THE SACRAMENT OF RECONCILIATION

Confessions are heard on Saturday afternoon from 4:00 to 5:00 PM and anytime upon reasonable request.

THE SACRAMENT OF BAPTISM

First and third Sundays at 1:00 PM. Expectant parents may contact the parish office to arrange for the baptism seminar at 7:30 PM on the first Monday of the month to help them understand the beauty and responsibilities of the sacrament. Adults are baptized and confirmed at the Easter Vigil after completing the stages of the Rite of Christian Initiation.

THE SACRAMENT OF MATRIMONY

Since Catholic marriage requires a time of preparation, arrangements should begin at least six months before the proposed date of the wedding to allow for the Marriage Preparation Program and Natural Family Planning (NFP). Registered, participating and contributing parishioners may contact the parish office to begin the process.

PASTORAL CARE OF THE SICK

If you are planning to enter the hospital for surgery, experiencing a prolonged or serious illness, or are very weak due to advancement of age, call the parish office to arrange for the sacraments of reconciliation, communion and anointing at home, also available every Saturday morning at 9:00 AM Mass. Communal anointing of the sick is celebrated at Mass each April and October. Notify us or the Catholic chaplain at Good Samaritan, Helen Hayes and Nyack of any hospitalization so that we may be of assistance. Be sure to tell the admitting office that you are a Catholic patient and a member of St. Gregory Barbarigo parish.

PERPETUAL EUCHARISTIC ADORATION CHAPEL is open all day and night for Eucharistic adoration and is located at the south end of the campus on Cinder Road in front of the parish house. Parishioners and friends are encouraged to become adorers or to stop in and spend some time in quiet prayer with the Lord.

OFF THE TOP OF MY HEAD

am just back from the annual convention of pastors which is held in Spring Lake, New Jersey. It is always a good week with plenty of new information to learn and plenty of old friends to see. I have been attending since 1991.

Next Sunday, I will include a letter and schedule for the annual parish mission. Many people remember when these missions scared the daylights our of people. Sins seemed much more important than virtue, and hell had it all over heaven as far as sermons were concerned. Remember? You all know that the parish mission has a new look. There is more time to think, pray and the emphasis is on a more personal impact in your life. The mission begins on Monday, November 16 and will be conducted by Monsignor Dermot Brennan. Although I sent a FlockNote, I include this reminder today.

Yesterday, I marked the 34th anniversary of my priesthood ordination in 1981. Thanks to so many who sent cards and good wishes. It hasn't always been easy, but it has been a terrific way to spend a lifetime. Our friend, Christian Amah, who worked with us during the summers of 2013 and 2014 moves closer to his own priesthood. On Saturday, at St. Joseph's Seminary, he and his nine classmates will be ordained as transitional deacons, which means that they are in the stage between laymen and priest. With God's help, Christian will be ordained to the priesthood at the end of May. I invited Christian to come back to St. Gregory next Sunday and to assist and preach the homily at the 9:00 and 10:30 Masses. After each Mass, we will have a reception in the narthex where you will be able to wish him well. On the following Sunday, he will return again to officiate at his first baptisms. In addition, he may preside at weddings, and Christian burials apart from Mass, distribute the Eucharist, expose the Blessed Sacrament and give a Eucharistic blessing. In my day, I spend an entire year as a deacon at St. Boniface in Wesley Hills and it was a terrific experience. Monsignor Weber was assigned to St. Catharine in Blauvelt. Today, seminarian deacons are sent to parishes only on weekends and one has been assigned to us (but it is not Christian). Anyway, we will welcome him home next Sunday

Today is the solemnity of All Saints and it commemorates all those who have attained the beatific vision in heaven. It is a holy day of obligation whenever it falls on Tuesday, Wednesday, Thursday or Friday. Since Sunday is already of a day of precept, we kill two birds today. Since we all hope to attain our heavenly reward one day, I say, "Happy Feast Day."

ACCLAMATION BEFORE THE GOSPEL While singing the acclamation of praise before the Gospel, remember to allow the cantor to intone it first before joining in. Then, the congregation repeats the *alleluia* as we stand to welcome and greet the Lord who is about to speak to us in the Gospel. The verse is sung by the cantor; and the faithful repeat the *alleluia* once again. This little reminder helps us to be in conformity with the mind of the church.
