THE SACRAMENT OF RECONCILIATION

Confessions are heard on Saturday afternoon at 4:00 PM and anytime upon reasonable request.

THE SACRAMENT OF BAPTISM

First and third Sundays at 1:00 PM. Expectant parents may contact the parish office to arrange for the baptism seminar at 7:30 PM on the first Monday of the month to help them understand the beauty and responsibilities of the sacrament. Adults are baptized and confirmed at the Easter Vigil after completing the stages of the Rite of Christian Initiation.

THE SACRAMENT OF MATRIMONY

Since Catholic marriage requires a time of preparation, arrangements should begin at least six months before the proposed date of the wedding to allow for the Marriage Preparation Program and Natural Family Planning (NFP). Registered, participating and contributing parishioners may contact the parish office to begin the process.

PASTORAL CARE OF THE SICK

If you are planning to enter the hospital for surgery, experiencing a prolonged or serious illness, or are very weak due to advancement of age, call the parish office to arrange for the sacraments of reconciliation, communion and anointing at home, also available every Saturday morning at 9:00 AM Mass. Communal anointing of the sick is celebrated at Mass each April and October. Notify us or the Catholic chaplain at Good Samaritan, Helen Hayes and Nyack of any hospitalization so that we may be of assistance. Be sure to tell the admitting office that you are a Catholic patient and a member of St. Gregory Barbarigo parish.

PERPETUAL EUCHARISTIC ADORATION CHAPEL is open all day and night for Eucharistic adoration and is located at the south end of the campus on Cinder Road in front of the parish house. Parishioners and friends are encouraged to become adorers or to stop in and spend some time in quiet prayer with the Lord.

ELEVENTH ANNUAL CONCERT OF ADVENT AND CHRISTMAS CAROLS on Saturday, December 8 at 8:00 PM in the church. This year there will be one performance. Tickets are \$10 each and are available for purchase in the narthex and at the parish office. Again this year, our format and repertoire is a more intimate, spiritual program featuring sacred music that takes us on a journey from the anticipation of Advent, to Mary's experience, to the birth of the babe, through the events his birth set in motion. With such a huge undertaking, there comes a tremendous expense as well. If you would like to support our concert financially through various levels of sponsorships, we can make giving opportunities available. All revenue will be used to support the rich tradition of our liturgical music which you have loved over the years. We hope you will be able to assist in some way and that your family and friends will be able to attend this wonderful event.

SCHEDULED MASSES FOR 2019 People rightly wish to remember their loved ones' birthdays, weddings, anniversaries of death with an announced Mass. Praying for their intentions helps our living and deceased friends with our prayers to the Lord on their behalf, and strengthens our connection with them. We know that many of our parishioners patiently wait for the Mass intention book to open each year – and it is now open for the first six months of 2019 (January-June). By the way, did you know that since September 1997, it has been permissible in every parish in the archdiocese for a priest to celebrate one Mass for the intention of several donors? The faithful must knowingly and voluntarily agree to have their intentions combined in a single celebration. The date, time and place of this celebration must be publicly announced in the parish bulletin. Such celebrations may occur, at most, only twice a weekday in any church. We will only use this option of several donors for a single Mass if and when there is an unavailability of single-intention weekday Masses. When requesting a Mass, you might be asked for your permission to combine your intentions with another.

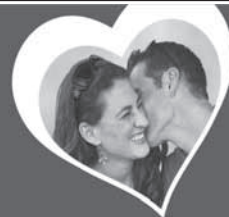

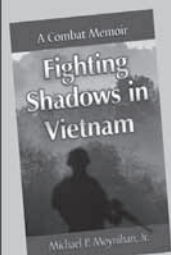

In this memoir, set as deeply in his mind as in the Southeast Asian jungle, a young American soldier embarks on a journey to a war that, for him, will never be over.



The world was a playground for Mickey, a naive Irish American kid bored with his life. His father served in World War II, his brother was a Marine in Vietnam; now it was his turn. His 365 days in Vietnam builds in torment until an attack on a bunker complex in Cambodia.
