#### THE SACRAMENT OF RECONCILIATION

Confessions are heard on Saturday afternoon at 4:00 PM and anytime upon reasonable request.

#### THE SACRAMENT OF BAPTISM

First and third Sundays at 1:00 PM. Expectant parents may contact the parish office to arrange for the baptism seminar at 7:30 PM on the first Monday of the month to help them understand the beauty and responsibilities of the sacrament. Adults are baptized and confirmed at the Easter Vigil after completing the stages of the Rite of Christian Initiation.

#### THE SACRAMENT OF MATRIMONY

Since Catholic marriage requires a time of preparation, arrangements should begin at least six months before the proposed date of the wedding to allow for the Marriage Preparation Program and Natural Family Planning (NFP). Registered, participating and contributing parishioners may contact the parish office to begin the process.

## PASTORAL CARE OF THE SICK

If you are planning to enter the hospital for surgery, experiencing a prolonged or serious illness, or are very weak due to advancement of age, call the parish office to arrange for the sacraments of reconciliation, communion and anointing at home, also available every Saturday morning at 9:00 AM Mass. Communal anointing of the sick is celebrated at Mass each April and October. Notify us or the Catholic chaplain at Good Samaritan, Helen Hayes and Nyack of any hospitalization so that we may be of assistance. Be sure to tell the admitting office that you are a Catholic patient and a member of St. Gregory Barbarigo parish.

**PERPETUAL EUCHARISTIC ADORATION CHAPEL** is open all day and night for Eucharistic adoration and is located at the south end of the campus on Cinder Road in front of the parish house. Parishioners and friends are encouraged to become adorers or to stop in and spend some time in quiet prayer with the Lord.

ext Sunday marks a very important time, not only in our parish, but across the entire archdiocese. It will be the official kick off of the Cardinal's Annual Stewardship Appeal. There are so many reasons why the appeal has importance, not only to those who are in need, but also to us at SGB. Your support of the appeal helps countless people, and sustains the fabric of our services throughout all of our parishes.

Very shortly, you will be receiving a letter from His Eminence, Cardinal Dolan, along with materials that illustrate the deep importance of the cardinal's appeal to our community. Part of being a steward means living with trust in God's generosity and responsibly tending that which God has entrusted to us. Cardinal Dolan is asking you to participate by making a gift to this important annual initiative.

Your gift to the appeal supports offices, ministries and programs throughout the church that nurture and encourage our journey in faith. It will help educate our children in Catholic schools and in religious education. It provides for retired priests and religious by giving them the retirement care they deserve after decades of service. It helps to educate our future priests and prepare them for a life of service. Couples are requested to have the following documents: updated baptismal certificate and marriage certificate. If there is an annulment required, you'd also need a copy of the divorce decree.
