THE SACRAMENT OF RECONCILIATION

Confessions are heard on Saturday afternoon from 4:00 to 5:00 PM and anytime upon reasonable request.

THE SACRAMENT OF BAPTISM

First and third Sundays at 1:00 PM. Expectant parents may contact the parish office to arrange for the baptism seminar at 7:30 PM on the first Monday of the month to help them understand the beauty and responsibilities of the sacrament. Adults are baptized and confirmed at the Easter Vigil after completing the stages of the Rite of Christian Initiation.

THE SACRAMENT OF MATRIMONY

Since Catholic marriage requires a time of preparation, arrangements should begin at least six months before the proposed date of the wedding to allow for the Marriage Preparation Program and Natural Family Planning (NFP). Registered, participating and contributing parishioners may contact the parish office to begin the process.

PASTORAL CARE OF THE SICK

If you are planning to enter the hospital for surgery, experiencing a prolonged or serious illness, or are very weak due to advancement of age, call the parish office to arrange for the sacraments of reconciliation, communion and anointing at home, also available every Saturday morning at 9:00 AM Mass. Communal anointing of the sick is celebrated at Mass each April and October. Notify us or the Catholic chaplain at Good Samaritan, Helen Hayes and Nyack of any hospitalization so that we may be of assistance. Be sure to tell the admitting office that you are a Catholic patient and a member of St. Gregory Barbarigo parish.

PERPETUAL EUCHARISTIC ADORATION CHAPEL is open all day and night for Eucharistic adoration and is located at the south end of the campus on Cinder Road in front of the parish house. Parishioners and friends are encouraged to become adorers or to stop in and spend some time in quiet prayer with the Lord.

OFF THE TOP OF MY HEAD

wo simple thoughts to share with you on this Third Sunday of Lent.

Have you noticed that God's holy word at Mass each day speaks to us about prayer? Lent is a classroom of prayer for us; it is a catechism lesson in prayer. Remember how Jesus taught us the Our Father? And the beautiful prayer by Queen Esther? She is at her wits end. She is by herself. Her very survival and that of her people is at risk. She simply says to God, "I have nowhere else to go, dear God and I have heard since I was a child that you will always come through." I don't know about you, but I find it a great consolation when God tells us that we are never, ever alone. That he is always with us and that we should never hesitate to go with Him in times of need. Queen Esther teaches us that. Jesus taught us that. Lent teaches that about prayer.

How many of you were the oldest child in the family? I was the oldest of three and I got a little frustrated when my mom and dad would say to me, "Joseph, you are the oldest and we expect more out of you." They let my younger sister and brother get away with things, but they would say to me, "Not you, you are the oldest." Jesus says that to all of us, doesn't he? We are his chosen ones. We are his disciples. We are his people. He tells us that even though we have seen in the bible "do not murder", he says to us, "don't even get angry. I expect more out of you. You are my followers. I call you to heroic perfection, virtue and sanctity." This is the message of Lent; this is the challenge of Jesus.

THE HOLIEST DAYS OF THE YEAR The three holiest days each year for followers of Jesus are the days of the Easter Triduum. Holy Thursday evening, all day on Good Friday and Holy Saturday, and then the evening into the completion of Easter Sunday. On these days, we pause and try our best to focus our attention on Jesus Christ and on his life-giving death and resurrection for us. Every member of our parish should do his or her best to participate in the liturgies of these holy days. Please check your schedules now and do your best to keep these free for gathering during the liturgies, prayers and reflections. March 24, 25, 26.

THE APOSTLES' CREED Did you notice at Mass today that we used the Apostles' Creed instead of the Nicene Creed. The origins of the Apostles' Creed are believed to predate the Nicene Creed. It is universally recognized by many Christians as a shared statement of our faith in God the Father, Son and Holy Spirit. The church particularly recommends its use during Lent and Easter Time. Why? Because the words of this ancient Creed have been used for centuries as the basis of our baptismal promises, and the seasons of Lent and Easter put a strong focus on baptism. During Lent we prepare those who will be baptized at Easter while readying ourselves to renew our own baptismal promises. As we recite the Apostles' Creed, it will stir up in our hearts our commitment to Christ which was first made at our own baptisms and prepare us to renew our promises this Easter.



THE OFFICE OF TENEBRAE (the name means 'darkness' or 'shadow') is a Holy Week devotion which is characterized by the successive extinguishing of candles as the service progresses. This service originally began before dawn and as the sun rose, fewer candles were needed to light the church. The psalms of matins and lauds are chanted on the mornings of Good Friday and Holy Saturday, along with the Lamentations of Jeremiah the prophet. This is a beautiful, meditative and reflective time which could be a wonderful gift to yourself. On Holy Thursday, Solemn Morning Prayer will be recited. Join us at 10:00 AM on these days.

NEXT WEEK IS COMPASSION SUNDAY The prayers from the Wailing Wall will be removed and placed at the altar for the universal prayer (of the faithful). After Mass, they will be burned as an oblation; they wind their way before God's throne of mercy. Remember to visit the Wailing Wall with your urgent prayer needs.
