THE SACRAMENT OF RECONCILIATION

Confessions are heard on Saturday afternoon from 4:00 to 5:00 PM and anytime upon reasonable request.

THE SACRAMENT OF BAPTISM

First and third Sundays at 1:00 PM. Expectant parents may contact the parish office to arrange for the baptism seminar at 7:30 PM on the first Monday of the month to help them understand the beauty and responsibilities of the sacrament. Adults are baptized and confirmed at the Easter Vigil after completing the stages of the Rite of Christian Initiation.

THE SACRAMENT OF MATRIMONY

Since Catholic marriage requires a time of preparation, arrangements should begin at least six months before the proposed date of the wedding to allow for the Marriage Preparation Program and Natural Family Planning (NFP). Registered, participating and contributing parishioners may contact the parish office to begin the process.

PASTORAL CARE OF THE SICK

If you are planning to enter the hospital for surgery, experiencing a prolonged or serious illness, or are very weak due to advancement of age, call the parish office to arrange for the sacraments of reconciliation, communion and anointing at home, also available every Saturday morning at 9:00 AM Mass. Communal anointing of the sick is celebrated at Mass each April and October. Notify us or the Catholic chaplain at Good Samaritan, Helen Hayes and Nyack of any hospitalization so that we may be of assistance. Be sure to tell the admitting office that you are a Catholic patient and a member of St. Gregory Barbarigo parish.

PERPETUAL EUCHARISTIC ADORATION CHAPEL is open all day and night for Eucharistic adoration and is located at the south end of the campus on Cinder Road in front of the parish house. Parishioners and friends are encouraged to become adorers or to stop in and spend some time in quiet prayer with the Lord.

OFF THE TOP OF MY HEAD

here is an old rabbinic story about a faithful Jew who every morning would write down on a piece of paper the words *I am but dust and ashes* and place the paper in his pocket. Throughout the day he would take out the paper and read it: the words, spoken by Abraham in the Book of Genesis (18:27) served as a prayerful reminder of his unworthiness and humility before God. One day, he showed the paper to his rabbi who took out a second piece of paper and wrote the Hebrew words *Bishvili Novra haslam* – "For my sake, the universe was created. "Take these words, as well, and carry them too," the rabbi said. "Let there be balance in your life. Realize that of yourself, before God, you are nothing – but because you are created in God's image, out of love, you possess the greatest dignity imaginable: you are a child of God."

Our Lenten desert experience is a time for striking that balance between realizing our humility before God and our identity as God's beloved. When we are consumed by the notion that we are in total control of our lives, when we have arrogantly self-absorbed because of what we possess and what we have achieved, we should take out the first piece of "paper" and remember: *I am but dust and ashes*. But when we feel abandoned, when hope seems far away, when we feel lost in the Lenten wilderness, we need to embrace the message of the second sheet: For my sake, God created the universe. I am God's beloved; I am created in God's image. May these next six weeks before Easter be a time for striking that balance in our lives: a balance between humility that leads to selflessness and joy in the ever-present love of God Father Lamorte among us.

BE WITH ME, LORD It's hard to think of a practice more beneficial than daily Mass. May we urge you to join those who come faithfully to our beautiful church to celebrate Eucharist at 7:30 and 9:00? You will find the half hour you give to Mass each day most rewarding. Every morning, people are welcome to meet in silence and quiet prayer before the 7:30 Mass. Our common reflective silence and meditation prepares us to hear God's voice in the liturgy. Are you coming to 9:00 Mass? Why not join us for Morning Prayer at 8:45? This is the official prayer of the church and is said all over the world. The Rosary is recited each morning at 9:30 in front of the statue of Mary. Remember, too, that the chapel is always open, every day and night for your personal prayer.

As we recite the Apostles' Creed, it will stir up in our hearts our commitment to Christ which was first made at our own baptisms and prepare us to renew our promises this Easter.

MASS OF CHRISM ON TUESDAY, MARCH 22 AT ST. PATRICK'S CATHEDRAL This Mass at 4:00 PM, a tradition which goes all the way back to the fifth century of our church, is only celebrated once a year, during Holy Week. The Mass, which manifests the unity of the priests with their bishop, will be celebrated by our archbishop, Cardinal Dolan, who will be joined by his auxiliary bishops and hundreds of our parish and religious order priests. During the Mass, the cardinal will also bless three sacred oils: the oil of catechumens, the oil of the sick and the sacred chrism. These oils will be used in the administration of the sacraments throughout the entire archdiocese during the upcoming year. The faithful of our Rockland parishes are urged to make attendance at this Mass of the Chrism a special part of their Lenten observance. For your convenience, the Rockland deanery is sponsoring a coach bus and there will be more information in upcoming bulletins.
