Dear friends in the Lord:

Pope Franic, in his message for *World Mission Sunday*, implores us, "In this year marked by the suffering and challenges created by the COVID-19 pandemic, the missionary journey of the whole Church continues in light of the words found in the account of the calling of the prophet Isaiah and the theme of this year's World Mission Sunday: "Here I am, send me" (6:8). Religious Education (CCD) will resume as scheduled at St. Gregory's. After consulting with the school on

their experience with the entrance process for students, we have adjusted our safety plan. Rather than come through the gym, families will drive to the front entrance of the school, the student's will come out of the car and his or her temperature will be taken. Parents will be asked safety questions. If the temperature is good and questions check out - the student will be sent into the school front entrance where he or she will sanitize their hands at one of the two hand sanitizer stations, then students will go directly to their classrooms. Of course students and catechists will be wearing masks. If the students temperature is over 100 or a safety question is the incorrect answer, the student will return to the car and return home. Temperatures will also be taken of the catechists.

As you probably realize, if a student is sick, he or she should not come to Religious Ed. Snacks and drinks should be consumed before coming into the building; only bottled water will be permitted in the classroom. Furthermore, water fountains will not be available. Fortunately, our class sizes are small enough to allow for social distancing in each classroom. Books will not be stored in the Religious Ed office, but will be taken home and brought back each week. Each classroom will be sanitized with the emist sanitizer at the end of class. If a student feels sick during class, he or she will be sent to the safety room where he or she will wait for his or her parents to come and pick them up. If it was used, the safety room will be sanitized at the end of the night. Dismissal will be staggered by class and occur using the front door.
