

Each session is independent of the others, so even if you miss a week or two, you can participate and learn a great deal. No prior experience in our study group is needed to participate. Happy Easter! Today we celebrate the reality that our Lord Jesus Christ, after dying on the cross and being in the tomb on Fri-

day, Saturday and into Sunday morning, physically rose from the dead and defeated death. Jesus who was dead, was alive again, and he still lives even now. - Recite the Devine Mercy Prayer on April 24 which is Divine Mercy Sunday.
- To go to confession 20 days before or after Divine Mercy Sunday, and receive Holy Communion 20 days before or after Divine Mercy Sunday.

Divine Mercy Prayer

(use of Rosary Beads is helpful)

- 1. Make the sign of the Cross
- 2. On the first bead offer this prayer three times:

O Blood and Water, which gushed forth from the Heart of Jesus as a fountain of Mercy for us, I trust You!

- 3. On the next bead, pray an **Our Father**
- 4. On the next bead, pray a **Hail Mary**
- 5. On the next bead, pray the Apostle's Creed
- 6. On the next bead, pray the following:

Eternal Father, I offer you the Body and Blood, Soul and Divinity of Your Dearly Beloved Son, Our Lord, Jesus Christ, in atonement for our sins and those of the whole world.

- 7. On the next 10 beads say: "For the sake of His sorrowful Passion, have mercy on us and on the whole world."
- 8. On the middle bead between decades then say: the "Eternal Father" prayer (as written above). Then on the next ten beads repeat the prayer: "For the sake of His sorrowful Passion, have mercy on us and on the whole world."
- After saying the five decades conclude with this prayer repeating it three times: "Holy God, Holy Mighty One, Holy Immortal One, have Mercy on us and on the whole world."
