THE MOST HOLY BODY AND BLOOD OF CHRIST (CORPUS CHRISTI) ~ June 14, 2020



Well as you may well have heard: great news—public Mass is now permitted, weekday and Sunday! And this Sunday is Corpus Christi! Where we celebrate the central sacra-

ment given to us by Christ, the Holy Eucharist. Now granted, there are safety protocols which are in place: no more than 25% of the church capacity can be utilized at one time, all those present must wear facemasks, upon entering the church parishioners are asked to sanitize their hands at sanitizing station, etc. Baptisms, funerals, and marriages are also permitted, with the same limits. Now again — only 25% of the Church can be filled at one time, so if you have any underlying medical conditions, or if you are a super senior, it might be a good idea to stay home for a few more Sundays. And of course, if you are sick right now, please stay at home. Keep in mind — we will continue to show Mass on Facebook, so you can participate online.

Daily Mass is Monday through Saturday at 9:00 am. The Sunday schedule resumes: Saturday Vigil Mass 5:30, then on Sunday: 7:30, 9:30 and 11:30. Confessions will be heard at the usual time — Saturday, from 4:00 to 5:00; however, confessions will be heard to the left of the altar, by the exit (this is to allow for physical distance of six feet).

In an effort to diminish the spread of the virus, some liturgical changes have been introduced. First, the kiss of peace (the handshake during Mass), which is optional, has been discontinued. Communion from the distribution chalices has also been discontinued. The collection will be taken with baskets with handles and there is to be no offertory procession (bring forward the water, wine, bread, and collection). Also, all hymnals have been removed and we have worked to choose hymns people might know.

Now granted, these safety measures are inconvenient, but the coronavirus is still out there and is still lethal, so we have to take measures to prevent it from spreading. And God willing the metrics tracking the virus will continue to fall and in time, we will be back to 100% capacity at Church.
