## Second Reading – *Romans 5:12-15*

Brothers and sisters: Through one man sin entered the world, and through sin, death, and thus death came to all men, inasmuch as all sinned – for up to the time of the law, sin was in the world, though sin is not accounted when there is no law. 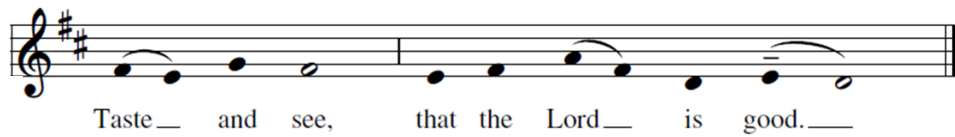

## STORY OF HOPE ETHAN'S STORY

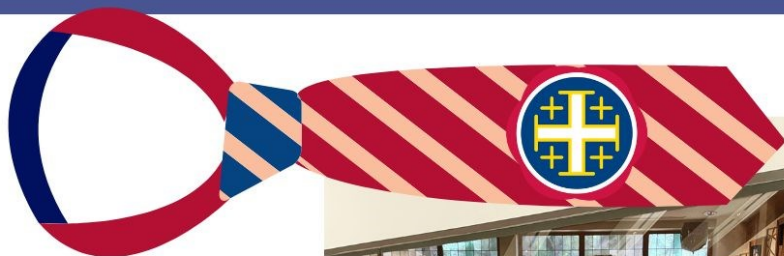
Through the St. Theresa SVDP ministry, we sometimes experience sympathetic words and sentiments from the landlords of our neighbors who are behind on their rent and facing eviction– whether we're working with a single mom who lost her job due to lack of childcare or an elderly couple who experienced unexpected medical costs.

But it is rare that a landlord will actually take action to delay the eviction process in any way. That's why the warm reception that our volunteers received while responding to Ethan's call for rent assistance was so heartening. Ethan's landlord and his wife asked for a description of SVDP's mission and then decided not to accept the \$350 which we were offering to help Ethan. Rather, they were so touched by our ministry that they decided to deduct \$350 from Ethan's rent balance and asked that we use the \$350 to assist someone else in need!
