### **Ongoing Formation:**

**Brother Joseph** gave a **presentation** regarding his love for the **homeless**:

Br Joseph initially worked with Mary Jo Copeland at Caring and Sharing Hands ministry. In 1993, the first mission house began in North Minneapolis. Br Joseph would look for the homeless along the railroad tracks. After his accident, Janet Lewer (now Clare) invited him to staff a house for the homeless in Minneapolis. The priest at Our Lady of Guadalupe on the West side of Saint Paul gave the brothers a room in the school from which they served the homeless - until a week ago.

### "MUTUAL INVITATION"

CALLED BY NAME TO SHARE

A Fraternity may use a modified form of the Mutual Invitation form of sharing so all its members have a chance to share their thoughts in a safe and non-threatening environment.

- 1. The Leader begins the reading or a question, and then calls a member by name to share.
  - a. The member called has 3 choices.
    - i. Share
    - ii. Pass for now not ready to share, but will have a chance to share at the end of all the sharing.
    - iii. Pass-does not care to share.
  - b. The member sharing then calls the next member to share by name.
  - c. This continues until all members have been called and all those members who have "passed for now" have been called on again.
- 2. No one can share twice until all members have shared.

### A FRANCISCAN THANKSGIVING

Two years before he died, in the Fall of 1224, St. Francis received the Stigmata on Mount La Verna (100 miles N. of Assisi in the Apennines Mountains). He suffered constantly with great pain in his hands, feet, and side. Yet his soul was overflowing with happiness and serenity. Because in this suffering Francis experienced God's incredible love, and assurance of salvation. He wrote the following Litany to express the fullness of his joy, thanks, and praise, his Magnificat.

### The MAGNIFICAT of the stigmatized POVERELLO

You are the Holy one, the Lord.

You alone are God. You alone do wonders.

You are mighty and great.

You are the Most High.

You are King omnipotent, O Holy Father, King of Heaven and

You are three and one, the Lord God, every good.

You are good, every good, the highest good, the Lord God, living and true.

You are charity and love.

You are wisdom, humility, patience, tranquility, happiness and joy. You are justice, temperance and all-sufficient riches.

You are beauty and mildness.

You are our protector, defender, and guardian. You are our strength and our refreshment.

You are our faith, hope, charity, and our infinite sweetness. You are our life eternal, Lord wonderful and great; God omnipotent, Savior most merciful!

### THE CANTICLE OF THE SUN

St. Francis wrote the Canticle of the Sun during the last year of his life during the winter of 1225 at San Damiano. He was in poor health, blind, had severe physical pain, despair, and was tormented by rats. St. Francis learned by the grace of God that suffering is beautiful, fruitful, and blessed (redemptive) when freely accepted and assures a place in the Kingdom of Heaven. So, in his joy of suffering Francis composed the final song-poem of his life. It was an out pouring of love, praise, and thanksgiving to God and Christ the Savior that he loved so much with his heart and soul. Then, just before he died, in Oct., 1226, he added the final verse about Sister Death.

To You alone, Most High, do they belong, And no man is worthy to mention You. (Refrain)

Be praised, my Lord, with all Your creatures,

Who is daylight, and by him You shed light on us.

Be praised, my Lord for Sister Moon and the Stars. In heaven, You have formed them clear and bright and fair. (Ref)

Be praised, my Lord, for Brother Wind

And for air and cloud and clear and all weather,

By which You give your creatures nourishment. (Refrain)

Be praised, my Lord, for Sister Water,

For she is very useful, humble, precious and pure. (Refrain)

Be praised, my Lord, for Brother Fire,

By whom You light up the night,

For the fair and merry and mighty and strong. (Refrain)

Be praised, my Lord, for our Sister Mother Earth,

Who sustains and rules us

And produces varied fruits with many-colored flowers and plants. (Refrain)

Be praised, my Lord, for those who grant pardon for love of You, And bear sickness and tribulation.

Blessed are they who shall bear them in peace,

For by You, Most High, they shall be crowned. (Refrain)

Be praised my Lord, for our Sister Bodily Death,

From whom no living man can escape.

