as truly worthy of belief. The Vatican Eucharistic Miracles Photographic Exhibition faithfully recounts many well-documented miraculous occurrences. Knowledge of these miracles strengthens our faith in Christ and His Church. They are visible proof of Jesus Christ's Real Presence in the Holy Eucharist.

The exhibition was created by Blessed Carlo Acutis, a 15-year-old from Milan, Italy, who was beatified on October 10, 2020. Blessed Carlo Acutis had a deep devotion to Jesus and the Holy Eucharist. He called the Eucharist his "Highway to Heaven."

In conjunction with the National Eucharistic Revival, a sampling of these Eucharistic miracles from 20 countries worldwide will be available for viewing at our parish. 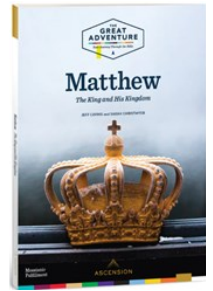

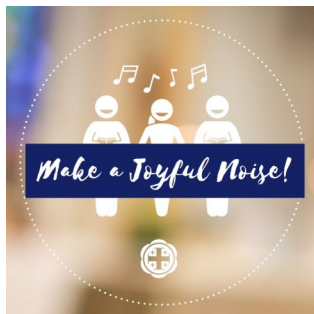
