The Epiphany of the Lord

Reading 1 IS 60:1-6

Rise up in splendor, Jerusalem! Your light has come, the glory of the Lord shines upon you. See, darkness covers the earth, and thick clouds cover the peoples; but upon you the LORD shines, and over you appears his glory. Nations shall walk by your light, and kings by your shining radiance. Raise your eyes and look about; they all gather and come to you: your sons come from afar, and your daughters in the arms of their nurses. Then you shall be radiant at what you see, your heart shall throb and overflow, for the riches of the sea shall be emptied out before you, the wealth of nations shall be brought to you. Caravans of camels shall fill you, dromedaries from Midian and Ephah; all from Sheba shall come bearing gold and frankincense, and proclaiming the praises of the LORD.

Gospel MT 2:1-12

When Jesus was born in Bethlehem of Judea, in the days of King Herod, behold, magi from the east arrived in Jerusalem, saying, "Where is the newborn king of the Jews? We saw his star at its rising and have come to do him homage." When King Herod heard this, he was greatly troubled, and all Jerusalem with him. Assembling all the chief priests and the scribes of the people, He inquired of them where the Christ was to be born. They said to him, "In Bethlehem of Judea, for thus it has been written through the prophet: And you, Bethlehem, land of Judah, are by no means least among the rulers of Judah; since from you shall come a ruler, who is to shepherd my people Israel." Then Herod called the magi secretly and ascertained from them the time of the star's appearance. He sent them to Bethlehem and said, "Go and search diligently for the child. When you have found him, bring me word, that I too may go and do him homage." After their audience with the king they set out. And behold, the star that they had seen at its rising preceded them, until it came and stopped over the place where the child was. They were overjoyed at seeing the star, and on entering the house they saw the child with Mary his mother. They prostrated themselves and did him homage. Then they opened their treasures and offered him gifts of gold, frankincense, and myrrh. And having been warned in a dream not to return to Herod, they departed for their country by another way.

THE PERFECT JOY OF ST. FRANCIS-CHP. 14, THE SINGING WOUNDS, pg. 246-257 Study Questions for 1/3/20 OFS Fraternity Meeting

In Chapter 13, Francis knew he wasn't going to live much longer, so he travels with 6 Brothers (Bros. Leo. Angelo, Masseo, Silvester, Rufino, Bonizio) in August, to the tiny hermitage on Mount LaVerna, to seek intense solitude and to commune with God. In an effort to seek total solitude, he meditates on a small rocky area across a 300 ft. chasm for several days. There Francis experiences great physical, emotional, and mental torment and suffering from the devil, incredible experiences of divine joy and ecstasy with angelic visitors. He receives two divine messages that God was going to do great things on this mountain that He had never done to anyone before, and that Francis was going to experience the suffering and torment of Christ's Passion. He accepted the suffering to be like Christ before death in order to feel God's love in his soul and body. Finally Francis receives the greatest miracle of all, he was pierced by the 5 wounds of Christ (the Stigmata) from a six winged Seraphim with the face of Jesus.

In Chapter 14, Bleeding and suffering in pain from the Stigmata, Francis is brought down from Mt. LaVerna, which he will never see again and very slowly travels 71.6 miles back to Our Lady of the Angels in Assisi. He arrives in mid-November struggling with his suffering, exhausted, weak, half blind, in constant pain, unable to walk, and poor in spirit. So, he spends a month recuperating in a small hut at San Domiano under the care of St. Clare. Under her care, his spirit is renewed and his health improved. He rejoices in his suffering expressing it through singing with the Canticle of the Sun, which he then shares with the world around him on his journey to Rieti for medical care.

- 4. Why was Clare so important to Frances spiritually and what divine message did he receive while at San Damiano about his suffering? Pg. 251-253. Have you ever received divine messages while in deep meditation?
- 5. What inspired the Canticle of the Sun, and how did Francis and Clare use it? Pg.253-256.
- 6. While accepting medical care in Rieti, why did Frances cry a lot, and what was his definition of tears? Pg. 256-257.
- 7. Why were Cardinal Ugolino's doctors unable to help Francis medically? Pg. 255-257.
