Now granted, December 25th is a ways off but we need to begin planning now. Part of the plan, is the structure which will house the Holy Family and various visitors. We are fortunate to have our parishioner, Billy McGuire, who is a Boy Scout, offer to build a Nativity structure for his Eagle Scout Project. So please support Billy in his efforts. Here in the Archdiocese of New York, each county is gathering to celebrate the Holy Eucharist. Well the collection for the Eagle Scout project went well thank God. Just to review, the project has two aspects. First and foremost - is to put down pavers by the school, under the cross which is on the exterior wall of the gymnasium; this site will include engineered

placements for the structure of the Nativity. It will be built in a manner which will allow it to be broken down and stored each year. The second part of the project pertains to the landscaping. The landscaping by the rectory leaves a lot of room for improvement; so the Boy Scout Billy McGuire will plant several bushes and put down mulch. Additionally, he will plant two evergreens by the Nativity site. Part two of the Nativity project will be the responsibility of the parish, namely getting the statues: the crib with Baby Jesus, the Blessed Mother, St. Joseph, etc. God willing, by this Christmas we will have our new outdoor Nativity.

With the arrival of Fr. Emmanuel, soon I will be going on vacation. In addition to vacation, if I am able, I will also be spending some time at a Benedictine Monastery in Petersham, Massachusetts for some quiet retreat time. As you might recall, a spiritual retreat is time to stop and take a snapshot of life in general, and prayer life in particular, as well as thinking about the faith, parish, family, friends and even health. In fact, parish priests are supposed to take a spiritual retreat at least once a year. Typically, there are two kinds of retreats: directed and independent. Directed retreats would usually have a group of people i.e. fifteen or twenty, and would include daily Mass and presentations by a retreat director; usually one presentation in the morning and one in the afternoon. There is also the opportunity to go to confession and also to exercise.

Then there is also an undirected retreat which is less structured. This would usually include an individual going to a retreat house, attending daily Mass, then just having some quiet time to think, pray, maybe do some writing and exercise. Sometimes retreats are for long weekends, or there is also the option to go on a retreat Monday through Friday. If you ever have the opportunity to take a retreat - I encourage you to make the effort.


