Saturday evening Advent Christmas Concert performance in our new Parish Center.







Last weekend was the Advent-**Christmas Concert** -and it was really fantastic! The first performance was in the Parish Center at 7:30 PM, and

the music was beautiful-and was great being in our new building. At intermission there was the opportunity for wine, cheese, soda, water and cookies and a chance for some casual conversations. Then the next day - the concert was in the church and it was also beautiful - and it included a string quartet. Well done David Azarow and the St. Gregory Barbarigo Choir!

An email was sent to all parishes last week informing us of new regulations from the New York Health Department. They implemented to slow the spread of Covid19. As you probably know, we are again required to wear masks at Mass, even if we are fully vaccinated. The prohibition of shaking hands is reaffirmed and it is asked that any visitors to the rectory wear a mask. Obviously this is disappointing but it is what we are required to do, so we will comply. In January, the Archdiocese will re-examine the situation and if any changes are to be made they will be implemented on January 15.

Tomorrow is Confession Monday - and confessions will be heard from 4:00 pm to 8:00 pm, in the confessional (last year confessions were heard in the hallway to the front left part of the church due to Covid19.) Confession flyers will be on hand to offer a reminder of the rite and also an examination of conscience.

CYO and CCD - Catholic Youth Organization Basketball has a long tradition here at St. Gregory's, which is great. Most of the children who participate are from the parish, although there is an allowance for several non parishioners as well. One curious feature I noticed about CYO, however, is that some of the children, who identify as parishioners, are not in school or CCD. Well over the last few weeks, with the help of the CYO moderators and the rectory staff members, the list of participants was reviewed, and in fact there are quite a few players who identify as being parishioners who are not in the school or CCD. This is not typically how it works in a parish. If families identify as parishioners, part of the parish responsibility is to catechize the children who are parishioners, that is to instill the knowledge and practice of the faith. Looking to fulfill this responsibility, in the future, anyone who identifies as a parishioner who seeks to register in CYO will need to be either the school or CCD (Religious Ed). Or the shorthand: no Regional School or CCD no CYO. This requirement includes grades 3 through 8. Registration for Religious Education will be in the Spring.

Finally, St. Patrick's Day - is a ways off - but please mark your calendars for Saturday, March 19, 7:00 PM in the St. Gregory Barbarigo Gym, for the return of the annual St. Patrick's Day Party, which will include a fantastic band.
