WORDS FROM OUR PASTOR / PALABRAS DE NUESTRO PASTOR







We all have our little kingdoms; some place where we are in charge and have some authority. We all have rights as individuals granted to us by God, the Author of life. God is the source of all authority and each of us shares in that great power. We can either use our authority with domination, force and fear or we can use it with gentleness, respect, and loving concern. Jesus used His authority, always measured by His love.

In today's readings we hear how our God will judge His people. "When the Son of God comes in His glory at the end of time, He will sit upon His throne and all the nations will be assembled before Him." What do we think He will ask of us? Did you go to Church often? Have you kept the laws, rules and regulations of the Church? Have you loved God with all your heart, mind and soul? Did you pray and take time to reflect on the scriptures? He might ask those things, but I think there is more, much more. He is going to ask us how we treated the least of our brothers and sisters, the immigrant, the hungry, the poor, those in prison, those with special needs and those who are sick in heart and mind. Did we lord it over them? Did we turn our back and ignore their needs? How did we welcome the stranger, the lonely, the alienated, the outsiders and the losers? Did we see them as inferior, lazy, uneducated, helpless and hopeless? When we have helped the least of our brothers and sisters, we have done it to the Lord Himself. That is the measure the Lord will use as to how we have lived and loved and used our authority.

We may ask ourselves who are these "least" that Jesus talks about. They are every man, woman, child. All of us hunger for acceptance and love. We all are strangers on our pilgrim way. Some of us are locked in prisons of our own making, chained by selfishness and sin of all kinds. We are all handicapped in one way or another, for we are all in need. We thirst to satisfy our desire for happiness. Something deep inside us calls us to be whole, complete and fulfilled, to be holy, to be like the Lord of Life Himself.

All of us are numbered among the least. We share a common life together. Many times we are hurt by the sins of others and by our own self centeredness. Sometimes we forget that we are to be good shepherds one to another, to be on the watch for those who need our care, concern and love.

Those who want to rank first must serve the needs of all. Jesus, Our Good Shepherd and King, has come to serve and give His life as a ransom for many.

En las lecturas de hoy, escuchamos cómo Dios juzgará a su pueblo. «Cuando el Hijo de Dios venga en su gloria al final del tiempo, se sentará en su trono y se postrarán todas las Naciones delante de él». ¿Y qué pensamos que pedirá de nosotros? ¿Fuiste a la iglesia a menudo? ¿Respetaste las leyes, las normas y reglamentos de la iglesia? ¿Han amado a Dios con todo tu corazón, mente y alma? ¿Oraron y tomaron el tiempo para reflexionar sobre las escrituras? Podría preguntar esas cosas, pero creo que hay más, mucho más. Él va a preguntarnos cómo tratamos al menor de nuestros hermanos y hermanas, el inmigrante, los hambrientos, los pobres, los encarcelados, las personas con necesidades especiales y los enfermos del corazón y la mente. ¿Lo hicimos? ¿O dimos la espalda e ignoramos sus necesidades? ¿Cómo acogimos al extranjero, los solitarios, los alienados, los forasteros y los perdedores? ¿Los vimos como inferiores, vagos, incultos, indefensos y sin esperanza? Cuando hemos ayudado a éstos, al menor de nuestros hermanos y hermanas, lo hemos hecho por el Señor mismo. Y que es la medida que el Señor utilizará para ver cómo hemos vivido y amado y cómo usamos nuestra autoridad es el amor mismo.

Podemos preguntarnos quiénes son estos "pequeños" de los que habla Jesús. Son cada hombre, cada mujer y cada niño. Son tú y yo. Todos tienen hambre de aceptación y amor. Todos somos extraños en nuestro peregrino camino. Algunos de nosotros están encerrados en prisiones de nuestra propia fabricación, encadenados por el egoísmo y el pecado de todo tipo. Somos todos discapacitados de una u otra forma y todos estamos en necesidad. Tenemos sed para satisfacer nuestro deseo de felicidad. Algo profundo dentro de nosotros nos llama a ser santos y a ser como el Señor mismo.

QUESTION: What does it mean to say that Jesus is King of the Universe?

ANSWER: This Sunday – the 34th week in Ordinary Time – marks the end of the liturgical year, with next week ushering in the pre-Christmas season of Advent. It is also the Sunday on which we celebrate the Feast of Christ the King. Unlike many of the feast days that we celebrate, it is of relatively recent origin, having been instituted by Pope Pius XI in 1925. Pope Pius XI said that we "must look for the peace of Christ in the Kingdom of Christ" because "as long as individuals and states refused to submit to the rule of our Savior, there would be no really hopeful prospect of a lasting peace among nations." (Pope Pius XI, *Quas Primas*, 11 December 1925)

By instituting the Feast of Christ the King, the pope was trying to remind everyone that the only way to find peace in the world and in our own individual lives is by allowing Jesus to be the king of our own personal universes. What this means is that each day each of us must wake up and begin the day in prayer, surrendering his or her entire life into Jesus' hands – allowing him to be the one who leads us through the day. In Matthew's Gospel, Jesus reminds us, "All power in heaven and on earth has been given to me." (Mt 28:18)

The Feast of Christ the King is also a reminder that Jesus came into the world to carry out the work of restoring creation to its original state, a state in which everything points back to the Creator. In establishing a Church, he has invited us to be cooperators in that project of restoring the created order. The world is not destined to be always affected by sin and death. Suffering will come to end. Remembering that truth, we are filled with hope as we prepare for the child-king to break into the human experience as we prepare to celebrate Christmas.
