict reflects on why the Risen Lord did not make Himself present to everyone instead of to only a handful of chosen disciples, and why they did not recognize Him immediately. Benedict notes that God does not work that way: to overwhelm people with the force of His power. Instead, God acts gently. He proposes but does not impose His will.

I think it must be the same way with me as your pastor. I want to lead by being a gentle Shepherd, and not one who tries to force something on parishioners when a number of them would be turned away from the church.

Saint Ignatius of Antioch, who died around the year 100 AD, wrote a series of letters on his way from the East to Rome to be martyred. In his *Letter to the Ephesians*, he describes the Church as a symphony, with the Bishop surrounded by his priests and deacons, and all of the baptized, together singing in harmony the song of Jesus Christ. As pastor, I also want to be a source of unity for our parish, and not a lightning rod for division.

I am grateful to all of you for your support and all that you do for the parish.

May God bless you and Mary keep you.

The 10:10 Challenge

Discipleship Practice of the Week

Week 9 – Entrust Your Life to Jesus

Trust is among the most important elements of any relationship. When we trust someone, we can be ourselves around them, open and honest. We can delight in their company, learn from them, and collaborate in effective ways. Consider the ultimate discipleship challenge: to entrust your life completely to Jesus. Jesus compels a choice. Is he who he said he was or not? Is he, or is he not, the Alpha and Omega, the Lamb of God, the King of kings, the Savior of the world? Do we aspire to trust him with everything or not? Do we choose to seek and find our life's meaning and sustenance in him, or to look elsewhere? The call to trust Jesus with all our hearts beckons us daily. We can practice entrusting small matters to Jesus as we grow in the ability to entrust large matters to his care and guidance.

Act of Trust and Commitment: Turn to the Lord often, recommitting your life to Jesus and asking for the grace to entrust more and more of your life to him. This God who “first loved us” (1 John 4:19) never ceases to come to our aid and to sustain us with his grace.

EXAMINE: What do you need to invite the Lord into in greater surrender, trust, and commitment?

- PAST** Regrets, Shame, Anger, Grudges, Unforgiveness, Injustices suffered, “If only”
- PRESENT** Painful circumstances, A particular sin, vice, attachment, Doubts, Envy, Difficulties with marriage, divorce, family, Finances
- FUTURE** Fears, worries, Tightly held plans, Vocational uncertainty, Financial security, Unknowns, Eternity

PRAY: Present what you need to surrender to God by saying a prayer of surrender, trust, and commitment. Use one of the following suggestions or create your own. 1) “O Jesus, I surrender myself to you, take care of everything!” 2) “Jesus, I trust in you.” 3) “The Lord is my shepherd; there is nothing I lack” (Psalm 23:1). 4) St. Ignatius’ *Suscipe* prayer or simply, “Take, Lord, and receive _____.” 5) Visualize placing what you want to entrust to Jesus at the foot of the cross.
