FROM THE PASTOR'S DESK





The season of Lent is called a holy and joy filled season. If during Lent, we are focused on the suffering and death of Jesus, how can this be a season of joy? How can the suffering of Jesus possibly bring us joy?

During Lent, we focus on Jesus' suffering and recall that He underwent it all for us. Without question, Jesus suffered a horrible death. His suffering began long before His arrest in the Garden of Gethsemane. Each time that He said to His disciples that "the Son of Man must suffer and die and after three days rise again," it is clear that Jesus had the cross on His mind. He

suffered horribly in the Garden as He meditated on all that He was about to undergo and on the sins and indifference that would be committed against Him. Christ suffered for us. He suffered to free us and the world from death and sin. His cross is a sign of love and a reminder of His victory. Jesus invites us to remember His Passion and Death and to remember how greatly we are loved!

The Eucharist is the most important practice in the season of Lent. In the Eucharist, we come into contact with the Holy Sacrifice of Calvary. The Stations of the Cross also give us the opportunity to reflect on the Passion and Death of the Lord. The Divine Mercy devotions also are important because they flow from the Death of the Lord.

The death of the Lord is an expression of God's love for us. And returning to the initial question, His love is the source of our joy!

From Father Nick: As we take aim for the Kingdom of Heaven, I find it encouraging to see so many parishioners attempting "God's Plan for Giving."

A testimony from a member of St. Clare Parish in Clifton: "It's simple to tithe. You just give back 10% of what you earn to the source of your spiritual teachings. It's done for the joy of giving. When you lovingly donate, the abundance starts to come to you in many ways."

THE JOURNEY OF TRANSFIGURATION

"We used to be such good friends. How is it that you've moved so far away?" one man asked another. "Perhaps," the other replied, "you have moved away. By standing still." This exchange very well could have happened between Peter and Jesus, had Peter been allowed to erect tents to stay on the mount of the Transfiguration. He nearly succumbed to the temptation to stay in a place of wonder and light. But Jesus knew the hard truth: we are on a continual journey when we are walking the paths of God's will.
