FROM THE PASTOR'S DESK

THE GIFT OF THE SAINTS



One of my favorite saints is St. John Bosco. When I was sent to St. Mary Help of Christians Church in Paterson in 1982, I found that I would be serving there with the Salesian Sisters. The Salesian Sisters are the group co-founded by St. John Bosco and Mother Maria Mazzarello to serve girls and young women. The Salesian Sisters were responsible for St. Mary School.

After meeting the sisters, I decided that I should study the story of their founder to better understand and collaborate with the Salesians. I became fascinated with Don Bosco. The various aspects of Don Bosco's life taught me many things about God and His saving work. First, our experiences of childhood and our youth can be useful in our adult work. Don Bosco would be called to work with the street boys of Torino, many of whom were orphans due to the loss of their fathers during the beginnings of the Industrial Revolution. Don Bosco lost his own father when he was just two years old and this loss would help him to better understand the situations

of orphans. Two great women would have a profound influence in John Bosco's life; one was his own mother who would raise him and his two brothers and the other was Mary, the Mother of Jesus and the Help of Christians. John would learn sports and shoemaking as a boy and these would also help him in his work with the boys. God would form John Bosco and his ministry and guide him throughout his life.

When God's people need help, God forms and raises up saints like St. John Bosco to help those in need. God has raised up many men, women and youth to be of service to God's people.

PRE-SCHOOL CHILDREN FOOD PACK PROGRAM Catholic Charities of Paterson



St. Lawrence Church continues to support the diocesan wide Pre-School Food Pack Program which provides needy preschool children of the El Mundo Del Nino School in Paterson with a supply of healthy food and snacks and a meal for families. Joe Murray, the director of the School said, "The families really appreciate these food packs because inflation has hit them hard."

This year we are asked to provide 105 food packs that will be delivered to Paterson by Friday, February 17.

A typical food pack for each child includes:

- 2 breakfast items (instant oatmeal pack) [210 needed]
- 2 lunch items (Chef Boyardee Micro Meal Beefaroni, Kraft Easy Pack Mac & Cheese) [210 needed]
- 1 milk (Horizon White Milk) [105 needed]
- 1 Apple and Eve 100% apple juice [105 needed]
- 1 fruit cup (diced peaches, Mandarin orange segments, apple sauce) [105 needed]
- 2 snacks (Rice Krispie Treat, soft and chewy granola bars) [210 needed] 1 meal to share with family (16 oz. bag white rice, 5 oz. can tuna, 16 oz. bag dry black beans) [105 rice or beans needed / 105 cans of tuna needed]

Please stick to these items above. The food packs will be assembled by the Good Samaritans on Monday, February 13.

Now through Sunday, February 12: Leave donations in Church Hall or bins in front of church. Shoprite gifts cards are also appreciated.






