English Language Arts

This week we began our NJ Wildlife unit and have been learning about squirrels, bears and owls. We are making science journals that will come home at the end of the unit unless the children decide to put them





in their portfolios. Each page in the journal will be dedicated to an animal found in NJ and will include a fact about it. We focused our attention on three non-fiction books called, Squirrels, Owls and Bears. These books were very informative. Our poem this week is called, "Busy" and we worked on a new song entitled "Gray Squirrel". The children also enjoyed the books, Nuts to You and Black Bears.

Our alphabet focus was on the letters; Ee, Kk, and Qu. The children had the opportunity to make an Elmer the Elephant, kangaroos and quilts for all the letters this week. The book, The Marriage of Q and U was a big hit with the children and it really helped cement the idea that q and u always go together in words.

Math

We continue to work on numbers to 10. We have been practicing number writing, story problems and comparing numbers this week. The children started our new math center sheet on Tuesday.



Our science investigation concluded this week with the children comparing their radish plants with mine that are growing in a baggie without soil. Both sets of seeds grew into plants, which surprised the children. The plants that grew in the window were yellow as opposed to the green plants in the soil. We watched the end of the Mystery Science video to explain that if the plants remained without soil they would die. Everyone realized the sun plays an important part in plant growth since all of the plants are a healthy green. Hopefully the plants made it home on Monday.
