THE SACRAMENT OF RECONCILIATION

Confessions are heard on Saturday afternoon from 4:00 to 5:00 PM and anytime upon reasonable request.

THE SACRAMENT OF BAPTISM

First and third Sundays at 1:00 PM. Expectant parents may contact the parish office to arrange for the baptism seminar at 7:30 PM on the first Monday of the month to help them understand the beauty and responsibilities of the sacrament. Adults are baptized and confirmed at the Easter Vigil after completing the stages of the Rite of Christian Initiation.

THE SACRAMENT OF MATRIMONY

Since Catholic marriage requires a time of preparation, arrangements should begin at least six months before the proposed date of the wedding to allow for the Marriage Preparation Program and Natural Family Planning (NFP). Registered, participating and contributing parishioners may contact the parish office to begin the process.

PASTORAL CARE OF THE SICK

If you are planning to enter the hospital for surgery, experiencing a prolonged or serious illness, or are very weak due to advancement of age, call the parish office to arrange for the sacraments of reconciliation, communion and anointing at home, also available every Saturday morning at 9:00 AM Mass. Communal anointing of the sick is celebrated at Mass each April and October. Notify us or the Catholic chaplain at Good Samaritan, Helen Hayes and Nyack of any hospitalization so that we may be of assistance. Be sure to tell the admitting office that you are a Catholic patient and a member of St. Gregory Barbarigo parish.

PERPETUAL EUCHARISTIC ADORATION CHAPEL is open all day and night for Eucharistic adoration and is located at the south end of the campus on Cinder Road in front of the parish house. Parishioners and friends are encouraged to become adorers or to stop in and spend some time in quiet prayer with the Lord.

ANNIVERSARY OF THE DEDICATION OF THE CATHEDRAL The worship space that houses the archbishop's *cathedra* (chair) is more than a grand place for ceremonies. It is also the archbishop's church, the sign and place of his pastoral care and leadership – a sign of diocesan unity. Reverence and esteem for Saint Patrick's Cathedral are supported by the ancient practice of observing its 105th anniversary of dedication on Monday, October 5. It links the parishes as a communion of communities around the archbishop.

Join pro-life Catholics for this legal, peaceful and prayerful witness that abortion is wrong. The fight to save the life of the unborn cannot be successful without the support of those who help wherever they can. The archdiocese has designated October as RESPECT LIFE MONTH.

OFF THE TOP OF MY HEAD

As we move into the month of October, the church has set aside these special 30 days for us to pray for and think about and work toward a respect for human life. We have an obligation to promote the gift that God has given to us. Pope Francis reminded us of this sacred duty. Look through this bulletin for the activities that are listed here: the annual life chain, forty days for life, yesterday's blessing of animals and the upcoming Mass for the anointing of the sick. Each one helps to remind us of the dignity that each of God's creatures possesses. In one way or another, make this an important part of your prayer and activity this month.

Cardinal Dolan is in Rome now for the XIV Ordinary General Assembly of the Synod of Bishops. The ongoing work of the synod is intended to be a rethinking with renewed freshness and enthusiasm of what revelation, transmitted in the Church's faith, tells us about the beauty, the role and the dignity of the family. It will take place for three weeks beginning today and will have the theme, "*The Vocation and Mission of the Family in the Church and in the Contemporary World*". May the Holy Father and the bishops and laity he has called together be blessed during their discussions.

On Saturday, we will mark eleven years since the opening of the perpetual Eucharistic adoration chapel in the oratory of the parish house. Hundreds of thousands of people have knelt in silent adoration of the Eucharistic Lord. God has certainly blessed us and many will admit that their lives have been changed by this powerful devotion.

I want to express my thanks, as I try to do every year to the men and women of the CYO Basketball program of St. Gregory Barbarigo. Many of these adults spend a great deal of time and work very hard to provide our young parishioners, as well as children who do not belong to our parish, with many opportunities to enjoy themselves, play sports and learn teamwork and sportsmanship. In both CYO and intramurals, we traditionally have more than 40 teams and 400+ players. Registration fees pay for uniforms, insurance, equipment, league entry fees, umpire and referee fees and maintaining the heating, lighting, cleaning and repair of the building. Thank you Mary Corretjer, Tom O'Grady, Charlie Arduini and those adults and teenagers who do so much to help our parish to benefit so many young people and their families.
