THE SACRAMENT OF RECONCILIATION

Confessions are heard on Saturday afternoon from 4:00 to 5:00 PM and anytime upon reasonable request.

THE SACRAMENT OF BAPTISM

First and third Sundays at 1:00 PM. Expectant parents may contact the parish office to arrange for the baptism seminar at 7:30 PM on the first Monday of the month to help them understand the beauty and responsibilities of the sacrament. Adults are baptized and confirmed at the Easter Vigil after completing the stages of the Rite of Christian Initiation.

THE SACRAMENT OF MATRIMONY

Since Catholic marriage requires a time of preparation, arrangements should begin at least six months before the proposed date of the wedding to allow for the Marriage Preparation Program and Natural Family Planning (NFP). Registered, participating and contributing parishioners may contact the parish office to begin the process.

PASTORAL CARE OF THE SICK

If you are planning to enter the hospital for surgery, experiencing a prolonged or serious illness, or are very weak due to advancement of age, call the parish office to arrange for the sacraments of reconciliation, communion and anointing at home, also available every Saturday morning at 9:00 AM Mass. Communal anointing of the sick is celebrated at Mass each April and October. Notify us or the Catholic chaplain at Good Samaritan, Helen Hayes and Nyack of any hospitalization so that we may be of assistance. Be sure to tell the admitting office that you are a Catholic patient and a member of St. Gregory Barbarigo parish.

PERPETUAL EUCHARISTIC ADORATION CHAPEL is open all day and night for Eucharistic adoration and is located at the south end of the campus on Cinder Road in front of the parish house. Parishioners and friends are encouraged to become adorers or to stop in and spend some time in quiet prayer with the Lord.

OFF THE TOP OF MY HEAD

Remember the mom who taught your second grade religious education class they year your received your First Communion? Now that you are a parent yourself, you understand and appreciate the extraordinary sacrifice of time she had made and her generosity of heart to prepare you and your classmates for your First Communion with such patience, understanding and love. Jesus' prayer in today's gospel is for her.

As you watch your own son or daughter play team sports, you see yourself at their age struggling to make contact with the ball or trying to stop an opposing player who had height and weight – and skill – over you. But there was that one coach who took you under his or her wing, who worked you hard to show you that you could do it. No, you didn't make the pros or get an athletic scholarship to a first-tier school, but you left that team with a confidence and work ethic that you carry to this day. In his Cenacle prayer the night before he died, Jesus blesses that dedicated coach.

Most of us have a favorite aunt or uncle or grandparent. We could talk to them about anything. Their love was unconditional, their support total, and their advice honest. They may have taught us to do things we still cherish: baking an old family recipe, playing guitar, painting in water colors. Our lives have been blessed by the wisdom of their years and the lessons of their experience. At the Last Supper, Jesus gives thanks for their blessing to us and their families.

On the night before he died, Jesus prayed for and exalted all the family members and friends and teachers and coaches and mentors in our lives who have instilled in us the values of the gospel. Jesus addresses his Father in heaven. He begins praying for himself, that he may obediently bring to completion the work of redemption entrusted to him. Next he prays for his disciples gathered with him in the Cenacle, that they may faithfully proclaim the Word he has taught them. Finally, Jesus prays for the Church of the future, those who teach, reveal, and proclaim God's love in our midst, and those of us whose lives have been blessed and enriched by their witness. It is that love of God that binds us together as a Church, that makes us not just as association of good people but a family of faith. Jesus exalts those who strive to create that sense of unity and calls us to work with one another, especially in this wonderful parish.

RELIGIOUS EDUCATION It is not too early to begin thinking about fall religious education classes for your children. Registration for 2016-2017 school year has begun and materials have been sent home and should be returned as soon as convenient; but no registrations will be accepted after August 19. Weekly faith formation for children in grades 1 through 8 takes place between September and May and includes preparation for the sacraments of reconciliation, Eucharist and confirmation. Families who worship with us every Sunday, who contribute to the parish

offertory (bring your contribution statement with you) receive a discount. Registration for new families will be mailed home by the middle of June. A copy of your child's baptism certificate will be needed. If transferring from another parish, bring a copy of your child's progress report along with the baptism. CORPUS CHRISTI EUCHARISTIC PROCESSION Please save the date of Sunday, June 19 for our annual Corpus Christi procession Immediately following the 12:00 Noon Mass. These were started in parishes throughout the archdiocese during the Jubilee Year of the New Millennium. Come together with your parish family as we process around the Church campus to honor and adore the real presence of our Lord in the Blessed Sacrament. We specifically invite the boys and girls of the First Communion classes to attend Mass at 12:00 in their communion clothes. After the

procession, stay with us for a family picnic. Members of the planning committee have suggested that those who attend may bring desserts and the donation of side dishes. The first feast of Corpus Christi was in 1246. Five years later Pope Urban IV made it a feast of the Universal Church. Through Eucharistic Exposition (taking the Blessed Sacrament out of the tabernacle and placing it in a monstrance for adoration) and benediction (meaning "to bless"), we are offering prayers before Christ's presence who Is the source of all our blessing.
