Franciscan of the Month

Mary of the Passion (1839-1904) came from a distinguished French family in Nantes. In 1860, she joined the Poor Clares but poor health forced her to leave them a year later. In 1864, she joined the Sisters of Mary Reparatrix and worked in missions of India from 1865 to 1876. She established the Franciscan Missionaries of Mary in 1882 when she adopted the Third Order Rule. They remain an order active in missionary work. She once said: "I wish I had two lives: one with which I could always pray, the other, with which to perform all the duties God imposes on me" The cause for her beautification has been introduced in Rome.


