FROM THE PASTOR'S DESK

JESUS WANTS TO SEE US IN HEAVEN



How much does Jesus want to see us forever in heaven? He loves us enough that He willingly chose to suffer and to die and to rise from the dead in order that you and I might be with Him forever in the Kingdom of Heaven. His suffering and death was beyond horrible and yet He did it all so that you and I could be freed from our sins and enjoy Him and Heaven forever.

Families and friends that love each other want proximity and time together. My brother's children have bought side by side houses in Boston. Like many parents and grandparents, my sister in law makes many trips to Boston to be near her children and grandchildren. I spoke with a mother just yesterday and she was wishing that her children would stay close to each other in their adulthood and that they all would end up not too far from their parents in New Jersey.

Jesus chose to suffer and to die and to rise in order that you and I could repent of our sins and be freed from them by the power of His death and rising. Jesus wanted to make it as easy as possible for you and me to be freed of our sins. As a friend of mine often says, "Jesus does the heavy lifting." Jesus does the heavy lifting in the destruction of our sins. Jesus made repenting as easy as possible because we cannot enter the Kingdom of Heaven without repenting of our sins. Jesus began His public ministry by preaching, "Repent for the Kingdom of Heaven is at hand!" Repentance is absolutely essential in the Christian life!

To repent means to admit our sins to ourselves and to God, to tell Him that we are sorry for offending Him and to promise Him that we will try our best to sin no more. That's it. Repenting in baptism or in confession brings us God's wonderful gift of forgiveness and opens the doors of Heaven for us. Without repentance, we are doomed to Purgatory or Hell. Who in their right mind does not want Heaven as soon as possible after they die?

Please be sure to repent of your sins this Lent. Make the necessary preparations for an eternity with Jesus in Heaven. Please be sure to make a good confession this Lent. Lent is the season of repentance and new life.
