



From Father David...

Hosanna to the Son of David! Blessed is He who comes in the name of the Lord. O King of Israel: hosanna in the highest! The joyful song of the children and inhabitants of Jerusalem broke forth on that first Palm Sunday. So begins this Holy Week. The best way to enter into the spiritual meaning of this Week is to attend the liturgies with your family. Yes, the liturgies are longer and more complex but do not let that fact keep you away. Don't be afraid to bring your children. Each day of the Triduum (the Three Days) builds up to the climax of the great Easter Vigil and Mass of Easter. In this Centennial Year of our parish, the Sacred Liturgy is the most important reality of our community life. Here we learn who God is and who we are. Come and take part, and know the merciful love of Our Lord and Master Jesus Christ.

Holy Thursday recalls the events surrounding the institution of the Holy Eucharist, including the birthday of the institutional priesthood. The Mass of the Lord's Supper highlights the washing of feet, the Lord's commandment of love. The Liturgy concludes with the procession of the Blessed Sacrament to the altar of repose in the gathering space. The sanctuary will be stripped bare, a sign of the emptying of Jesus in the Passion. Good Friday, a day of fast and abstinence, calls us to pause in wonder before the mystery of the Cross. No Mass is celebrated. The main actions of this Liturgy include: Liturgy of the Word, including the Passion of St. John; solemn prayer for the Church and world; veneration of the cross; reception of the Eucharist consecrated the night before. Holy Saturday during the day, no Mass nor sacrament is celebrated as we commemorate

the silence of Jesus in the tomb. Saturday Easter Vigil is the "mother of all Masses". If you have never attended this celebration, consider attending this year. A liturgy rich in symbols and images: fire, water, light, chant and song, food. We will welcome one candidate and one Catholic who will receive the Sacrament of Confirmation; and both will receive the Holy Eucharist at this Mass.

Easter Sunday renews our community with new Easter water and the baptismal promises. Every Sunday is a celebration of the Lord's Resurrection and our future rising.

May the celebrations of Our Lord's death and resurrection strengthen the families of St. Therese Parish in living our baptismal vows as disciples. FR. DAVID






Centennial Corner:
