THE SACRAMENT OF RECONCILIATION

Confessions are heard on Saturday afternoon from 4:00 to 5:00 PM and anytime upon reasonable request.

THE SACRAMENT OF BAPTISM

First and third Sundays at 1:00 PM. Expectant parents may contact the parish office to arrange for the baptism seminar at 7:30 PM on the first Monday of the month to help them understand the beauty and responsibilities of the sacrament. Adults are baptized and confirmed at the Easter Vigil after completing the stages of the Rite of Christian Initiation.

THE SACRAMENT OF MATRIMONY

Since Catholic marriage requires a time of preparation, arrangements should begin at least six months before the proposed date of the wedding to allow for the Marriage Preparation Program and Natural Family Planning (NFP). Registered, participating and contributing parishioners may contact the parish office to begin the process.

PASTORAL CARE OF THE SICK

If you are planning to enter the hospital for surgery, experiencing a prolonged or serious illness, or are very weak due to advancement of age, call the parish office to arrange for the sacraments of reconciliation, communion and anointing at home, also available every Saturday morning at 9:00 AM Mass. Communal anointing of the sick is celebrated at Mass each April and October. Notify us or the Catholic chaplain at Good Samaritan, Helen Hayes and Nyack of any hospitalization so that we may be of assistance. Be sure to tell the admitting office that you are a Catholic patient and a member of St. Gregory Barbarigo parish.

PERPETUAL EUCHARISTIC ADORATION CHAPEL is open all day and night for Eucharistic adoration and is located at the south end of the campus on Cinder Road in front of the parish house. Parishioners and friends are encouraged to become adorers or to stop in and spend some time in quiet prayer with the Lord.

NATIONAL DAY OF PRAYER is observed on the first Thursday of May each year since 1952 and was designated by the United States Congress. The people of America are asked to turn to God in prayer and meditation. Although its constitutionality is being challenged in court, people of good will and faith are asked to set this day aside to show their dependence upon God.

FIRST MASS FOR FATHER CHRISTIAN will be concelebrated on Sunday, May 29 at 12:30 PM. **(THE NOON MASS WILL BE MOVED TO 12:30 THAT DAY).** If you normally attend Sunday Mass at noon, please be aware of this change. Please know that this first Mass will be about 90 minutes in length. So, if time is a factor for your Sunday worship, you may decide to attend Mass at another time that day.

OFF THE TOP OF MY HEAD

This morning, we have the opportunity to say goodbye to our friend and deacon intern, Jon Tveit. Jon has been assigned to St. Gregory since November when he came to us at the request of the rector to participate in this weekend program. He has enriched the entire parish by his diaconal ministry and this has been an exciting year for him. In addition to presiding over Sunday baptisms, Jon has given us thoughtful, down-to-earth homilies at Mass and assisted at Mass and with the distribution of Holy Communion. Now, for the next four weeks, Jon and his classmates (Christian, Hartley, Thomas, Cruz, Jean-Pierre, James; as well as the friars of the renewal Brothers Antonio, Dismas, Xavier, Innocent and Bernardino) will be finishing up their studies and getting ready for their great day. We will be joining him on his day of ordination at St. Patrick's Cathedral on May 29 at a First Mass sometime in June. After each Mass today, there will be a hospitality reception for Jon in the narthex.

The business of discerning a vocation to the priesthood is very serious indeed. In my case, I first felt the desire when I was only nine years old. I was being influenced by the Dominican Sisters of Sparkill at St. Anthony School in the Northeast Bronx who encouraged me to enter the high school seminary in Manhattan where I first met Father Weber. I was also shaped by my parish priest, Father Anthony Mestice who supported me along the way. My older cousin Richard, whom you met on Holy Thursday was a college seminarian at the time and a role model for me. With all of this, one would think I would have been completely sure. But, after entering Cathedral Prep in 1964, I left in 1965 to think about it more! It would take 12 more years before I would finally be at Dunwoodie and on my way to ordination.

But, back to Jon. He has been a wonderful addition to our staff, and a loyal companion to Monsignor Weber and me at the parish house dinner table. Everyone thinks very highly of him.

So, please stop by the narthex to wish Jon well and assure him of our prayers and presence as we travels down the final road toward Holy Orders. There is still room on our bus, so visit the parish office during the week to pick up your ticket.

FEAST OF THE ASCENSION OF THE LORD will take place on Thursday. It is one of the Church's Holy Day of Obligation for Catholics to attend Mass. The liturgy will be offered at 7:00 AM (for those who must leave early for work), 9:00, 10:00 (attended by the children of the regional school), and 7:30 PM (for those returning from work). The three days before the Ascension were formerly days distinguished for *rogare*, a communal commitment to intense prayer and supplication. Monday, Tuesday and Wednesday were marked by processions through fields and gardens, accompanied by chants and litanies and the sprinkling of Easter's blessed water on behalf of the fruits of the earth. These days culminated in the celebration of the Ascension and led naturally into the "first novena" of prayer in preparation for Pentecost. We enter into this time of prayer for the coming of the Holy Spirit upon our parish. After Mass, two second-graders will crown the image of the Blessed Mother at Our Lady's Shrine. We invite you to pray with us that day. We enjoy having the young people singing and praying with us. Adults, use the seating near the rear of the church that day.

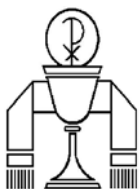
RELIGIOUS EDUCATION It is not too early to begin thinking about fall religious education classes for your children. Registration for 2016-2017 school year has begun and materials have been sent home and should be returned as soon as convenient; but no registrations will be accepted after August 19. Weekly faith formation for children in grades 1 through 8 takes place between September and May and includes preparation for the sacraments of reconciliation, Eucharist and confirmation. Families who worship with us every Sunday, who contribute to the parish offertory (bring your contribution statement with you) receive a discount. Registration for new families will be mailed home by the middle of June. A copy of your child's baptism certificate will be needed. If transferring from another parish, bring a copy of your child's progress report along with the baptism. We especially encourage families with older children, regardless of their previous religious education to call Mr. Donald Ruzzi (429-2775) to discuss placement.

EMBER DAYS For many centuries, the Catholic Church has kept these three days (Wednesday, Friday and Saturday) near the beginning of each season as times of special penance and intercession. They are not presently part of the current church calendar, but it is good to set aside days of fasting, works of charity and prayer. Twelve days after Passover, at sundown on Wednesday, May 4 this year, many Jewish communities keep a day of remembrance, called Yom Hashoah, for the 6 million Jews who perished in the Holocaust. Christians have, at times, joined in this remembrance facing the ways in which anti-Semitism has been and even now continues to be found among us.



CORPUS CHRISTI EUCHARISTIC PROCESSION Please save the date of Sunday, June 19 for our annual Corpus Christi procession immediately following the 12:00 Noon Mass. These were started in parishes throughout the archdiocese during the Jubilee Year of the New Millennium. Come together with your parish family as we process around the Church campus to honor and adore the real presence of our Lord in the Blessed Sacrament. We specifically invite the boys and girls of the First Communion classes to attend Mass at 12:00 in their communion clothes. After the procession, stay with us for a family picnic. Members of the planning committee have suggested that those who attend may bring desserts and the donation of side dishes. The first feast of Corpus Christi was in 1246. Five years later Pope Urban IV made it a feast of the Universal Church. Through Eucharistic Exposition (taking the Blessed Sacrament out of the tabernacle and placing it in a monstrance for adoration) and benediction (meaning "to bless"), we are offering prayers before Christ's presence who is the source of all our blessing.

MONSIGNOR THOMAS J. DARBY SCHOLARSHIP FOUNDATION applications are available at the parish office and are due back to Father by Tuesday, May 31. We have some school families who are having difficulties as they attempt to meet the financial obligations of tuition at the regional school. A memorial scholarship foundation has been established and named after the first pastor of St. Gregory Barbarigo, Monsignor Thomas Darby. Shortly after his arrival in 1961, he founded the parochial school. This is a fitting tribute in his honor. Are you eligible to apply? Do you attend Mass at SGB each Sunday and contribute to the parish offertory? Do you have a continuing financial need? Good attendance, a respectable behavior record, a demonstrated sense of service, identification with the mission of the school, the recommendation of the principal and faculty and the maintenance of a passing grade? Thus, the foundation will continue to preserve the principal and allow us to disburse benefits. It would seek to grow through private and corporate contributions. A gift to this memorial scholarship fund will provide the opportunity for other young people, who demonstrate the Christian characteristics of unselfish love and service, to continue their education at SGB. In addition to the financial assistance provided, it is emotionally uplifting to know that parishioners find our program at St. Gregory Barbarigo worthy of patronage.
