A DEEP HATRED OF SIN

As a boy at St. Cecilia Parish, I was an altar boy and frequently served the Monday night novena Mass. The novena was called the Miraculous Medal novena. Praying the novena prayers many times, they became inscribed in my memory. Recently, I was recalling the following prayer from the Miraculous Medal novena.

Novena Prayer

O Immaculate Virgin Mary, Mother of Our Lord Jesus and our Mother, penetrated with the most lively confidence in your all-powerful and never-failing intercession, manifested so often through the Miraculous Medal, we your loving and trustful children implore you to obtain for us the graces and favors we ask during this Novena, if they be beneficial to our immortal souls, and the souls for whom we pray.

(Here privately form your petitions.)

You know, O Mary, how often our souls have been the sanctuaries of your Son who hates iniquity. Obtain for us, then, a deep hatred of sin and that purity of heart which will attach us to God alone, so that our every thought, word and deed may tend to His greater glory. Obtain for us also a spirit of prayer and self-denial, that we may recover by penance what we have lost by sin and at length attain to that blessed abode where you are the Queen of angels and of men. Amen.

The novena prayer came to mind as I was thinking about the repentance that characterizes the season of Lent. In the above novena prayer, you will notice that Jesus hates iniquity, i.e., the evil of sin. For this reason, in the novena, we ask our mother, Mary, to obtain for us "a deep hatred of sin." What a great thought this is! As we repent of our sins during Lent, a deep hatred of sin can motivate us to leave our sins behind and to put our sins to death, which is part of the deepest meaning of Lent. Our mother Mary is a most helpful mother and gift from God!

FAST AND ABSTINENCE DURING LENT

Every person 14 years or older must **abstain** from meat (and items made with meat) on Ash Wednesday, Good Friday, and all the Fridays of **Lent**. Every person between the **age** of 18 and 59 (beginning of 60th year) must **fast** on Ash Wednesday and Good Friday.

Throughout the Diocese of Paterson, priests will be on duty to hear confessions from 7 to 8:30 pm. Every Monday in every church. At St. Lawrence, we will offer Monday confessions from 6:30 to 8:30 pm on the Mondays of Lent. How great is God's mercy!

DIOCESAN PARTNERS IN FAITH CAMPAIGN REPORT

Over the last five years, the Diocese has conducted the Partner's in Faith Campaign. In 2013, our parish set a goal to pledge \$550,000 to this capital campaign. Terms of the campaign enabled St. Lawrence Church to share in 25% of the unrestricted donations parishioners made to meet that goal, and pledges received exceeded it. As a result, the parish received 60% of that total. Since 2013, the annual rebates we received on the total pledges of \$567,900 amounted to \$148,240.

Many of the campaign's objectives were established to support the expenses of modernizing and repairing various diocesan structures. Among those projects was the complete renovation of St. John's, the closed diocesan cathedral in Paterson. The rebates St. Lawrence Church received were also used to help underwrite the annual costs of major capital renovation programs made here. The most significant parish project completed during these last five years was the resurfacing and new storm water drainage systems placed throughout our parking area. That project actually cost more than \$200,000 with many of the project's expenses supported by the Partners in Faith parish rebates we received.

To the many parishioners who participated in this capital campaign, we are most grateful for your generous and faithful support over these last five years as the campaign has now concluded.

TITHING IS GOD'S PLAN FOR GIVING.

Biblically a tithe means 10%. All are asked to consider tithing and return 10% of our income to the Lord (5% to the parish, 5% to God's other charities) in gratitude. The spiritual practice of tithing disposes us to make God first in every area of our lives! The aim is to secure not the tithe, but the tither. Not the gift, but the giver — for God!

Reflection: "I have now brought you the first fruits of the products of the soil which you, O Lord, have given to me." (Deuteronomy 26:10)

Second, do you recognize that everything you have has been given to you by God? Ask God for a grateful and generous heart, every day, in all circumstances.

ALMSGIVING, PRAYER, FASTING, AND TEMPTATION

As we begin our season of fasting, prayer, and almsgiving, the reading from Deuteronomy reminds us of our duty of almsgiving, that we "set [our offerings] before the Lord, [our] God, [and] shall bow down in [God's] presence" (Deuteronomy 26:10). The reading from Romans refers us to our prayer, reminding us that "The word is near you, in your mouth and in your heart . . . For everyone who calls on the name of the Lord will be saved" (Romans 10:8, 13). These are comforting words, and encourage us to ask God for what we need and to aid us in our prayer. Finally, the Gospel of Luke shows us a fasting Jesus, who was tempted as we are, and who knows what it means to be human. Someone once said that temptation arises when you're tired and weary, and the devil comes along and makes a perfectly reasonable suggestion. Jesus shows us that, with His help, we too can overcome our temptations, reasonable as they may sound.