Woe to those who die in mortal sin.

Blessed are they whom death will find in Your most holy will,

For the second death shall not harm them. (Refrain)

### PRAY THE RULE by Liam McCarthy, OFM

O Lord, our God, we intend to make present the charism of our Seraphic Father Francis in the life and mission of the Church, in various ways and forms but in life-giving union with one another. By our profession, we pledge ourselves to live the Gospel in the manner of St Francis by means of our Rule approved by the Church (Arts. 1-3). Help us, we pray, so that daily we may:

- \* observe the gospel of our Lord Jesus Christ by following the example of St Francis, going from gospel to life and from life to the gospel (Art 4):
- \* seek to encounter the living and active person of Jesus Christ in our brothers and sisters, in sacred scripture, in the Church and in the Eucharist (Art 5);
- \* go forth as witnesses and instruments of the Church's mission among people, proclaiming Christ by our life and words (Art 6);
- \* conform our thoughts and deeds to those of Christ by the radical interior change which the Gospel calls "conversion", making use of the sacrament of reconciliation on the way to renewal (Art 7);
- \* let prayer and contemplation be the soul of all we are and do (Art 8);
- \* imitate the Virgin Mary's complete self-giving in her openness to your every word and call (Art 9);
- \* faithfully fulfill the duties proper to our various circumstances in life (Art 10);
- \* seek the proper spirit of detachment and purify our hearts from every tendency and yearning for possession and power (Art 11);
- \* acquire the purity of heart needed to set ourselves free to love God and our brothers and sisters (Art 12);

- \* accept all people as your gift, Lord, and an image of Christ (Art 13);
- \* exercise our responsibilities competently in the Christian spirit of service (Art 14);
- \* be in the forefront of promoting justice by the testimony of our human lives and by courageous initiatives (Art 15);
- \* esteem work both as a gift and as a sharing in the creation, redemption and service of the human community;
- \* cultivate the Franciscan spirit of peace, fidelity and respect for life in our families, striving to make it a sign of a world already renewed in Christ;
- \* respect all creatures, animate and inanimate "as bearing the imprint of the Most High". (Art 18);
- \* be bearers of peace and messengers of perfect joy in every circumstance, as immersed in the resurrection of Christ, we serenely tend towards Sister Death and our ultimate encounter with you, our Father (Art 19).

All this we ask through Jesus Christ, our Lord and Brother. Amen.

### Prayer to St. Francis for Fidelity to the Rule

Holy father, loving and most beloved St. Francis, I beseech you by the holy wounds of our Lord Jesus Christ, which were imprinted on your body, assist me to govern the five senses of my body according to the will and pleasure of almighty God. Intercede for me, so that I may be most faithful in the observance of your Rule of Penance. Obtain for me contrition and devotion, faith, hope, and charity, patience, and purity of body and soul, together with the grace of persevering in the service of our Lord; so that after this life I may merit to come to you, and with you to enjoy eternal happiness, which I hope through your intercession to obtain from Christ our Lord. Amen

Each year, a child from Upper Austria fetches the light from the grotto in Bethlehem where Jesus was born. The light is carried in two blast proof miners' lamps on an Austrian Airlines jet from Tel Aviv Israel to Vienna, Austria from where it is distributed at a Service of Dedication to delegations from across Europe who take it back, with a message of Peace, to their own countries. Austrian Airlines then flies the miners lamps containing the Peace Light from Bethlehem to New York City. The goal of this web site <a href="http://peacelight.org/about/default.html">http://peacelight.org/about/default.html</a> is to help the light spread like the branches of a huge tree rooted in New York and spreading across the continent.

# **First Sunday of Advent**

### Reading 1

IS 63:16B-17, 19B; 64:2-7

You, LORD, are our father,

our redeemer you are named forever.

Why do you let us wander, O LORD, from your ways, and harden our hearts so that we fear you not?

Return for the sake of your servants,

the tribes of your heritage.
