WORDS FROM OUR PASTOR / PALABRAS DE NUESTRO PASTOR

Today, our Lord speaks about "His flesh and blood." We can understand the people's shock and horror when they heard these words for the first time. They are so physical and blunt about eating flesh and drinking blood. This doesn't shock us because receiving the body and blood of Christ is almost routine for us.

The Church is a great organism, an elaborate, massive world-wide institution, built up of many layers, thousands of apostolates and ministries, millions of people on every continent, in every country, but at its center is the Eucharist. We have much in common with other Christians. What is distinctive about Catholic life and Catholic spirituality is the Eucharist.

When you go to another church, new or old, did you notice that your eye instinctively scans the inside of the church until it hits the red lamp? Suddenly, you know you're at home because you found the tabernacle. Let's reflect about what that red lamp means.

The red lamp (it can be other colors) signals the Real Presence of Christ in the Eucharist. It is not an emotional, symbolic, or spiritual presence, but a real presence. When we leave church today, the red lamp continues to burn because the Real Presence of Christ remains even when nobody is here. The Lord truly abides with us in all the seasons of life.

A second meaning of that red lamp is the sacrificial love of Christ, Who comes to us in such a humble way. What an immensely loving, simple and powerful way to come to His people, as food, as the Eucharist to be received! What a wonderful miracle. The reach and the poor, the king, the servant and the most insignificant of people all can "receive the Lord." There is no discrimination here. Can we love like that? Can we show even an ounce of that same kind of self-sacrificing love for others as Jesus shows for us?

A third meaning is that Jesus is always accessible: We can come here before the Lord at any time. Sometimes we come like Jacob, wrestling with the Lord. Sometimes we come like Elijah to discern His presence in the whispers of life. Sometimes we come like Joshua to do battle for our soul or the soul of another. Here we can bring all the aches and pains, needs and yearnings of our wounded world. Here we can receive the healing balm of His grace.

To come before the Lord in the Eucharist is to come to the place where missionaries throughout the centuries prayed for strength. It is where the great religious orders were born, where popes and bishops have sought inspiration, where kings and emperors have come for wisdom, where monks and religious have received courage, where the sick have found inner healing, where parents have prayed, where widows have sought comfort, where young people prayed for a date, where business people stop to begin their day, where people throughout the world come with every prayer, every petition, every need ever known to the human heart, where people who were spiritually lost have found their way.

To come before the Eucharist is to come to our place at Wisdom's table. It is where we can come to understand the will of the Lord. It is the place we can always call home. How often do you visit the Lord in the tabernacle during the week?

Hoy, nuestro Señor habla de "su carne y de su sangre". Podemos comprender la conmoción y el horror de la gente cuando escucharon estas palabras por primera vez. Son tan físicos y francos acerca de comer carne y beber sangre. Esto no nos conmueve porque recibir el cuerpo y la sangre de Cristo es casi rutinario para nosotros.

La Iglesia es un gran organismo, una institución mundial elaborada y masiva, construida con muchas capas, miles de apostolados y ministerios, millones de personas en cada continente, en cada país, pero en su centro es la Eucaristía. Tenemos mucho en común con otros cristianos. Lo que es distintivo de la vida católica y la espiritualidad católica es la Eucaristía.

Cuando vas a otra iglesia, nueva o vieja, ¿notaste que tu ojo escanea instintivamente el interior de la iglesia hasta que toca la luz roja? De repente, sabes que estás en casa porque encontraste el tabernáculo. Reflexionemos sobre lo que significa esa lámpara roja.

La lámpara roja (puede ser de otros colores) señala la Presencia Real de Cristo en la Eucaristía. No es una presencia emocional, simbólica, o espiritual, sino una presencia real. Cuando salimos de la iglesia hoy, la lámpara roja continúa ardiendo porque la presencia real de Cristo permanece incluso cuando no hay nadie aquí. El Señor verdaderamente permanece con nosotros en todas las estaciones de la vida

Un segundo significado de esa lámpara roja es el amor sacrificial de Cristo, que viene a nosotros de una manera tan humilde. ¡Qué manera tan inmensamente amorosa, simple y poderosa de venir a su pueblo, como alimento, como la Eucaristía que se recibirá! Que maravilloso milagro. El alcance y el pobre, el rey, el siervo y la gente más insignificante pueden "recibir al Señor". Aquí no hay discriminación. ¿Podemos amar así? ¿Podemos mostrar siquiera una onza de ese mismo tipo de amor sacrificado por los demás como Jesús nos muestra? Ese es un segundo

Un tercer significado es que Jesús siempre es accessible: Podemos venir aquí ante el Señor en cualquier momento. A veces venimos como Jacob, luchando con el Señor. A veces venimos como Elijah para discernir su presencia en los susurros de la vida. A veces venimos como Joshua a luchar por nuestra alma o el alma de otro. Aquí podemos traer todos los dolores y dolores, necesidades y anhelos de nuestro mundo herido. Aquí podemos recibir el bálsamo sanador de su gracia.

Venir ante el Señor en la Eucaristía es llegar al lugar donde los misioneros a lo largo de los siglos rezaron por la fortaleza. Es donde nacieron las grandes órdenes religiosas, donde los papas y los obispos han buscado inspiración, donde los reyes y emperadores han venido para la sabiduría, donde los monjes y religiosos han recibido coraje, donde los enfermos han encontrado curación interna, donde los padres han orado, donde las viudas han buscado consuelo, donde los jóvenes oraron para una cita, donde empresarios se detienen para comenzar el día, donde personas de todo el mundo vienen con cada oración, cada petición, cada necesidad que el corazón humano conoce, donde las personas espiritualmente perdidas han encontrado su camino.

Venir antes de la Eucaristía es venir a nuestro lugar en la mesa de la Sabiduría. Es donde podemos venir para comprender la voluntad del Señor. Es el lugar que siempre podemos llamar hogar. ¿Con qué frecuencia visitas al Señor en el tabernáculo durante la semana?

Hello to everyone!

Next weekend we are going to celebrate our parish patron feast day, St. Rose of Lima. At Masses there will be a procession with the statue of St. Rose.

Processions are part of our Catholic tradition, and go back even to the Old Testament. For instance, King David accompanied the ark of the covenant into the temple in Jerusalem with a big procession with numerous soldiers around it (2 Samuel 6:1). In the New Testament, we also find a procession when Jesus entered into Jerusalem after his time in the desert. People accompanied him for his entry on a donkey with palms and "hosannas."

This practice of procession and accompaniment is built into our human nature. For instance, when someone very important and dear to us is coming to our house, we may be already waiting for that person outside in the driveway before his or her arrival. In this way, we may receive the person more warmly - ready to accompany him into our house. We may also do this act of kindness when the person leaves, accompanying him to his car and sending him off with a warm hug. I am sure you all had this experience with a dear friend, a child coming back from college, or when you were dating your future spouse.

Now, we may understand better the practice of processions in the Catholic Church. We so love Jesus Christ, the Virgin Mary, and the saints that we also accompany them into the Church with our brothers and sisters to celebrate a big feast, the Mass. St. Rose of Lima is our dear patron saint, and to honor her we will join in procession.
