THE LITURGY *of the* WORD

First Reading – Acts 2:1-11

When the time for Pentecost was fulfilled, they were all in one place together. And suddenly there came from the sky a noise like a strong driving wind, and it filled the entire house in which they were. Then there appeared to them tongues as of fire, which parted and came to rest on each one of them. And they were all filled with the Holy Spirit and began to speak in different tongues, as the Spirit enabled them to proclaim.

Now there were devout Jews from every nation under heaven staying in Jerusalem. At this sound, they gathered in a large crowd, but they were confused because each one heard them speaking in his own language. They were astounded, and in amazement they asked, “Are not all these people who are speaking Galileans? Then how does each of us hear them in his native language? 



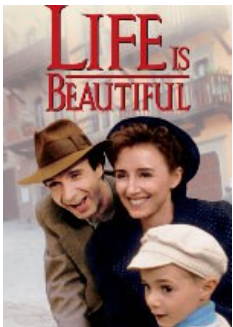

STORY OF HOPE - ST. VINCENT DE PAUL



Geoff is a 55-year-old single man who had suffered from addiction and was recently in jail for a month. He has since committed to the courageous journey of transitioning back to independent living with the help of a sober residence which provides him with daily support and structure.

Having lost his job, due to his past addiction, Geoff contacted SVDP for assistance with rent while he waits for his first paycheck as warehouse manager for a local manufacturer.

When our volunteers met Geoff, he told a heartwarming story of having been in the 12-Step program, continuing his recovery with prayer, and being interested in returning to the Catholic Church. He feels his prayers are being answered and that God has blessed him with a wonderful girlfriend, a home to live in, a great job with a great company, and lots of help from the public defender's office in accessing benefits and services.

Geoff is in a good position to become self-sufficient and thanked the caring SVDP volunteers for helping him move toward success with this second chance in his life.
